OUESTIONS OF WHICH DUE NOTICE HAS BEEN GIVEN, WITHOUT DISCUSSION

Cr Marwick had given the Town Clerk notice of the following questions:

- Q1 Can the Town Clerk advise Council whether the Kingsley
 Woodvale Recreation Association passed any motions at its
 February meeting regarding the re-siting of facilities on
 Chichester Reserve?
- Al The Kingsley Woodvale Recreation <u>Association</u> did not pass any motions in relation to the re-siting of facilities on Chichester Reserve at its meeting on 10 February 1992. However, immediately prior to that meeting, a meeting of the Kingsley Woodvale Recreation <u>Management Committee</u> discussed the matter in General Business. The Minutes of that meeting provide the following record:
 - "1 Location of Toilet/Changeroom at CHICHESTER PARK
 - 1.1 The area pegged is not where this committee advised the Council it should be.
 - 1.2 We were not advised of any alteration to the location in writing.
 - 1.3 The anticipated cost is likely to be higher at the location pegged out as against the preferred site suggested by this committee.

1.4 That Wanneroo City Council immediately review the position and relocate the proposed facility to the site agreed to by this committee in writing.

- Q2 Can the Town Clerk advise Council if any written recommendation was forwarded to Council following the February on site meeting by representatives of the Association and Council officers?

- Q3 If so, will the Town Clerk seek to obtain a copy of the minutes and or recommendations so that Council can consider them in conjunction with item: Notice of Motion - Cr Moloney, on page 119 of the May 1992 Council agenda?
- A3 Answered in response to Questions 1 and 2.

The Town Clerk advised that five further questions have been raised by Cr Marwick, however with the exception of part of question 3, those questions cannot be answered from records held by the City of Wanneroo. Accordingly, information shall be sought from the Greenwood Kingsley Warwick Woodvale Citizens' Association to facilitate a response. It is hoped that the information will be received from the Association in sufficient time to permit a response to Cr Marwick's questions at the meeting of Council to be held on 24 June 1992.

The questions put by Cr Marwick are as follows:

"In view of the reference to the attendance of Mrs Cheryl Edwardes, of the Woodvale Ratepayers Association, at the on site meeting of February 13, at Chichester Reserve, to discuss the location of the toilet/olubrooms/carparking facilities, presented by the City Engineer, in the additional information to Item Glo206, at the February 17 Technical Services Committee meeting, can the Town Clerk please respond to the following questions:

- Q1 What is the Woodvale Ratepayers Association and how often does it meet?
- O2 How many registered members does it have in Woodvale?
- Q3 Who is the current president/chairman and who are current serving committee members of the Association?
- Q4 Did Mrs Cheryl Edwardes report back to the Woodvale Ratepayers Association re the preferred site for the toilet, clubrooms and parking facilities following her attendance at the February Chichester Reserve on site meeting?

- Q5 Did the Woodvale Residents Association meet to discuss the preferred site for the toilet, clubrooms and parking facilities at Chichester Reserve?
- Q6 If so, will the Town Clerk seek to obtain and table the minutes of the Woodvale Residents Association meeting so that its resolutions or recommendations on the preferred site for the Chichester Reserve facilities may be considered in conjunction with Item: Notice of Motion - Cr Moloney, on page 119 of the May 27, 1992 Council agenda?

In response to part of question 3, I advise that Mrs Cheryl Edwardes is listed in the current Information Directory as the contact person for the Greenwood Kingsley Warwick Woodvale Citizens' Association.

QUESTIONS OF WHICH NOTICE HAS NOT BEEN GIVEN, WITHOUT DISCUSSION

Cr Dammers asked the following questions:

