QUESTIONS OF WHICH DUE NOTICE HAS BEEN GIVEN, WITHOUT DISCUSSION

CHICHESTER RESERVE AND PARKING AREA

At the March 1992 Council meeting Cr Edwardes asked a series of questions on notice and with the exception of Question 4:

"Can the Town Clerk advise whether he has made enquiries with his officers in respect to this matter? If so can he advise the Council of his findings?"

all were answered.

This question was taken on notice. I now submit the following:

A: Yes. Apart from the unfortunate fact that the sign showing the site for the facilities/carpark was not correctly placed in the first instance, I am satisfied that all involved in the decision to finally locate the building/carpark (option 4) acted properly and in the best interests of all concerned.

Cr Molonev asked the Town Clerk the following questions:

- Q1: How many meetings have been held in relation to the facilities on Chichester Reserve?
- A1: Five (5).
- Q2: Why was the Council delegate to the Kingsley/Woodvale Recreation Management Committee not invited to these meetings?
- A2: I understand the President of Kingsley/Woodvale Recreation Management Committee has apologised to you for the oversight of not informing you of the meeting held on-site on 13 February 1992.

COMMITTEE BUSINESS - GIRRAWHEEN/KOONDOOLA RECREATION MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Cr Moloney asked the Town Clerk how the Girrawheen/Koondoola Recreation Management Committee was aware of Standing Committee recommendations and financial arrangements prior to Council meetings, even though this is contrary to Standing Orders By-Laws?

The Town Clerk advised that this question has been withdrawn.

ALLEGATIONS - WANNEROO TOURISM COUNCIL

Cr Moloney directed the following questions to the Mayor:

In relation to the allegations made by Cr Waters at the recent Finance and Administrative Resources Committee meeting:

Q1: Has Councillor Waters formally reported or substantiated her allegations to Council?

- Al: Following Cr Rita Waters' allegations at the March Finance and Administrative Resources Committee concerning the financial conduct of a former member of the Wannersor Tourism Council I requested the Town Clerk to get a statement from Cr Waters of her allegations and refer it to the appropriate authorities for investigation.
 - I understand the Town Clerk requested a written statement from Cr Waters concerning her allegations, but Cr Waters refused to provide one.

Instead, at the April Finance and Administrative Resources Committee, Cr Waters handed attending Councillors a photocopied sheet of a faxed sheet dated 7 April 1992, with the hand printed title: 'Gatley on Libel and Slander Eighth Edition.'

Cr Waters did not say who provided her with this faxed legal advice.

However, Cr Waters announced she would be making no further statement.

Cr Waters has not substantiated her very serious allegations, but, instead, she has provided Council with legal advice on libel and slander.

Council cannot ignore very serious allegations by a senior Councillor, which alleges that public funds may have been put at risk.

Therefore, I have requested a copy of Cr Waters allegations from shorthand notes of the March Finance and Administrative Resources Finance Committee minute Clerk.

- I requested that this be referred to the appropriate authorities for investigation.
- Q2: Has an officer of the Wanneroo Tourism Council reported the same allegations to Council?
- A2: No officer of the Wanneroo Tourism Council has come forward with the same allegations put by Cr Waters.

However, the President of the Wanneroo Tourism Council, Raoul Cywicki, has telephoned me once and written once regarding Cr Waters' allegations.

He neither confirmed or refuted Cr Waters' allegations.

In a fax sent to me from Corser and Corser, Barristers and Solicitors, Mr Cywicki was critical of Cr Moloney's questions at the March Council meeting.

Mr Cywicki gave me some unsolicited advice in his fax and I guote:

"By permitting such questions to be put in a public meeting you effectively waived any privilege attached to such communications."

Council's concern in this matter is to establish whether or not public funds were put at risk as alleged by Cr Waters.

Council cannot ignore Cr Waters' allegations.

And I personally will not be intimidated by any legal advice in seeking the truth.

Cr Waters asked the Town Clerk the following questions:

Q1: Can you advise if Cr Moloney asked the following question at the full Council Meeting of 25 March 1992:

> "How the Girrawheen/Koondoola Recreation Management Committee was aware of Standing Committee recommendations and financial arrangements prior to Council meetings, even though this is contrary to Standing Orders By-laws?"

- Al: Yes.
- Q2: Can you advise if a response to the question was received by Council on 30 March 1992 from the President of the Girrawheen/Koondoola Recreation Association?"
- A2: Yes. The letter was dated 27 March 1992 and was received by Council on 31 March 1992.
- Q3: Can you read the response of the President of the Girrawheen/Koondoola Recreation Association to Council?
- A3: "Re: Cr Moloney's Question of Town Clerk.

Dear Sir.

I was present at the Council Meeting held on Wednesday 25 March 1992 when Cr Moloney asked a question of yourself. It was in essence "How did the Girrawheen/Koondoola Recreation Association have previous knowledge of items on the agenda for this meeting?"

In answer to this question as President of the Girrawheen/Koondoola Recreation Association, I approached Cr Edwardes in early February to see if it was possible to get the Australia Day Breakfast, 1993, funded. Cr Edwardes has kept me informed as to the progress of this request. He did not tell me that it was going to full Council on 25 March 1992. At our Recreation Association Meeting on 24 March 1992, I asked Cr Moloney if she had anything to report. She told us "That our Association was going to receive some good news after tomorrow's Council Meeting, with regard to some money for a function that we hold every January and \$12,000 for some play equipment for a park in our area".

Cr Moloney was being circumspect with regard to the first part of the report, but was very direct with regard to the second part of the report.

If the subject in question is a cricket pitch to be placed on John Moloney Reserve, then the answer to this question is that on the Tuesday after Technical Services Committee meeting, I received a call to the effect that Dennis Cluming of Parks Department wanted to speak with me. I contacted Dennis and he asked:

- (a) Did we, the Girrawheen/Koondoola Recreation Association, require a cricket pitch on John Moloney Reserve as it was not on our budget list, and
- (b) If so, on what level of John Moloney Reserve did we want the pitch placed.

I answered yes and lower level.

As President of the Girrawheen/Koondoola Recreation Association, I feel that it is my position to keep my committee informed of all developments within our district. I was not aware that this was still subject to approval at full Council. If I had been informed that this was still subject to Council approval, then I would have handled the matter in a completely different manner.

This situation would not have evolved if Cr Moloney had come to our Recreation Association in the first place, and asked us if we required a cricket pitch on John Moloney Reserve. Conversely, if the subject of the question was the \$1,000 for the Australia Day Breakfast and the \$12,000 play equipment, then the answer is Cr Moloney. Either way, if Cr Moloney had the courtesy to contact me, then the question would have never come up in Council.

As it is, Cr Moloney is as guilty of an indiscretion as anyone else involved in this matter, if not more so, because she is trying to play games and create mischief at the expense of Council Officers and Councillors who were at the Council Meeting held on 25 March 1992 and as such she should apologise to all concerned.

This answer should be presented at the next full Council Meeting.

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS - ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

I would like to publicly thank my fellow members on the selection panel for their time and effort in selecting this year's recipients of the awards. This year's selection panel included Cr Fleur Freame, TAFF senior lecturer Michael Rose, school psychologist Mark Bivens, Gary Carland from the Joondalup district education office and Council Executive Assistant Paul Higgs.

OPENING - WANNEROO SHOWGROUND CLUBROOMS

I had the pleasure of opening the new Wanneroo Showground Clubrooms earlier this month.

The new clubrooms will be used by the Wanneroo Amateur Football Club, the Wanneroo Junior Football Club and the Wanneroo Cricket Club.

I'm sure those clubs will feel proud to call the new clubrooms home.

