Reducing investment risk

The City of Joondalup takes a proactive, partnership-driven approach to attract private capital by de-risking projects that meet this critical need.

- Current planning framework includes a Health and Wellness Precinct in the Joondalup Activity Centre Plan.
- Significant land availability in the Joondalup City Centre Health and Wellness Hub. The City will work with developers, businesses and operators to secure long-term assets in the heart of the precinct.
- Flexible planning frameworks to accelerate and simplify the development process in the City Centre.
- Pre-existing partnerships exist between health service providers, education and research institutions, as well as government departments. This clustering of organisations and industries through precinct facility collaboration and knowledge sharing play a critical role in increased levels of innovation, particularly for new ventures.

Invest in a guaranteed demand pipeline

Joondalup is strategically placed to take advantage of the increasing health needs of a large, growing and ageing population as a leading destination for health, research and innovation.

Healthcare and social services is the largest employer in the region, with healthcare and social assistance having experienced above trend growth over the last five years and has strong future growth potential.¹

Over \$498 million expansions of private and public services at Joondalup Health Campus and recruitment of 150 new employees is underway. The hospital is surrounded by allied health services, with neighbouring training institutions and innovation precinct.

The opportunity is now to develop a curated precinct in the north for health research, medical care, higher education and cutting edge business innovation.

Joondalup is already home to early phase clinical trials operated by Linear, ECU's Strategic Research Institutes and Centres, and JHC Clinical trials, facilitating world class research to create lasting impact for communities across the life span.

The Joondalup Health Campus Research Strategic Plan 2025-2030 sets out the vision and priorities for cultivating a vibrant research culture aligned with the commitment to deliver world-class healthcare. Research remains the foundation of excellence, progress and improved patient care.

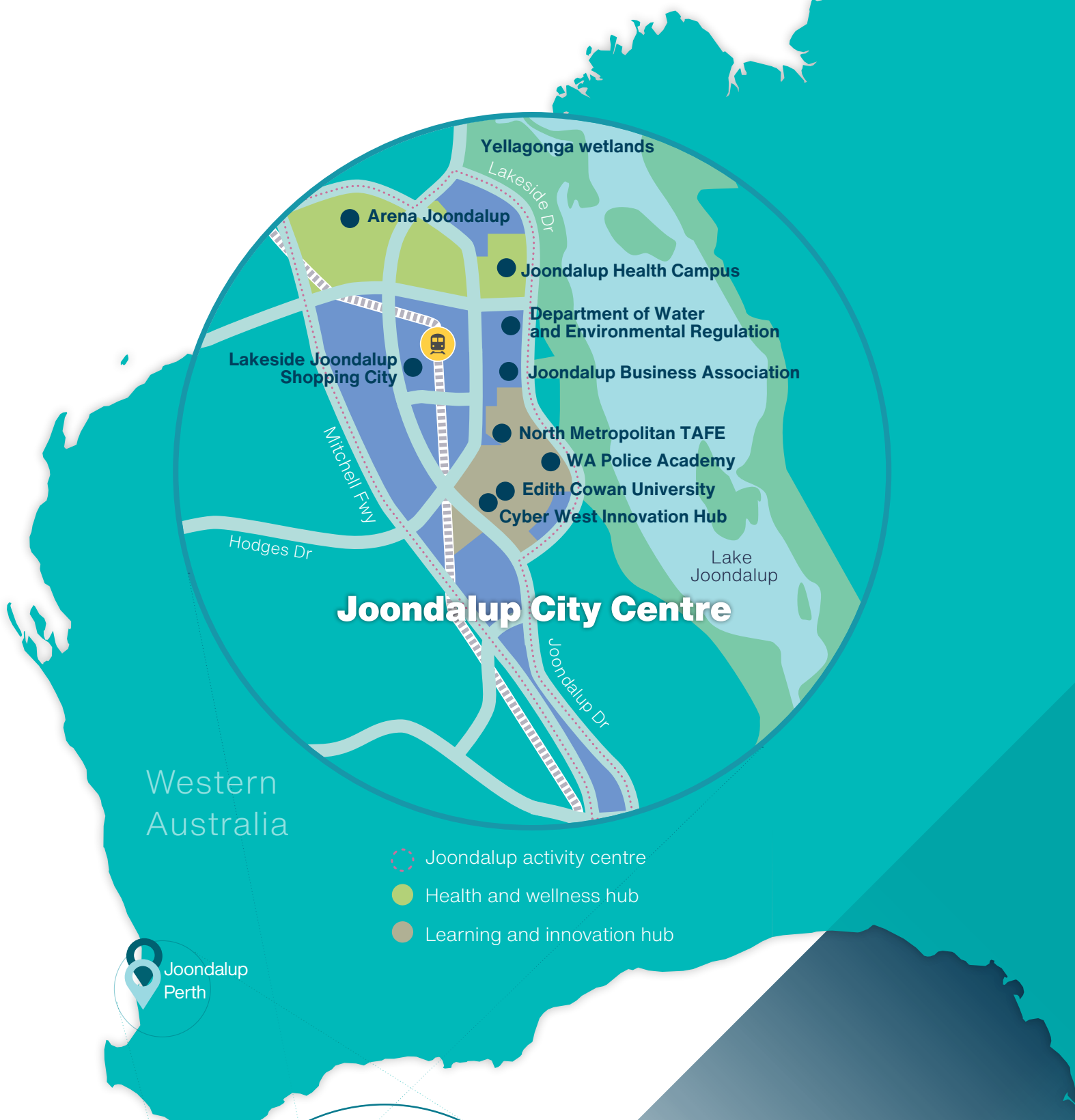
Over the next 20 years, the strong growth in older residents will further boost future demand as health care moves towards wellness and care beyond traditional settings.² The Aged Care sector in Australia expected to grow from \$49 billion in 2024 to \$93 billion in 2034.

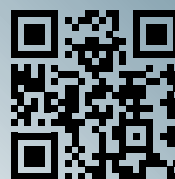