- Q1 Is it true you and other Wanneroo Councillors met on Monday, May 4 to finally decide who would be the Mayor of the City of Wanneroo for the Council year 1992/93?
- Q2 Did the Councillors attending number seven or more and was it an absolute majority of Councillors?
- Q3 What are the names of the Councillors who attended this meeting to decide the Mayor of the City of Wanneroo?
- Q4 Did this Monday, May 4 Meeting take place in the Woodvale home of your Liberal Party Colleague Colin Edwardes and Cheryl Edwardes?
- Q5 Is it true that on Sunday, May 3 you and other Councillors met at Cr Alan Carstairs and Shirley Carstairs home in Wanneroo?
- Q6 What other Council decision did you and your Wanneroo Council faction colleagues make on Monday, May 4, on behalf of the City of Wanneroo Community?
- Q7 Is it true that as a result of the Monday meeting an arrangement was reached that you Councillor Johnson will be the Mayor until you step down to contest the seat of Whitfords for the Liberal Party?
- Q8 Is it true that Cr Freame is being considered by you and those other Councillors to replace you as Mayor when you stand down?
- Q9 Was choosing a Mayor at your Liberal Party Colleage's home on Monday, 4 May wise and in the best interest of the City of Wanneroo community?
- Q10 Does your majority of Council faction really consider Cr Waters a superior candidate than Cr Carstairs for the job as Deputy Mayor?

Cr Johnson took the questions on notice.

- Cr Rundle asked the following questions to Cr Smith
- Q1 Is it true that Councillor Smith has issued a letter of approval of any sort to Mr Koh owner of a block of land known as Lot 322 Courageous Place, Ocean Reef, approving the filling of the land on the site, if so in what capacity did Cr Smith give this or any other approval he may have conveved?
- Al What amuses me about Cr Rundle is that she has so much interest in my personal life. One would have thought she could have sought this information from professional staff as to whether there was any approval done. So I really don't know where she has got the information from whatsoever, but I will seek the Building Department Head as to the situation on Lot 322, Mr Fischer?
- Q2 I asked Cr Smith the question did he send a letter of approval not did the Council send a letter of approval?
- A2 I don't own the block so I don't consider that I would write a letter to Council requesting approval, so in answer no, but I do ask the Building Head of Department regarding the situation on that particular block so that what Cr Rundle is alluding to is some sort of suspicion concerning my action.

The City Building Surveyor answered:

- Mr Mayor in relation to Lot 322 there was an application for a retaining wall which exceeded one metre in height. Accordingly we sought from the applicant the adjoining owner's approval for the retaining wall and a facsimile was received giving approval and it is not signed by Cr Smith.
- Cr Rundle asked the following questions to the Town Clerk:
- Q1 Can the Town Clerk explain why a letter sent from a Mrs Oude-Meilink on 30 April this year marked urgent requesting that the letter be distributed to all Councillors still had not been distributed to Councillors approximately 16 days later until I requested its whereabouts within the Council?
- Al Through you Mr Mayor to Cr Rundle, yes I saw the letter, I initialled and sent it on its way, at that time I was under the impression that it had been circulated, it hadn't been, until you raised it. There was no other reason.
- Cr Smith asked the following question:
- Q1 Why did Cr Rundle wait until now to ask me that particular question when she was sitting with me, or standing very close to me in the Councillors' Dining Room? I just wonder why a certain Councillor wished to ask those rather unusual questions at Council.

Al Quite simply Mr Mayor, I was requested to enquire from a ratepayer in fact that lives in a block of land adjoining this particular block in question and I would ask Cr Smith a further question, does he know who the owner is of the adjoining block of land Lot 321 Courageous Place and what relationship does Cr Smith have to that block?

Cr Smith answered

A Mr Mayor I think it goes from sublime to the ridiculous and I don't think that is a proper question for me to discuss someone else's business, thank you.

Cr Marwick asked the following questions to Cr Waters:

Q1 Cr Waters do you consider that Wanneroo Ratepayer funds must be protected and put to appropriately authorised use when contributed to community organisations?

Q2 Do you recall at a Council Finance and Administrative Resources Committee making specific allegations on Wanneroo Tourism Council...

Mayor: Cr Marwick I think it is inappropriate to bring those sort of questions or statements regarding that particular item to this Council Chamber at the moment, that matter is under investigation, so I rule that question out of order.

Cr Marwick then asked the following questions:

Q3 As the matter is under investigation then, perhaps I could ask Cr Waters does she see it as a contradiction in terms that as Cr Waters made the allegations

Mayor: Cr Marwick I am sorry you are still on the same subject. I consider bringing that matter up at the moment in this Council Chamber is inappropriate because that subject is under investigation as you are fully aware.