UNEXPLODED ORDNANCE - WANNEROO COASTLINE

The Town Clerk has received correspondence from the Department of Defence regarding the issue of unexploded bombs along Wanneroo's coastline.

In light of the front page article that appeared in this week's edition of the Wanneroo Times, I think it is timely to update the knowledge we have on this most serious problem.

Whilst the Department of Defence maintains a register of sites affected by unexploded ordnance, that information is drawn from national archives and Defence files. The Department acknowledges that these records are far from complete. especially in relation to wartime activities. The Department has advised that it seeks to amplify the information held in the register through obtaining anecdotal evidence from people involved in those activities.

The Department of Defence holds no specific records on the area from Quints Rock to Mullaloo. However, MA UXO Services, a company that specialises in the search and detection of unexploded devices, has advised that "uncorroborated anecdotal sources" have reported that the coastal area between Quinns Rock and Mullaloo was used for live firing by artillery, mortars and armoured vehicles.

The Department has, therefore, recorded the site as possibly affected. It should also be noted, the letter went on to say, that the Burns Beach range falls wholly within this area and the "anecdotal sources" may be referring only to Burns Beach. The Department considers that the risk of continuing contamination in this area is low and that development could proceed without specific searching.

In respect of the live firing range in the Eglinton area, the Department of Defence has undertaken consultation with developers Golf Resorts International. WA UXO Services have subsequently been engaged by the developer to search designated portions of the area subject to possible contamination by UXO.

The Department of Defence has undertaken to continue to raise public awareness of unexploded ordnance risks and of Commonwealth policy for the management of land affected by UXO.

MULTICULTURAL WEEK

All Council libraries recently participated in Multicultural Week.

G40401 NOISE - LIMESTONE BLOCK QUARRYING - [30/1105, 30/3084]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40401

The City Environmental Health Manager reports on complaints received on 7 August 1991 from residents of Lots 17 and 21 Carabooda Road, Carabooda alleging excessive noise emanating from the nearby limestone quarry.

The complainants cited the intermittent cutting of capstone as being the presumed cause of the increased noise.

As a result of investigations and measurements of noise levels being taken by Council's Noise Officers and discussions with the Environmental Protection Authority, a noise monitor/tape recorder was installed at Lot 17 Carabooda Robot.

The Environmental Protection Authority wrote to Council on 5 March 1992 suggesting that the noise may have originated from another quarry, approximately 300 metres east of the Carabooda site. It has been established that noise from both quarries has a significant affect on the complainants' properties.

Communication on 24 March 1992 with Noise Officers of the Mines Department indicated their support for the attenuation of limestone cutting saws in Wanneroo.

The City Environmental Health Manager seeks Council endorsement for the service of Pollution Abatement Notice in accordance with the provisions of Section 65 of the Environmental Protection Act on both quarries.

- endorses the service of a Pollution Abatement Notice under Section 65 of the Environmental Protection Act on:

G40402 OFFENSIVE TRADE APPLICATION - MANURE WORKS - [930-14, 30/3867]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40402

In February 1992, Council deferred consideration of an application to establish an offensive trade (manure works) at Lot 6 Safari Place, Carabooda, pending notification to adjoining neighbours.

The City Environmental Health Manager reports that letters were sent on 31 March 1992 and to date, no objections have been received.

G40403 RURAL FLY SURVEY - [855/3]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40403

Council's Health Department extended the Annual Fly Control Campaign this year to include the rural area.

An intensive survey of 320 properties was co-ordinated in February 1992 with hand-out pamphlets being translated into Vietnamese because of the large number of Vietnamese operating market gardens.

The City Environmental Health Manager reports on the results of the survey and the follow up measures undertaken to rectify situations where an incidence of fly breeding was moderate or severe.

Health Action Notices will be issued to occupiers where fly breeding has not abated and recommendations have been ignored.

- endorses the issue of appropriate Health Act Notices to occupiers where fly breeding is not being abated;
 - authorises legal action should default occur regarding the requirement of Health Notices.CARRIED

G40404 ANNUAL MOSQUITO CONTROL PROGRAMME - [856-5, 859-1]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40404

The City Environmental Health Manager reports on the completion of the suburban phase of the Annual Mosquito Control which is conducted over four months of the summer season and consists of the installation of slow release insecticide plaster blocks into street stormwater gullies, which are sources of mosquito breeding.

Between November 1991 and March 1992 a total of 13,425 street gullies were checked, of these 5,662 were treated. In addition, this year all major roads and Council car parks were included, resulting in an additional 3,000 gullies compared to last year.

Thirty-three suburbs formed the bulk of the Programme in locations ranging from Duncraig, Koondoola, Girrawheen, Mullaloo to Burns Beach, Quinns Rock and Yanchep. Statistically, 35.7% additional gullies were inspected and 29.2% required treatment compared to the previous year's figures. Total cost of materials amounted to \$9,057.36.

In addition to the street gullies treatment phase, Lakes Joondalup and Goollelal were monitored regularly in conjunction with the Midge Control Survey.

The City Environmental Health Manager advises that the two lakes are not breeding mosquitoes on a massive scale, as compared with a lake located south of Perth.

There have been 15 reported cases of Ross River Virus infections in the Wanneroo area over the past month. However, at least 50% of these had visited areas of high incidence of the disease, ie Kununurra and Mandurah.

The Health Department of WA has nominated Lake Joondalup as a possible source of the three sub-species of mosquito capable of spreading the virus. To date, both the quantity and the low level of the presence of those sub-species has not substantiated that the lake poses a significant problem.

G40405 PERTH AIR QUALITY - [865-3, 305-5]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40405

Council is advised of a submission from the Environmental Protection Authority titled "Perth Air Quality" and a brief document "Perth Urban Air Quality - The Problems, What We Are Doing, What Needs To Be Done And What Helb We Need".

The document reports on all aspects of air pollution being experienced in Perth. The causes are multi-directional ranging from vehicles, domestic heating and bush fire smoke, to industrial discharges.

Under item 2.6 of the document, the problems of backyard incinerators, open fireplaces and more recently "pot belly" stoves are mentioned as contributors to diminished air quality. However, as stated, to what extent these activities affect overall air quality of whether they are likely to significantly affect health or amenity is not known.

The City Environmental Health Manager reports on a joint SECWA/EPA study with a budget of \$3M and the resources necessary to undertake a thorough investigation into photochemical smog. The components of the study are:

- . compilation of an inventory of emissions which contribute to photochemical smog formation;
 - monitoring of photochemical smog constituents and precursors;
- . monitoring and experimental investigation of the meteorological features which affect smog formation, transport and dispersion;

computer modelling of the meteorology and the smog cycle, giving predictions of smog concentrations over the metro area.

As the SECWA funded study addresses photochemical smog only, contributions are being sought from the public sector to extend the work beyond SECWA's responsibilities.

The City Environmental Health Manager seeks Council's support for this proposal.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council:

- 1 lists for consideration in the 1992/93 draft budget funds of \$2,500 for a contribution to the Environmental Protection Authority for the purpose of managing air quality in the metropolitan area;
- advises the Environmental Protection Authority of Council's support for a metropolitan air management programme;
- 3 writes to the Asthma Foundation of WA seeking the resumption of daily media broadcasts of pollen counts so that people with breathing difficulties can assess whether their medical condition is related to pollen levels or not.

G40406 HEALTH ACT AMENDMENTS - EATING HOUSE FEES - [930-1]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40406

In Pebruary 1992, Council resolved to adopt amendments to the City of Wanneroo Eating House By-laws, effectively raising the licence and registration fee from \$12 to a total of \$300 annually as recommended jointly by the Western Australian Municipal Association and the Health Department of Western Australia.

The Proprietor of the Yanchep Lagoon kiosk has objected to the new licencing fee on the grounds that it is not fair and equitable that a small kiosk should pay the same amount as large food operators, ie McDonald's, Sizzler.

