

Children's Book Week Competition 2025

Terms and Conditions

- 1. This competition is a trade promotion lottery (**Competition**) run by the City of Joondalup (**City**) in accordance with the *Gaming and Wagering Commission Act 1987* (WA).
- 2. Entry to the competition is free.
- 3. By submitting your entry, you acknowledge that you have read and accept these Terms and Conditions.
- 4. This competition is open to primary school children who attend one of the Children's Book Week sessions at Joondalup Libraries. The following are ineligible to enter: Employees of the City of Joondalup, immediate family members of employees of the City of Joondalup, Elected Members of the City of Joondalup, immediate family members of Elected Members of the City of Joondalup, and the businesses, agencies, and companies associated or involved with the competition
- 5. This competition is open only for primary school children who attend one of the Book Week sessions at Joondalup Libraries. The City reserves the right to disqualify any entrant who tampers with the entry process, who submits an entry that is not in accordance with these Terms and Conditions, or who has, in the opinion of the City, engaged in conduct in entering the Competition, which is considered fraudulent, misleading, or deceptive.
- To enter the Competition, entrants must, during the Competition period, borrow an item from Joondalup Libraries and submit a completed entry form to library staff before Friday 19 September
- 7. The competition opens on Monday 11 August 2025 and closes on Friday 19 September 2025.
- 8. The information that entrants provide will be used by the City for the purpose of conducting this competition, and no other purposes. The City will not share any information collected with third parties. By entering this competition, entrants consent to use their contact details for the purposes described in this clause. This information will be collected, processed, used and protected in accordance with the applicable data security and privacy laws.
- 9. There will be one main prize winner and four branch prize winners, all drawn randomly. Each prize will be drawn separately, with each branch drawing a winner from the entries submitted at that branch, and the City of Joondalup Events and Programs team will draw a main prize winner from the consolidated entries at all four branches. The City reserves the right to request each winner to provide proof of their identity and/or proof of each winner to comply with any of the City's instructions on how to claim the Prize.
- 10. Each Prize is not transferrable, exchangeable or redeemable for cash. Once a Prize has left the City's premises, the City takes no responsibility for the Prize being damaged, lost or stolen.

- 11. If a Prize is unavailable for reasons beyond the City's control, the City reserves the right to substitute the Prize with a prize of equal or greater monetary value. This right is subject to any applicable legislation, regulations or directions from a regulatory authority.
- 12. A winner's use of the Prize is entirely at their own risk. Before a Prize is awarded, a winner may be required to sign an agreement to release the City from and indemnifying the City against any liability arising from the winner's acceptance and use of the Prize and the winner's participation in the competition.
- 13. The City will take all reasonable steps to identify and notify each winner to ensure that each winner receives their Prize. In the event of any prize left unclaimed, or the winner cannot be identified, by Wednesday 8 October a new random winner will be drawn.
- 14. The City will not be liable to any entrant who cannot be contacted or whose entry contains incorrect or misspelled information including email addresses. In such cases, this entrant forfeits any Prize, and no further correspondence will be entered into. The City will not accept late entries.
- 15. By entering this competition, entrants acknowledge that if they are a winner, photographs may be taken at the Prize collection for marketing and media purposes, and this will be done only with the winner's consent. Any such photographs taken, and copyright in the images, will belong to the City, and the City has the right to use these images without payment or other compensation to the Prize winner.

- 17. Any Prize supplied by a third party supplier is subject to the terms and conditions of that third party supplier. Each Prize may come with guarantees that cannot be excluded under the applicable Australian consumer laws. If those guarantees are not complied with, then you will have rights under the applicable Australian consumer laws. Subject to those guarantees and rights, the City will not be liable and excludes all liability (including negligence) for any loss or damage whatsoever which is suffered (including but not limited to indirect or consequential loss) for damage to property, personal injury or death suffered or sustained in connection with the competition or the use or taking of any Prize except for any liability which cannot be excluded by law including as provided for under the applicable Australian consumer laws.

"Information on the Prize"

- 1. The competition opens on Monday 11 August 2025.
- 2. Primary school children who attend one of the Children's Book Week sessions at Joondalup Libraries.
- 3. There will be one main prize winner and four branch prize winners, drawn randomly. Each prize will be drawn separately, with each branch drawing a winner from the entries submitted at that branch, and the City of Joondalup Libraries Events & Programs team will draw a main prize winner from the consolidated entries at all four branches. The main prize consists of a book pack containing books shortlisted for the Children's Book Council of Australia Awards 2025 to a total value of \$175; and a \$50 book voucher. The books included in the pack are: A Wreck of Seabirds by Karleah Olson; Fluff: Mess Up! by Matt Stanton; Saskia Spark-Lee: Fundraiser Fail by Rebecka Sharpe Shelberg and Sofya Karmazina; Spiro by Anna McGregor; The Truck Cat by Danny Snell and Deborah Frenkel; South With the Seabirds by Jess McGeachin. Each branch prize consists of a Lego™ set to the value of \$10.