Cr Marwick:

I certainly am, but I want to know...

Mayor: Yes Cr Marwick, you wait until the investigation is completed.

Cr Marwick:

I accept the ruling.

Cr Dammers asked the Mayor the following question:

Q Are you then not going to discuss with the Tourism Council the refunding because I believe you are going to have a meeting with them in the next few days, is it OK for you to negotiate with the Tourism Council while it is under investigation?

Mayor:

Cr Dammers, the question is in relation to something that was said, as you are fully aware, at the Finance Committee of last month or the month before or whenever it was, the meeting with the Tourism Council has.

Cr Dammers:

I wasn't there.

Mayor:

Well then I suggest you get up to date with your facts, you are pretty well up to date with everything else by the sounds of it, or at least your imagination is, so I would suggest that you perhaps extend your imagination a bit more and find out about relevant matters, OK, but I am not prepared to have questions in relation to what is under investigation at the moment brought into this Council Chamber tonight.

ANNOUNCEMENTS BY THE MAYOR, WITHOUT DISCUSSION

VISIT BY PREMIER, DR CARMEN LAWRENCE - JOONDALUP CITY CENTRE

Last week the Premier of Western Australia, Dr Carmen Lawrence, made a visit to Joondalup and the Council's Administration Centre to make a major funding announcement in regard to the Joondalup City Centre.

Dr Lawrence said her government would provide a total of \$36 million for sporting, civic, cultural and environmental facilities in the Joondalup City Centre over the next five years.

The Premier said that part of the \$36 million package would include the transfer of 1.5 hectares of land (valued at \$6 million) to Council for civic, cultural and some commercial development.

Plans for the Joondalup Regional Sports Complex went on display earlier this month on the ground floor of Council's Administration Building.

CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT G40501

In December 1991, (Item F41201 refers) Council resolved to instigate legal proceedings against Coles Myer Ltd under the provisions of the Health Act as a result of a complaint of glass fragments being found in 125 gram packet of Heinz Rice Cereal sold by Coles Supermarket. Girrawheen.

The City Environmental Health Manager reports on advice now received from Council's Solicitors Kott Gunning suggesting that the prosecution be brought against H J Heinz Company Australia Limited direct.

This will require a rescission of the resolution authorising legal advice against one party and a change to a second party.

The City Environmental Health Manager suggests that future reports to Council include in the recommendation that legal proceedings be instigated against Party A or Party B to allow flexibility in subsequent legal bargaining by Council's Solicitors.

Fourteen samples consisting of strawberries and celery were submitted by this authority and the results demonstrated that City of Wanneroo growers have a responsible approach to the application of pesticides.

The Manneroo Community Arts Council has received legal opinion regarding the assets of the organisation which advises that the City receives the assets in the capacity of a trustee for the stated purpose, being the Arts.

The City has received from the City has received from the Lotteries Commission for the Multicultural Child Care Play Equipment Project. Community artists will be working with children and staff to create play equipment with the emphasis on multiculturalism.

April school holidays boosted attendances at Aquamotion and there was a high percentage of re-enrolments for Term 2 "Learn to Swim" programme.

Wanneroo Water World will host a special Aerobic Master Class on Wednesday 13 May and has been chosen as one of the venues by the organisation "Network for Fitness Professionals".

The 20 metre Inflatable Monster has been available every day of the school holidays and will be travelling south next month to the Shire of Swan and then Donnybrook.

"Learn to Swim" enrolments once again proved very popular with vacant places at a premium.

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT G20504

M and S Tran on behalf of Tey Chye Soon, seeks Council approval to operate a vegetable wholesaling business from a unit within a showroom complex at Lot 225 (1) Irwin Road, Wangara.

The City Planner reports that the subject development was originally constructed as showrooms with rather small individual units fronting onto a large carparking area.

The land is affected by Amendment No 551 to Town Planning Scheme No 1 which intends rezoning the site from 'Light Industrial' to 'Mixed Business'. Existing businesses within the complex and those intended once Amendment No 551 is completed, are along the lines of showrom and offices. The proposed business clearly does not comply with the intended use of the premises.