The City Environmental Health Manager suggests that Council may wish to consider a sub-categorisation of the Take-Away category with a scaling of fees applied to the premises according to the extent of preparation and cooking of foodstuffs.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council reiterates its Resolution 640212 and adopts amendments to City of Wanneroo Eating House By-laws by raising the licence fee from \$12 to a total of \$300 annually, as recommended jointly by WAMA and the Health Department of WA.

CARRIED

G40407 INCREASE IN FEES - KINGSLEY OCCASIONAL CARE CENTRE - [880-3-1]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40407

The Kingsley Occasional Care Service offers integrated child care for children aged 0-6 years, with or without disabilities in the City. It receives a small funding subsidy from the Department for Community Services. The expectation placed on occasional care services is that they are self funding, that is, revenue has to be raised predominately through the charqing of fees.

The service has been operating since October 1991 and fees were originally set at \$2 per hour for the first child with a \$1 per hour charge for additional children.

The City Environmental Health Manager advises that fees will need to be raised to meet budgetary requirements.

He gives details of a proposal to increase the hourly rate but to offer a reduction to parents that book for the full session (4 hours) which will encourage parents to utilise the full session.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council approves the revised setting of fees for the Kingsley Occasional Care Centre to the rate of:

\$4 per hour for the first child and \$2 per hour per additional child; up to \$8 for the first two hours;

OR

2 \$10 for up to 4 hours for the first child and \$6 up to 4 hours for the second child. CARRIED

G40408 INTRODUCTION OF ADMINISTRATION FEE - FAMILY DAY CARE - [856-0]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40408

The matter of the introduction of an administrative fee to provide additional income for the Family Day Care Centre was raised at Council in March and deferred (Item G30308 refers).

The City Environmental Health Manager reported that due to the increasing cost of administering the Family Day Care Schemes, Council might wish to consider the introduction of an additional fee, paid by participating parents to the registered caregivers within the Scheme, such fee then to be paid to Council.

The City of Wanneroo receives an operational subsidy from the Federal Government to operate its Family Day Care Schemes. However, in recent years the grant's annual indexation has not been in line with the general increase in cost to all areas of the Scheme.

He proposes a fee of 5 cents per hour of child care be charged to parents registered with the Schemes. It is anticipated that this will provide an additional \$34,000 in income and will assist in off setting any deficit to the Schemes' budget. MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council approves the introduction of an administrative fee of 5 cents per hour of child care to parents registered with the City of Wanneroo's Family Day Care Schemes.

G40409 RESTRUCTURING OF HOME SUPPORT SERVICE ADVISORY COMMITTEE - [858-3-3]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40409

At a recent meeting of the Home Support Service Advisory Committee, it was proposed that the existing Committee be restructured to reflect the changing role of Council's services for the aged and disabled.

The City Environmental Health Manager suggests that with the introduction of a brokerage model of service delivery and the attempt by the Welfare Department to offer a co-ordinated approach to assessment and service delivery, the proposed new Advisory Committee be called Services for Aged and Disabled Advisory Committee.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council:

- approves the restructuring of the Home Support Service Advisory Committee;
- 2 adopts the Terms of Reference put forward;
- 3 approves the change of name from Home Support Service Advisory Committee to Services for Aged and Disabled Advisory Committee. CARRIED

G40410 PROCEEDS FROM THE CIVIC CHARITY DINNER - [880-3-1]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40410

In March 1992, Council requested a report be submitted to the Community Services Committee to consider proposals to purchase suitable equipment for children with disabilities from the Trust fund established with the proceeds of the Civic Charity Dinner and any subsequent monies resulting from a submission to the Lotteries Commission, matching the proceeds, and the implementation of a register system for recording loans of such equipment, which would remain the property of the City of Wanneroo.

The City Environmental Health Manager gives details of how the funds could be expended to provide equipment for families who have a child with specific needs or to provide community bursose equipment.

He suggests that a Trust Committee be established to examine the options and make appropriate recommendations to Council.

RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- approves the establishment of a Trust Committee which has the authority to recommend to Council the allocation of funds raised for the purpose of assisting children with disabilities in a manner which it sees appropriate;
- 2 adopts the following Terms of Reference for the Trust Committee:
 - (a) to determine the distribution of funds; individual family, community purpose or joint;
 - (b) to ensure the above occurs as equitably as possible for the benefit of children in the City of Wanneroo;
 - (c) to ensure confidentiality for individual families, should they so wish;
 - (d) to implement the registration system;
 - (e) to have the vested authority by Council to expend the proceeds of the Gala Ball and any monies matched by the Lotteries Commission in accordance with the above Terms of Reference:
- 3 nominates a Councillor as representative on the Trust Committee.

MOVED Cr Waters, SECONDED Cr Freame that consideration of the establishment of a Trust Committee be deferred for one month.

CARRIED

G40411 COMMUNITY OPTIONS SERVICE - PROGRESS REPORT - [880-8-6]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40411

In October 1991, the City's Welfare Section added to its range of services for aged and disabled, a Community Options Programme. This was possible due to negotiations with the Home and Community Care Programme (HACC) to secure funding to service 40 frail aged and disabled people within the City of Wanneroo who were at immediate risk of institutionalisation.

The City Environmental Health Manager gives details of the history and implementation of the Community Options for the City of Wanneroo.

52 people aged between 1 and 88 were able to access the Community Options and although there has been no formal evaluation of the service, both clients and carers have indicated that Community Options has enabled them to fill the gaps left by other service providers.

To expand the service requires few administrative costs.

The City Environmental Health Manager suggests that Council seeks additional funding from HACC to expand its Community Options Programme.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council submits a proposal to the Home and Community Care Programme (HACC) to expand its Community Options Programme to cater for a further 80 clients.

CARRIED

G40412 ANCILLARY SERVICES - [240-2]

CITY LIBRARIAN'S REPORT G40412

As part of ancillary services, a jigsaw collection is provided by Council at each of its libraries and a games collection is maintained at the Girrawheen Library.

The City Librarian reports that the ancillary services were not funded in the 1991/92 Budget and given a low priority in the 1992/93 draft Budget.

Assessment of the collections identified a drop in usage probably due to poor condition of items and lack of new stock.

It would seem appropriate to consider the future of these services at this point.

The Libraries Department is currently structuring internal staff training to comply with Training Guarantee requirements. The final result of the programme will be a comprehensive training manual in each branch library.

The City Librarian reports on the success of the workshop which attracted 26 registrations from public libraries throughout the State at a fee of \$10 per person.

Budget cuts experienced by the Library and Information Service of WA (LISWA) in recent years represent a reduction from 15 per cent to 6 per cent new book ordering rate which resulted in 18,000 less new items per annum for the City of Wanneroo libraries.

The City Librarian reports on the implications of the current budget situation and how they will affect the proposed new library at Joondalup which may open in 1996/97.

LISWA is unable to offer a Development Programme for proposed new libraries and although the Minister for the Arts has stated that library funding will be restored to previous levels when the economy recovers, the Joondalup Library requires a commitment from the Government now if it is to fulfil its role serving a large residential, business and regional population.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council writes to the Minister for the Arts seeking a specific Government commitment to fund LISMA in order that the Joondalup City Library development programme may proceed.

The Northern Suburbs Animal Shelter is seeking a grant of land from Council for the purpose of sheltering and training stray cats and dogs, in order to rehabilitate these strays for placement with selected new owners.

The City Planner reports that the group, which held its inaugural meeting in January does not appear to be an incorporated body and the grant of 2.0 hectares of land would enable the preparation of a submission to the Lotteries Commission for grant funds.