Further the subject unit has a total floorspace of only 109m^2 . Under normal circumstances a vegetable wholesaler would require a much larger area from which to operate. The size of the premises is likely to lead to external storage (ie in carparking space) and this is not recommended.

Hames Sharley, on behalf of National Mutual, seeks Council approval for the extension of Whitford City Shopping Centre to accommodate a discount department store, further speciality shops and a six theatre cinema complex. The proposal would increase the size of the centre from 33160m² to 46230m² GLA.

- 2 incorporates into the Legal Agreement between the City of Wanneron and the registered proprietor of the subject land (and Elders Finance Limited if the registered proprietor is Debkot Pty Ltd) the requirements outlined as follows:
 - the applicants ceding the necessary land for the intersection expansion in fee simple to the City and in return the City leasing back the land for a minimum 25 years at a fee of \$1 per year to the applicants for the shopping centre development;
 - the zoning for the land would be commercial and the applicants would be able to construct the centre on the land provided that demolition occurs after 25 years or at a date determined after that time;
 - if within that 25 year period the Main Roads Department decides that the land is no longer required it then would revert back to the shopping centre owners;
 - the City would endeavour to replace the "lost" commercial land by extending the zone to the east of the present site;

The City Planner gives details on the Gnangara Mound Crown Land Statement of Planning Policy and reports that the Policy was gazetted on 20 March 1992.

The main provisions of the Policy state that land within the policy area may be used for:

native vegetation protection;

- the protection and creation of wetland habitats;
- silviculture subject to the Ministerial conditions established under Part IV of the Environmental Protection Act;
- groundwater abstraction for public water supply (subject to Ministerial conditions established under Part IV of the Environmental Protection Act);
- in Yanchep National Park, management, development and use in accordance with the objections of this policy and the approved Department of CALM Yanchep National Park Management Plan;
- in Whiteman Park, management, development and use in accordance with the objectives of this policy and the approved DPUD Whiteman Park Development Strategy;
- other uses will be considered having regard to the objectives of this policy, the degree of net public benefit likely to result, and the provisions of any current Environmental Protection Policy relating to the area.

MOVED Cr Major, SECONDED Cr Nosow that CITY PLANNER'S REPORT G20534 be received.

G20535 TWO HOUSES ON ONE LOT POLICY - [702-1]

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT G20535

At its meeting in April (Item G20421 refers), Council resolved to amend its Two Houses on One Lot Policy in order to clarify the development of additional accommodation (eg, granny flats) and the erection of second dwellings on lots between one and two hectares in size.

The City Planner reports that since the release of the final North West Corridor Structure Plan, an application for a second dwelling on a lot identified for future industrial development raised the need to further clarify Council's policy in relation to land earmarked future industrial and land that is to remain rural.

He advised that there is also a need to clarify Part 2 of Council's policy relating to the caveat against the title of the land to prevent subdivision as it should only apply to land that is identified as remaining rural.

MOVED Cr Major, SECONDED Cr Nosow that Council:

rescinds its Two Houses on One Lot Policy adopted by Resolution G20421 on 29 April 1992 and adopts the following amended Policy:

"TWO DWELLINGS ON ONE LOT POLICY

(a) Council may support the development of a second dwelling on any lot within the municipality if:

- (i) In the case of a "Rural" zoned lot not identified as future urban under the North West Corridor Structure Plan, the lot is at least the minimum lot size as shown on Two Houses on One Lot plan (ie ranging from 2 ha to 8 ha);
- (ii) In the case of lots zoned 'Residential', 'Residential Development' or areas identified as future urban under the North West Corridor Structure Plan, the proposed location of the dwelling is in accordance with an overall structure plan where one has been approved or as determined by the City Planner;
- (iii) The desirable criteria outlined by the Environmental Protection Authority and the Water Authority of Western Australia are met;
- (b) The following standard requirement shall be met before a Building Licence is issued for a second dwelling on a lot in the Rural Zone that is not proposed for future urban development under the North West Corridor Structure Plan:

The owner enters into a deed prepared by the Council's solicitors at the owner's expense to provide that the owner will not seek subdivision of the lot. To ensure that this obligation passes onto all subsequent owners, the deed is also to enable the Council to lodge an absolute caveat against the title of the land to preclude the owner from assigning the land to another person unless that person enters into a similar deed with the City. The caveat is not to be removed unless the Council amends its Policy or rezones the area;

- (c) Second dwellings will not be permitted on any lots:
 - (i) zoned Rural and less than 2 hectares in area;
 - (ii) zoned "Special Rural" or "Special Residential";
 - (iii) zoned Rural and identified as future industrial under the North West Corridor Structure Plan;
- (d) On lots less than 2 hectares in area and/or zoned "Special Rural" or "Special Residential" Council may permit the development of additional accommodation only provided it takes the form of an extension to the existing dwelling and shall have permanent direct access between the main dwelling and the additional accommodation;
- (e) Where a second dwelling does not comply with this policy and where the existing building is to be occupied during and construction of a new dwelling on a single lot, a legal agreement is to be drawn up.

at the owner's expense and entered into, requiring the owner to demolish the existing dwelling or make it uninhabitable to the satisfaction of the City Building Surveyor upon completion of construction of the second dwelling;

- (f) No more than 2 dwellings may be permitted on a lot other than in accordance with the R Codes;
- (g) Any historically significant homes are to be assessed by Council and/or the Wanneroo Historical Society and/or the National Trust for possible retention or preservation";
- 2 delegates authority to the City Planner to grant approval to applications for two dwellings on one lot which comply

with Council's adopted policy. CARRIED

G20536 CORNER STORES IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS - [790-613780]

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT G20536

In response to three applications, accompanied by strong arguments, for the establishment of corner stores in the City's residential areas, the City Planner examines the implications of such a proposal and suggests an appropriate use definition for inclusion in Council's Town Planning Scheme No 1.

GARDEN SHEDS NOT EXCEEDING 10m2 IN AREA AND PERGOLAS

- A Garden sheds not exceeding 10m^2 in area and pergolas may be constructed up to a secondary street boundary, a public accessway boundary or an entry lane to a battleaxe lot boundary.
- B A pergola may be constructed 500 from the boundary of an adjoining property.

G20544 CITY OF WANNEROO: UNEXPLODED ORDNANCE - [304-2-1]

The following extract from Current House Hansard, titled "City of Wanneroo: Unexploded Ordnance" was tabled by Cr Marwick:

"Mr Filing (Moore) (10.39 pm), I rise this evening further to comments I made in the adjournment debate on Monday evening. The problem of an unexploded ordnance and the responsibility of the Federal Government for the detection and removal of UXOs is a matter of great concern to the residents in the City of Wanneroo, an area within my electorate which is the second fastest growing municipality in Australia.

Within Wanneroo there are areas in which, during the Second World War and after, military exercises were conducted and bombs, shells and other ordnane were fired or dropped on land where housing development has already taken place, development is under way or is proposed to service the ever-increasing demands in a region of tremendous growth. In particular, six areas have been identified by the Department of Defence as affected by the likely presence of unexploded ordnance, or UXOs.

These are: Mullaloo Point, an area 15 kilometres north of Perth, where suspected aerial bombing and gunnery target exercises were conducted between 1941 and 1942; Quinns Rock to Mullaloo, a five kilometre coastal strip, where armoured, artillery and mortar firing took place during the Second World War and during the 1940's; Burns Beach, where an Army firepower demonstration occurred on 14 September 1943; Eglinton, five kilometres south-south west of Yanchep, where suspected artillery, mortar and air-to-ground gunnery was conducted in World War II; Wreck Point in the Two Rocks area, which the US Navy used as a range during 1942 and where two civilian fishermen were killed within the range boundaries on 3 January 1943; and the region between Moore River and Yanchep and 15 kilometres inland, which was used for aerial bombing, naval bombardment and artillery firing during World War II and up to 1974. The above areas have been identified as presenting a UXO problem as a result

The above areas have been identified as presenting a UXO problem as a result of lengthy discussions between the City of Wanneroo and the Department of Defence from the 1980's to 28 February this year, when a letter from the Director-General, Logistics Policy, Department of Defence, summarised all the affected areas to the City of Wanneroo in response to Council's inquiries.