He outlines Council's landownings in the general Wangara area and concludes that, as the group has not established itself as a viable or perpetual body that is capable of holding land in its own right, Council should not support the request.

For three years, Council has been involved with the Surf Lifesaving Association to ensure the safety of patrons at Sorrento and Mullaloo beaches. This season, Council appointed a professional lifequard to patrol the Yanchep Lagoon at weekends and to assist the Yanchep Surf Lifesaving Club in award instruction to rebuild its membership.

The City Recreation and Cultural Services Manager advises that the lifequards provide a high standard of protection to beach users and the service is an excellent public relations opportunity to convey to ratepayers the City's commitment to public safety.

The Surf Lifesaving Association has now advised that the provision of this level of service for the 1992/93 season will cost approximately \$20,150 and has suggested that to enhance the overall success of the service, the lifequards be given the status and power of authority to enforce local government by-laws and the beach signage be reviewed.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council lists for consideration in the 1992/93 Budget, funds to contract the Surf Lifesaving Association of Western Australia to provide lifeguard services for a three month period during the 1992/93 summer season.

In July 1991, Council supported a submission to the Lotteries Commission from the City's Voluntary Bush Fire Organisation for a caravan to be equipped as a Forward Control Point. The total cost was estimated at \$20,691 and Council set aside \$10,000 in the 1991/92 Budget in anticipation of the grant being successful.

The grant was not successful.

The Wanneroo Voluntary Bush Fire Brigade is now eager to acquire the Hino bus currently in use with the city of Wanneroo and due to be traded in 1992/93 as a Forward Control Point. The bus would be worth \$30,000 as a trade in for a new bus.

Cr Freame has indicated that it is her intention to ask Council to donate the bus to the City's Volunteer Fire Fighting Organisation and to request Council to meet dollar for dollar, the cost of equipping the bus subject to a grant from the Lotteries Commission this year.

The Security Administrator gives reasons why the bus would provide a safe, efficient working environment for the Brigade and would provide a co-ordination centre for all manpower involved in the control of bush fires.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that consideration of the transfer of the Hino Bus to the City of Wanneroo Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade Service be deferred for one month pending further information being obtained from the City Treasurer.CARRIED

G40427 BANYANDAH PARK - GOLF PRACTICE AREA - [061-24]

Since the Opening of the Marangaroo Golf Course, considerable problems have been experienced with the telephone system that was installed for the use of Course Controllers to take bookings for the course and conduct their own business.

The City Parks Manager reports ongoing problems with the line particularly when the general public is trying to make bookings to play at weekends.

Telecom Australia has requested the telephone system be upgraded and there have been numerous complaints from disgruntled players trying to make bookings.

The Course Controllers have investigated a modification to the present telephone system and have recommended that Council purchase a manual queuing system with four exchange lines at a price of \$3,560 from Digital Telecommunications Systems Pty Ltd.

The Course Controllers have offered to pay the installation fee and ongoing line rental.

G40401 NOISE - LIMESTONE BLOCK QUARRYING - [30/1105, 30/3084]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40401

The City Environmental Health Manager reports on complaints received on 7 August 1991 from residents of Lots 17 and 21 Carabooda Road, Carabooda alleging excessive noise emanating from the nearby limestone quarry.

The complainants cited the intermittent cutting of capstone as being the presumed cause of the increased noise.

As a result of investigations and measurements of noise levels being taken by Council's Noise Officers and discussions with the Environmental Protection Authority, a noise monitor/tape recorder was installed at Lot 17 Carabooda Robot.

The Environmental Protection Authority wrote to Council on 5 March 1992 suggesting that the noise may have originated from another quarry, approximately 300 metres east of the Carabooda site. It has been established that noise from both quarries has a significant affect on the complainants' properties.

Communication on 24 March 1992 with Noise Officers of the Mines Department indicated their support for the attenuation of limestone cutting saws in Wanneroo.

The City Environmental Health Manager seeks Council endorsement for the service of Pollution Abatement Notice in accordance with the provisions of Section 65 of the Environmental Protection Act on both quarries.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council:

- endorses the service of a Pollution Abatement Notice under Section 65 of the Environmental Protection Act on:

In February 1992, Council deferred consideration of an application to establish an offensive trade (manure works) at Lot 6 Safari Place, Carabooda, pending notification to adjoining neighbours.

The City Environmental Health Manager reports that letters were sent on 31 March 1992 and to date, no objections have been received.

G40403 RURAL FLY SURVEY - [855/3]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40403

Council's Health Department extended the Annual Fly Control Campaign this year to include the rural area.

An intensive survey of 320 properties was co-ordinated in February 1992 with hand-out pamphlets being translated into Vietnamese because of the large number of Vietnamese operating market gardens.

The City Environmental Health Manager reports on the results of the survey and the follow up measures undertaken to rectify situations where an incidence of fly breeding was moderate or severe.

Health Action Notices will be issued to occupiers where fly breeding has not abated and recommendations have been ignored.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council:

- endorses the issue of appropriate Health Act Notices to occupiers where fly breeding is not being abated;
 - authorises legal action should default occur regarding the requirement of Health Notices.CARRIED

G40404 ANNUAL MOSOUITO CONTROL PROGRAMME - [856-5, 859-1]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40404

The City Environmental Health Manager reports on the completion of the suburban phase of the Annual Mosquito Control which is conducted over four months of the summer season and consists of the installation of slow release insecticide plaster blocks into street stormwater gullies, which are sources of mosquito breeding.

Between November 1991 and March 1992 a total of 13,425 street gullies were checked, of these 5,662 were treated. In addition, this year all major road and Council car parks were included, resulting in an additional 3,000 gullies compared to last year.

Thirty-three suburbs formed the bulk of the Programme in locations ranging from Duncraig, Koondoola, Girrawheen, Mullaloo to Burns Beach, Quinns Rock and Yanchep. Statistically, 35.7% additional gullies were inspected and 29.2% required treatment compared to the previous year's figures. Total cost of materials amounted to \$9,057.36.

In addition to the street gullies treatment phase, Lakes Joondalup and Goollelal were monitored regularly in conjunction with the Midge Control Survey.

The City Environmental Health Manager advises that the two lakes are not breeding mosquitoes on a massive scale, as compared with a lake located south of Perth.

There have been 15 reported cases of Ross River Virus infections in the Wanneroo area over the past month. However, at least 50% of these had visited areas of high incidence of the disease, ie Kununurra and Mandurah.

The Health Department of WA has nominated Lake Joondalup as a possible source of the three sub-species of mosquito capable of spreading the virus. To date, both the quantity and the low level of the presence of those sub-species has not substantiated that the lake poses a significant problem.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40404 be received CARRIED

G40405 PERTH AIR QUALITY - [865-3, 305-5]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40405

Council is advised of a submission from the Environmental Protection Authority titled "Perth Air Quality" and a brief document "Perth Urban Air Quality - The Problems, What We Are Doing, What Needs To Be Done And What Helb We Need".

The document reports on all aspects of air pollution being experienced in Perth. The causes are multi-directional ranging from vehicles, domestic heating and bush fire smoke, to industrial discharges.

Under item 2.6 of the document, the problems of backyard incinerators, open fireplaces and more recently "pot belly" stoves are mentioned as contributors to diminished air quality. However, as stated, to what extent these activities affect overall air quality of whether they are likely to significantly affect health or amenity is not known.

The City Environmental Health Manager reports on a joint SECWA/EPA study with a budget of \$3M and the resources necessary to undertake a thorough investigation into photochemical smog. The components of the study are:

- . compilation of an inventory of emissions which contribute to photochemical smog formation;
 - monitoring of photochemical smog constituents and precursors;
- . monitoring and experimental investigation of the meteorological features which affect smog formation, transport and dispersion;

computer modelling of the meteorology and the smog cycle, giving predictions of smog concentrations over the metro area.