The area of Mullaloo Point, first mentioned in the letter, was a revelation to the Council and presented a more complex problem as housing development had already taken place. A further letter from the Department on 23 April stated that it was considered that developments could proceed without specific searching. This was also the case, according to the letter, with the Burns Beach area. However, the area between Quinns Rock was mentioned by the Department as being possibly affected, based on uncorroborated anecdotal sources. It was considered that the sources may have

referred only to Burns Beach, and it was stated that the risk of continuing contamination in the area was low and development could proceed without specific searching.

The Eglinton Range area appeared to have been used during Morld War II for the legling and program and artillery. WA UNO services have surveyed the area and recommended that portions be subjected to 100 per cent searching. Golf Resorts International, the developer of the 100 per cent searching. Golf assistance towards the cost of searches and clearance, which are under way, but to date has been unsuccessful in againing financial help.

In the Two Rocks area, as a result of State Emergency Service research, the SES recommended that no further subdivision take place without a search for UXO being conducted. In discussions between the Department and the City of Wanneroo, the Department advised that the Commonwealth Government is generally under no legal obligation to commit resources to reduce hazards associated with the presence of UXOs. According to the Department, it is considered that persons benefiting from the use or development of UXO-affected land would bear the cost of reducing UXO hazards. Furthermore, in planning to reduce UXO-related hazards, the Department's ability of assist could depend on the availability of resources to be committed. In the event that the Council elects to proceed with development proposals, the Commonwealth Government would deny any liability that may arise as a consequence of the presence of

The Commonwealth policy for the management of land affected by the presence of UXOs, finalised on 7 March 1991, breaks down land affected into three categories. The first is land occupied by the Commonwealth: the second is land in which the Commonwealth has divested a legal interest in the land; the third is land wherein the Commonwealth has never had, or has disposed of, its legal interest. It is the third category which appears to relate to the case of the Yanchep/Two Rocks area. The Commonwealth's position in this case will be influenced by the nature of the situation. An SES study of that area was presented to the Council in September 1991. That study proved beyond doubt that the area is polluted with UXO. The extent to which that is so cannot be stated precisely.

I believe it is the Commonwealth's responsibility to assist financially towards the cost of identification and clearance of unexploded ordnance within the City of Wanneroo area. It is an area of great importance to the development of the Perth metropolitan area, and it is a matter of great concern to the many thousands of residents who so far the Government has not undertaken to assist financially, other than a \$50,000 preliminary exercise towards the cost of identifying and clearing UXOs within the City of Wanneroo'.

The Western Australian Balloon and Airship Club Inc has written seeking approval to conduct a hot air balloon flight in conjunction with WA Week on 6 and 7 June 1992.

Launch will be at sunrise and the following sites are requested:

Kingsway Reserve Hockey and Cricket oval and Cabrini Reserve, Marangaroo

This event is sanctioned by the WA Week Committee and is centred on balloons landing at Whiteman Park on the above days. Various sites are required within a radius of Whiteman Park to accommodate the wind direction at event launch time.

Events of this nature are unique to Wanneroo and the following information pertinent to Council making a decision, is relevant:

- Department of Civil Aviation has approved the event.
- All balloons are licensed aircraft and all pilots possess the authority to fly in accordance with Civil Aviation rules and regulations.
- 3 Airway clearance has been arranged to a height of 1000 feet.
- 4 Public liability insurance is held by each pilot.
- 5 There is burner noise associated with take-off preparation and, at various times, in flight.
- Reserve usage will necessitate a commitment to indemnify Council against any sprinkler and other damage to the asset.

Furthermore, I have some doubt about using Cabrini Reserve owing to its proximity to retirement villages. The activity may disturb residents.

The City Parks Manager recommends John Moloney Park at Highclere Boulevard/Woodward Circle, Marangaroo as the preferable alternative.

The securement of bond monies is not deemed necessary.

- I recommend you seek Council endorsement subject to the club complying with the following requirements:
- Written endorsement from the Department of Civil Aviation.
- 2 Indemnifying Council against any damage to the reserve including reticulation equipment and car parking.
- 3 John Moloney Park be offered as an alternative to Cabrini Reserve. Residents adjacent to the perimeter of this reserve be acquainted with the proposal through a letter drop organised by the applicant.