As the SECWA funded study addresses photochemical smog only, contributions are being sought from the public sector to extend the work beyond SECWA's responsibilities.

The City Environmental Health Manager seeks Council's support for this proposal.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council:

- lists for consideration in the 1992/93 draft budget funds of \$2,500 for a contribution to the Environmental Protection Authority for the purpose of managing air quality in the metropolitan area;
- 2 advises the Environmental Protection Authority of Council's support for a metropolitan air management programme;
- 3 writes to the Asthma Foundation of WA seeking the resumption of daily media broadcasts of pollen counts so that people with breathing difficulties can assess whether their medical condition is related to pollen levels or not.

CARRIED

G40406 HEALTH ACT AMENDMENTS - EATING HOUSE FEES - [930-1]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40406

In Pebruary 1992, Council resolved to adopt amendments to the City of Wanneroo Eating House By-laws, effectively raising the licence and registration fee from \$12 to a total of \$300 annually as recommended jointly by the Western Australian Municipal Association and the Health Department of Western Australia.

The Proprietor of the Yanchep Lagoon kiosk has objected to the new licencing fee on the grounds that it is not fair and equitable that a small kiosk should pay the same amount as large food operators, ie McDonald's, Sizzler.

The City Environmental Health Manager suggests that Council may wish to consider a sub-categorisation of the Take-Away category with a scaling of fees applied to the premises according to the extent of preparation and cooking of foodstuffs.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council reiterates its Resolution 640212 and adopts amendments to City of Wanneroo Eating House By-laws by raising the licence fee from \$12 to a total of \$300 annually, as recommended jointly by WAMA and the Health Department of WA.

CARRIED

G40407 INCREASE IN FEES - KINGSLEY OCCASIONAL CARE CENTRE - [880-3-1]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40407

The Kingsley Occasional Care Service offers integrated child care for children aged 0-6 years, with or without disabilities in the City. It receives a small funding subsidy from the Department for Community Services. The expectation placed on occasional care services is that they are self funding, that is, revenue has to be raised predominately through the charqing of fees.

The service has been operating since October 1991 and fees were originally set at \$2 per hour for the first child with a \$1 per hour charge for additional children.

The City Environmental Health Manager advises that fees will need to be raised to meet budgetary requirements.

He gives details of a proposal to increase the hourly rate but to offer a reduction to parents that book for the full session (4 hours) which will encourage parents to utilise the full session.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council approves the revised setting of fees for the Kingsley Occasional Care Centre to the rate of:

\$4 per hour for the first child and \$2 per hour per additional child; up to \$8 for the first two hours;

OR

2 \$10 for up to 4 hours for the first child and \$6 up to 4 hours for the second child. CARRIED

G40408 INTRODUCTION OF ADMINISTRATION FEE - FAMILY DAY CARE - [856-0]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40408

The matter of the introduction of an administrative fee to provide additional income for the Family Day Care Centre was raised at Council in March and deferred (Item G30308 refers).

The City Environmental Health Manager reported that due to the increasing cost of administering the Family Day Care Schemes, Council might wish to consider the introduction of an additional fee, paid by participating parents to the registered caregivers within the Scheme, such fee then to be paid to Council.

The City of Wanneroo receives an operational subsidy from the Federal Government to operate its Family Day Care Schemes. However, in recent years the grant's annual indexation has not been in line with the general increase in cost to all areas of the Scheme.

He proposes a fee of 5 cents per hour of child care be charged to parents registered with the Schemes. It is anticipated that this will provide an additional \$34,000 in income and will assist in off setting any deficit to the Schemes' budget. MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council approves the introduction of an administrative fee of 5 cents per hour of child care to parents registered with the City of Wanneroo's Family Day Care Schemes.

G40409 RESTRUCTURING OF HOME SUPPORT SERVICE ADVISORY COMMITTEE - [858-3-3]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40409

At a recent meeting of the Home Support Service Advisory Committee, it was proposed that the existing Committee be restructured to reflect the changing role of Council's services for the aged and disabled.

The City Environmental Health Manager suggests that with the introduction of a brokerage model of service delivery and the attempt by the Welfare Department to offer a co-ordinated approach to assessment and service delivery, the proposed new Advisory Committee be called Services for Aged and Disabled Advisory Committee.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council:

- approves the restructuring of the Home Support Service Advisory Committee;
- 2 adopts the Terms of Reference put forward;
- 3 approves the change of name from Home Support Service Advisory Committee to Services for Aged and Disabled Advisory Committee. CARRIED

G40410 PROCEEDS FROM THE CIVIC CHARITY DINNER - [880-3-1]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40410

In March 1992, Council requested a report be submitted to the Community Services Committee to consider proposals to purchase suitable equipment for children with disabilities from the Trust fund established with the proceeds of the Civic Charity Dinner and any subsequent monies resulting from a submission to the Lotteries Commission, matching the proceeds, and the implementation of a register system for recording loans of such equipment, which would remain the property of the City of Wanneroo.

The City Environmental Health Manager gives details of how the funds could be expended to provide equipment for families who have a child with specific needs or to provide community bursose equipment.

He suggests that a Trust Committee be established to examine the options and make appropriate recommendations to Council.

RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- approves the establishment of a Trust Committee which has the authority to recommend to Council the allocation of funds raised for the purpose of assisting children with disabilities in a manner which it sees appropriate;
- 2 adopts the following Terms of Reference for the Trust Committee:
 - (a) to determine the distribution of funds; individual family, community purpose or joint;
 - (b) to ensure the above occurs as equitably as possible for the benefit of children in the City of Wanneroo;
 - (c) to ensure confidentiality for individual families, should they so wish;
 - (d) to implement the registration system;
 - (e) to have the vested authority by Council to expend the proceeds of the Gala Ball and any monies matched by the Lotteries Commission in accordance with the above Terms of Reference:
- 3 nominates a Councillor as representative on the Trust Committee.

MOVED Cr Waters, SECONDED Cr Freame that consideration of the establishment of a Trust Committee be deferred for one month.

CARRIED

G40411 COMMUNITY OPTIONS SERVICE - PROGRESS REPORT - [880-8-6]

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40411

In October 1991, the City's Welfare Section added to its range of services for aged and disabled, a Community Options Programme. This was possible due to negotiations with the Home and Community Care Programme (HACC) to secure funding to service 40 frail aged and disabled people within the City of Wanneroo who were at immediate risk of institutionalisation.

The City Environmental Health Manager gives details of the history and implementation of the Community Options for the City of Wanneroo.

52 people aged between 1 and 88 were able to access the Community Options and although there has been no formal evaluation of the service, both clients and carers have indicated that Community Options has enabled them to fill the gaps left by other service providers.

To expand the service requires few administrative costs.

The City Environmental Health Manager suggests that Council seeks additional funding from HACC to expand its Community Options Programme.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council submits a proposal to the Home and Community Care Programme (HACC) to expand its Community Options Programme to cater for a further 80 clients.

CARRIED

G40412 ANCILLARY SERVICES - [240-2]

CITY LIBRARIAN'S REPORT G40412

As part of ancillary services, a jigsaw collection is provided by Council at each of its libraries and a games collection is maintained at the Girrawheen Library.

The City Librarian reports that the ancillary services were not funded in the 1991/92 Budget and given a low priority in the 1992/93 draft Budget.

Assessment of the collections identified a drop in usage probably due to poor condition of items and lack of new stock.

It would seem appropriate to consider the future of these services at this point.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council:

- withdraws jigsaws and games collections from the libraries;
- 2 donates the jigsaws and games to neighbourhood centres.

CARRIED

G40413 LIBRARY STAFF TRAINING PROGRAMME DEMONSTRATION - [240-2]

CITY LIBRARIAN'S REPORT G40413

A library staff training programme was held at the Woodvale Library on 12 March 1992 at a request from the Western Australian Local Government Librarians' Association.

The Libraries Department is currently structuring internal staff training to comply with Training Guarantee requirements. The final result of the programme will be a comprehensive training manual in each branch library.

The City Librarian reports on the success of the workshop which attracted 26 registrations from public libraries throughout the State at a fee of \$10 per person.

G40414 JOONDALUP LIBRARY DEVELOPMENT - [730-8-4]

CITY LIBRARIAN'S REPORT G40414

Budget cuts experienced by the Library and Information Service of WA (LISWA) in recent years represent a reduction from 15 per cent to 6 per cent new book ordering rate which resulted in 18,000 less new items per annum for the City of Wanneroo libraries.

The City Librarian reports on the implications of the current budget situation and how they will affect the proposed new library at Joondalup which may open in 1996/97.

LISWA is unable to offer a Development Programme for proposed new libraries and although the Minister for the Arts has stated that library funding will be restored to previous levels when the economy recovers, the Joondalup Library requires a commitment from the Government now if it is to fulfil its role serving a large residential, business and regional population.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that Council writes to the Minister for the Arts seeking a specific Government commitment to fund LISMA in order that the Joondalup City Library development programme may proceed.

CARRIED

G40415 REQUEST FOR GRANT OF LAND, NORTHERN SUBURBS - [940-4]

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT G40415

The Northern Suburbs Animal Shelter is seeking a grant of land from Council for the purpose of sheltering and training stray cats and dogs, in order to rehabilitate these strays for placement with selected new owners.

The City Planner reports that the group, which held its inaugural meeting in January does not appear to be an incorporated body and the grant of 2.0 hectares of land would enable the preparation of a submission to the Lotteries Commission for grant funds.

He outlines Council's landownings in the general Wangara area and concludes that, as the group has not established itself as a viable or perpetual body that is capable of holding land in its own right, Council should not support the request.

For three years, Council has been involved with the Surf Lifesaving Association to ensure the safety of patrons at Sorrento and Mullaloo beaches. This season, Council appointed a professional lifeguard to patrol the Yanchep Lagoon at weekends and to assist the Yanchep Surf Lifesaving Club in award instruction to rebuild its membership.

The City Recreation and Cultural Services Manager advises that the lifequards provide a high standard of protection to beach users and the service is an excellent public relations opportunity to convey to ratepayers the City's commitment to public safety.

The Surf Lifesaving Association has now advised that the provision of this level of service for the 1992/93 season will cost approximately \$20,150 and has suggested that to enhance the overall success of the service, the lifeguards be given the status and power of authority to enforce local government by-laws and the beach signage be reviewed.

In July 1991, Council supported a submission to the Lotteries Commission from the City's Voluntary Bush Fire Organisation for a caravan to be equipped as a Forward Control Point. The total cost was estimated at \$20,691 and Council set aside \$10,000 in the 1991/92 Budget in anticipation of the grant being successful.

The grant was not successful.

The Wanneroo Voluntary Bush Fire Brigade is now eager to acquire the Hino bus currently in use with the city of Wanneroo and due to be traded in 1992/93 as a Forward Control Point. The bus would be worth \$30,000 as a trade in for a new bus.

Cr Freame has indicated that it is her intention to ask Council to donate the bus to the City's Volunteer Fire Fighting Organisation and to request Council to meet dollar for dollar, the cost of equipping the bus subject to a grant from the Lotteries Commission this year.

The Security Administrator gives reasons why the bus would provide a safe, efficient working environment for the Brigade and would provide a co-ordination centre for all manpower involved in the control of bush fires.

MOVED Cr Freame, SECONDED Cr Johnson that consideration of the transfer of the Hino Bus to the City of Wanneroo Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade Service be deferred for one month pending further information being obtained from the City Treasurer.CARRIED

The Course Controllers have investigated a modification to the present telephone system and have recommended that Council purchase a manual queuing system with four exchange lines at a price of \$3,560 from Digital Telecommunications Systems Pty Ltd.

The Course Controllers have offered to pay the installation fee and ongoing line rental.

PETITIONS AND DEPUTATIONS

DEPUTATION - PROPOSED REZONING AND PUBLIC ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW FOR SWAN LOCATION 2579 AND LOTS 1 AND 2 FLYNN DRIVE, NEERABUP

Mr Geoff Russell of Peet and Co, Mr John Chapman of Chapman, Glendinning and Associates, Mr Terry Martin of Martin Goff and Associates, Mr Richard Elliot of Homeswest, and Mr Kent Hamilton of Halpern, Glick and Maunsell, addressed the meeting in relation to the above rezoning.

Mr Russell advised the Committee that Yatala Nominees have owned the land since 1976/77. Peet & Company, who are the Project Managers for Yatala Nominees have been associated with the land for 30 years.

The three owners, Homeswest, the R & I Bank and Yatala Nominees decided that a fortified effort would be the best way to develop this large parcel of land.

The land is cleared, well elevated with easy contours and is ideal for residential subdivision. It is close to the Joondalup Regional Centre. Servicing of the subdivision could be achieved in under twelve months.

It is anticipated that 8000 lots will be created over a period of ten years with approximately 400 lots available for sale in the first year. If approvals are received, the project could be underway in the early part of next year.

The money to spend on the rezoning and development is over \$600 million.

The Public Environmental Review (PER) has indicated that the noise from the Wanneroo Racing Circuit will not be a problem. Urbanisation brings its own noise, ie traffic.

Both Liberal and Labour politicians appear to be in favour of this major amendment and they do not anticipate any reason for this amendment not to go through. The Minister has been advised that the papers will be ready for the September sitting of Parliament.

There have been some discussions with local Aboriginal groups but the process of consultation will come in the later stages when their finite requirements will be noted.

Following questions from Councillors, the Chairman thanked the deputation for addressing the Committee and advised that the matter would be considered later in the meeting. A recommendation would be formulated for consideration at the Council meeting later this month (Item G20412 refers).

 - (a) amends its policy on two houses on one lot to reduce the minimum lot size requirements so that the policy reads as follows:

"TWO HOUSES ON ONE LOT

Council supports the development of a second dwelling on any lot within the municipality if:

in the case of a "Rural" zoned lot, the lot is at least the minimum lot size as shown on Two Houses on One Lot plan (ie ranging from 2 ha to 8 ha) -Attachment 4 to Report D51002;

- (ii) in the case of lots zoned "Residential", "Residential Development" or areas earmarked for future urban development, the proposed location of the dwelling is in accordance with an overall structure plan or as determined by the City Planner;
- (iii) the desirable criteria outlined by the Environmental Protection Authority and the Water Authority of Western Australia are met.

The following standard requirement shall be met before a Building Licence is issued for a second dwelling in the Rural Zone:

The owner enters into a deed prepared by the Council's solicitors at the owner's expense to enable the Council to lodge an absolute caveat against the title of the land to preclude the owner from further subdividing his land. The caveat is not to be removed unless the council amends its Policy or rezones the area.

Second dwellings will not be permitted on any lots:

- (i) less than 1 hectare in area;
- zoned "Special Rural" or "Special Residential".

Where a second dwelling does not comply with this policy and where the existing building is to be occupied during the construction of a new dwelling on a single lot, a legal agreement is to be drawn up at the owner's expense and entered into, requiring the owner to demolish the existing dwelling or make it uninhabitable to the satisfaction of the City Building Surveyor upon completion of construction of the second dwelling.

Any historically significant homes are to be assessed by Council and/or the Wanneroo Historical Society and/or the National Trust for possible retention or preservation";

(b) delegates authority to the Development Assessment Unit to grant approval to applications for two houses on one lot which comply with Council's adopted policy." and adopts the following amended Policy:

"TWO HOUSES ON ONE LOT POLICY

- Council supports the development of a second dwelling on any lot within the municipality if:
 - (i) In the case of a "Rural" zoned lot, the lot is at least the minimum lot size as shown on Two Houses on One Lot plan (ie ranging from 2 ha to 8 ha).
 - (ii) In the case of lots zoned "Residential", "Residential Development" or areas earmarked for future urban development, the proposed location of the dwelling is in accordance with an overall structure plan or as determined by the City Planner.
 - (iii) The desirable criteria outlined by the Environmental Protection Authority and the Water Authority of Western Australia are met.
- The following standard requirement shall be met before a Building Licence is issued for a second dwelling in the Rural Zone:

The owner enters into a deed prepared by the Council's solicitors at the owner's expense to enable the Council to lodge an absolute caveat against the title of the land to preclude the owner from further subdividing his land. The caveat is not to be removed unless the council amends its Policy or rezones the area.

- Second dwellings will not be permitted on any lots:
 - (iv) Less than 2 hectares in area.
 - (v) Zoned "Special Rural" or "Special Residential".

On lots less than 2 hectares in area and/or zoned "Special Rural" or "Special Residential" Council will permit the development of additional accommodation only provided it takes the form of an extension to the existing dwelling and shall have permanent direct access between the main dwelling and the additional accommodation.

4. Where a second dwelling does not comply with this policy and where the existing building is to be occupied during the construction of a new dwelling on a single lot, a legal agreement is to be drawn up at the owner's expense and entered into, requiring the owner to demolish the existing dwelling or make it uninabitable to the satisfaction of the City Building Surveyor upon completion of construction of the second dwelling.

- Any historically significant homes are to be assessed by Council and/or the Wanneroo Historical Society and/or the National Trust for possible retention or preservation";
- 2 delegates authority to the Development Assessment Unit to grant approval to applications for two houses on one lot which comply with Council's adouted policy.CARRIED

G20422 METROPOLITAN REGION SCHEME AMENDMENTS ALKIMOS/EGLINTON: LOT 3 ROMEO ROAD, ALKIMOS - [770-26, 770-546]

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT G20422

At its meeting of February 1992 (Item G20214 refers) Council resolved to initiate an amendment to the Metropolitan Region Scheme to provide for the future urban development of Lot 3 Romeo Road, Alkimos. The ceding to the Crown of land for Important Regional Roads was a prerequisite to the initiation of that amendment.

The City Planner reports on two matters that have arisen subsequent to Council's February resolution which affect the proposed MPS amendment, and suggests an investigation with the Department of Planning and Urban Development into the merits of coordinating the development of the total Alkimos/Eglinton area under a single planning mechanism; such proposal including a single comprehensive amendment to the Metropolitan Region Scheme

- 1 investigates with the Department of Planning and Urban Development the merits of co-ordinating the development of the total Alkimos/Eglinton area under a single planning mechanism with this including a single comprehensive amendment to the Metropolitan Region Scheme;
- 2 informs Northern Corridor Developments that:
 - (a) it confirms its resolution of 26 February 1992 (Item G2D214 refers) that it will defer requesting the North West District Planning Committee to request the State Planning Commission to amend the Metropolitan Region Scheme to rezone Lot 3 Swan Location 1370 Romee Road, Alkimos from "Rural" to "Urban" and Important Regional Road Reserves pending the land requirements for the proposed Important Regional Road Reserves of Marmion Avenue, Connolly Drive and Romeo Road being determined and then ceded free of cost to the Crown;
 - (b) in light of Landcorp's intention to seek Metropolitan
 Regional Scheme Rezoning of Lot 102 in the near future, it
 defers initiating a single Metropolitan Regional Scheme
 Amendment for Lot 3 Romeo Road, Alkimos in favour of one
 overall Metropolitan Region Scheme Amendment which
 encompasses all landowners within the Alkimos/Eglinton
 Region;

writes to Landcorp (Lot 102, Lot 6), Ocean Dunes Estate (Lot 9), the Water Authority of Western Australia (Lot 101), and N B and B T Kakulas (Lot M1482) informing them of (a) above, and seeking their views on this matter.

G20423 MINISTER FOR PLANNING'S REQUEST TO MODIFY AMENDMENT NO 443, LOTS 2 & 3 WANNEROO ROAD, LANDSDALE - [790-443]

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT G20423

The Hon Minister for Planning has withheld final approval of Amendment No 443 until certain modifications are effected.

The amendment seeks to rezone Lots 2 and 3 Wanneroo Road, Landsdale from "Rural" to "Commercial, Hotel, Service Station and Service Industrial".

The modifications proposed relate to the ultimate retail floor space and staging of the development and are acceptable to the applicant, Debkot Pty Ltd, who now seek Council support to finalise the amendment.

RECOMMENDATION

 - the zoning for the land would be commercial and the applicants would be able to construct the centre on the land provided that demolition occurs after 25 years or at a date determined after that time?
 - if within that 25 year period the Main Roads Department decides that the land is no longer required it then would revert back to the shopping centre owners;
 - the City would endeavour to replace the "lost" commercial land by extending the zone to the east of the present site;

- 4 subject to 3 above authorises affixation of the Common Seal to the amending documents and forwards the modified Amendment No 443 to the Hon Minister for final approval.

One submission has been received from the applicants, Feilman Planning Consultants, seeking Council's consideration to a number of minor design modifications to the Development Guide Plan. A copy of the existing and modified Development Guide Plans are attached for Council's information. (See Attachment No 1).

The proposed modifications can be summarised as follows:

 Changes to the road layout in the south-eastern portion of the application area. The applicant argues that this will:

WILL

 reduce the number of vehicles reliant on the main internal road and will decrease the potential for conflict and congestion at the existing single entry point to Edlinton Avenue;

(b) improve the amenity of the residential cell located between the l4th golf course hole and Eglinton Avenue by downgrading the significance of the existing link road.

- 2. The inclusion of a 6500m² R20 housing site adjacent to the southern boundary of the 5th golf course hole. It is argued that this housing site was deleted in the past following the developer's concern that the site, when developed, may detract from the visual amenity of the resort for those entering from the north along Pipidinny Road. Following further site assessment and the decision to definitely retain R40 residential development on the northern boundary of the 4th and 5th golf course holes, the developer's previous concern is no longer applicable and the R20 residential site has been reinstated.
- 3. An eastward extension of the R40 housing site located adjacent to the Marina Harbour. The subject land is still intended as a landscape buffer separating the housing site and a public/private carpark. The applicants argue that this modification will provide formal definition of the future use of the land and clearly allocate responsibility for the land's development and maintenance.

The applicants have verbally advised that they also seek inclusion of this land within the Marina Development Zone.

The following comments are made in relation to these modifications.

 No objection is raised to the modifications described in Points 1 and 2 of the above. It should, however be noted that the changes to the road layout in the south-east portion of the site will result in a minor modification to the amendment boundary. The additional land required is also in the ownership of Ocean Dunes Pty Ltd. 2. Regarding the modification requested under Point 3 above, the land the subject of the eastward expansion of the R40 housing site has recently been Reserved for Parks and Recreation under the Metropolitan Region Scheme. It is now therefore automatically reserved for that purpose under Scheme No 1 as well. This is considered to be an appropriate mechanism for the future protection of this land and clearly conveys the land's intended use as a landscape buffer. The Development Guide Plan for the Marina Precinct also clearly shows the future use of this land. Attachment No 2). The proposed lease agreement, currently being prepared for the project area, will clearly place the responsibility for development and maintenance of this land on the developer. It is therefore not considered appropriate to alter the present boundary of this Reserve or the R40 housing site. In any event, Council cannot include this land in the Marina Development Zone in the absence of any amendment to the Metropolitan Region

RECOMMENDATION: THAT Council:

The grounds for the request were abusive language, fighting, drinking, vandalism, theft and offensive behaviour.

The City Planner reports on the submissions received as a result of the statutory advertising and information obtained from Warwick Regional Police Office on attendance of police officers at disturbances at this locality.

He concludes that the closure cannot be supported on planning grounds as the actions of persons misusing the accessway should not deprive other members of the community of the benefits of its use.

- (d) the submission of an annual updated site contour plan and rehabilitation report;
- (e) no site operations, including vehicles, plant and machinery outside the following hours:

Monday to Friday - 7.00am to 6.00pm Saturday - 7.00am to 3.30pm;

- (f) the landowner entering into an agreement with the City of Wanneroo, under Section 85 of the Road Traffic Act, to pay the City of Wanneroo a contribution for extraordinary expenses for repairing and maintaining roads under its control in the neighbourhood of the proposed excavation;
- subject to (vi) above, approves an Extractive Industry (a) Licence for Mr Salamone on Location 1441 Driver Road, Landsdale with the following conditions:

 - (i) annual fee \$300,(ii) period of licence one year,
 - (iii) rehabilitation bond \$20,000;

2 advises the applicant that:

- (a) land fill activities must not proceed over the regional road alignment as shown in the North West Corridor Structure Plan;
- (b) Council will prohibit future general building activity on Loc 1441 Driver Road, Landsdale and this will be reflected in any decision made in respect to the future subdivision/rezoning applications;
- Council may consider future landfill areas suitable for (c) general building activity if filled in accordance with the Management Plan dated December 1991 (amended as provided in Report G20439) and certified as suitable by a practising consulting engineer to the satisfaction of the City Engineer and the City Building Surveyor.

BEAUMARIS SHOPPING CENTRE, OCEAN REEF - [770-22, 510-2237]

The City Planner advised that a development approval had now been received for the Beaumaris Shopping Centre on Constellation Drive, Ocean Reef which complied with Council's requirements and subject to the legal agreement between the applicants and Council being finalised, the development application will be issued with Council's standard conditions.

PETITION - EASTERN PERIMETER ARTERIAL ROAD ACTION GROUP - [727-7]

The City Planner advised that his staff had analysed the submissions handed to the Mayor after the March on Saturday 4 April 1992 by the Eastern Perimeter Arterial Road Action Group and it was interesting to note that only some 4% of the petitions from within the future urban areas opposed urbanisation and that the majority of opposition (approximately 40.9%) came from the special rural zone areas which were not being urbanised.

CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

The Minutes of the Technical Services Committee Meeting held on 16 March 1992, were confirmed as a true and correct record.

PETITIONS AND DEPUTATIONS

Cr Smith tabled a 286-signature petition in support of the building of the toilet block on Chichester Reserve as presently located and calling on the Council to resume construction immediately.

DEPUTATION - FAMILY GOLF COURSE, FLYNN DRIVE, WANNEROO

Mr Murray Dawson, Mr Bill Hornsby and Mr Mike Greatrex of Mair & Co addressed the Committee in relation to a proposed "Family Golf Course", Flynn Drive, Wanneroo.

Mr Hornsby advised that since submitting the original plans to Council, modifications have been made and approvals have been received from Department of Planning and Urban Development and the Environmental Protection Authority and a water licence obtained from Water Authority of Western Australia.

He stated the complex would contain two courses of 9 holes, one a 3 par family course and the other a conventional 3 & 4 par course, a practice driving range, 18 hole putt putt course, practice putting greens, clubhouse and barbecue areas, swimming pool, child minding creche, administration facilities, pro shop and family restaurant.

Mr Hornsby explained the area has been designed to utilise natural vegetation, it is set on 20.25 ha of land and all native trees and plants will be retained where possible.

Mr Dawson described the watering needs of the course. He said that if adequate control was maintained, watering could be kept to a minimum.

Mr Dawson said the design was comparable to Marangaroo Golf Course and he believed the course would be a highly profitable enterprise.

Mr Greatrex stated there was a need for this type of golf course in the area. The proposed "Family Golf Course" is designed to suit amateurs as well as veteran players. He said that family golf seeks to provide smaller golf courses at an affordable cost to suit a majority of people.

Following questions from Councillors, the Chairman thanked the deputation for addressing the Committee.

DEPUTATION - ILLUMINATED STREET NAME SIGN PROGRAMME

Ms Stacey Grace from Stacey Grace Consultancy addressed the Committee in relation to the Illuminated Street Sign Programme.

Ms Grace stated that as the City of Wanneroo was such a large and fast growing area the use of illuminated streets signs would be ideal. She said that with the ever changing road systems and industrial expansion there would be many benefits, for example improving the flow of traffic and drawing in business, especially for people unfamiliar with the area. Another advantage is the signs are easily identified, particularly at night.

Ms Grace advised that results of market research showed an overwhelming support for the programme both from professional people and the community.

She said that the signs are erected at no cost to Council and rented out to sponsors on an agreed, conditional basis. She said the programme had been successfully introduced to many Councils throughout Australia and had received an Australian Design Award.

Following questions from Councillors, the Chairman thanked Ms Grace for addressing the Committee and advised that the matter would be considered later in the meeting - Item Gl0409 refers.

DEPUTATION - SORRENTO SURF LIFESAVING CLUB

Mr Ken Jenner and Mr Terry Foreman from Sorrento Surf Lifesaving Club addressed the meeting in relation to redevelopment of the club - Item Gl0433 refers.

Residents of Queensway Road, Landsdale have petitioned Council requesting that this street be kerbed and a cycleway constructed along the southern verge to the school.

The City Engineer advises that Queensway Road has been constructed as a rural 6 metre wide pavement and serves 12 rural lots and access to the Northern Suburbs Seventh Day Adventist Primary School.

He details future development for Landsdale which indicates that Queensway Road will be extended to provide the main access from Alexander Drive to the proposed subdivision and suggests that negotiations for the upgrading be undertaken with the adjoining developer as part of the development of this area.

MOVED Cr Carstairs, SECONDED Cr Nosow that Council defers the upgrading of Queensway Road pending the subdivisional development of the North Whitfords Estate in Landsdale.CARRIED

G10412 UPGRADING - KAROBORUP ROAD, NOWERGUP - [510-466]

CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT G10412

Council allocated funds of \$230,000 in the 1989/90 Budget for the continuation of the upgrading of Karoborup Road north towards Carabooda Road. However, the proposed upgrading between Greenlees Way and Carabooda Road has indicated the need for land resumption for geometric curve improvements.

The City Engineer gives details of the corner truncations required for minor standard road upgrading and these have been agreed to with the affected landowners.

With regard to the provision of stormwater storage and facilities for the road runoff, the use of easements with a pipe system to be constructed through properties to discharge onto the wetland area of Carabooda Lake is generally supported by the residents.

The City Engineer advises that an environmental impact study has been commissioned with consultants to determine the most appropriate strategy for the stormwater discharge for Karoborup Road.

What is said by members of a local Council at meetings of the Council or any of its committees is spoken on a privileged occasion. The reason for the privilege is that those who represent the local government electors should be able to speak freely and frankly, boldly and bluntly, on any matter which they believe affects the interests or welfare of the inhabitants. They may be swayed by strong political prejudice, they may be obstinate and pig-headed, stupid and obtuse; but they were chosen by the electors to speak their minds on matters of local concern and as long as they do so honestly, they run no risk of liability for defamation of those who are the subjects of their criticism:
