Today, with the help of a Council van and part-time staff member, more than 280 people are visited by the Books on Wheels service.

OCEAN RIDGE COMMUNITY CENTRE - 10TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

Council's Ocean Ridge Community Centre celebrated its 10th Anniversary earlier this month.

The Centre, which has served the sporting, cultural and passive recreational needs of the community, celebrated 10 years of service with an open day.

WANNEROO VOLUNTEER BUSHFIRE BRIGADE - BUSHFIRE CONTROL UNIT

Late last month Council presented the Wanneroo Volunteer Bushfire Brigade with a Bushfire Control Unit.

The Fire Control Unit was fitted out with modern bushfire fighting equipment, which was purchased by Council and the Lotteries Commission of Western Australia.

CRAIGIE LEISURE CENTRE - OPENING

Earlier this month I had the pleasure of officially opening the new \$5 million Craigie Leisure Centre.

The Centre was designed by Council's Building Department and built in conjunction with a \$2 million assistance package from the State Government.

With good management, programming and a realistic usage charge, Council is confident that the Centre will, in a very short time, become self sufficient in its operation, while serving the recreational needs of a great number of people.

ORAL HISTORY PROGRAMME

Council's Library Department has embarked upon an oral history programme.

Once fully established, the Oral History Programme will concentrate on both contemporary and historical interviews, with a priority given to the City's ageing pioneers.

H50301 COUNCILLORS' REQUESTS FOR TRANSCRIPTS - [702-3]**TOWN CLERK'S REPORT H50301**

In July 1992 (Item G90731 refers) Council requested that a report be submitted to Policy and Resources Committee regarding the necessity for Councillors to provide a reasonable explanation when requesting transcripts.

The Town Clerk reports that Council's current policy "Access to Audiotape Recordings of Council Proceedings" provides that Councillors may listen to recordings of Council proceedings upon request, free of charge, and further that verbatim transcripts of Council proceedings shall only be made available to Councillors on the express resolution of Council. There exists no policy requirement for Councillors to provide a "reasonable" explanation when requesting transcripts.

He discusses the cases of Conway v Petronious Clothing Company Ltd (1978) 1WLR72 p.90 and Edman v Ross 22SR (NSW) 351 and advises that it must be accepted that elected members act with honesty and integrity in requesting and using information contained within transcripts of Council proceedings. As such it is considered neither necessary nor appropriate that members provide "reasonable" explanations when requesting transcripts.

He advises that Council's Advertising Signs Policy G3-02 provides insufficient guidance about when to (or not to) advertise proposals and it is suggested that it be deleted and included in an expanded Policy G3-02 entitled "Advertising of Planning Proposals Policy". In addition, the on-site sign specification in the Appendix to the Policy Manual requires modification to make it clear that plans may be inspected in the Council's Town Planning Department. This is necessary because people inspecting plans often want explanations which cannot be given, at least for the foreseeable future, by personnel in the Council's "One Stop Shop".

He illustrates the sign specifications, with the suggested modified wording in bold print.

MOVED Cr Freame, **SECONDED** Cr Rundle that Council:

- 1 deletes its present Advertising Signs Policy G3-02 and adopts the following policy as the procedure for advertising planning proposals.

"Advertising of Planning Proposals Policy - G3-02

The objective of this policy is to assist the City Planner to decide when applications for development are to be advertised and when reports are to be submitted for consideration by the Town Planning Committee without the proposal being advertised for public comment. The Council acknowledges that it is unnecessary to advertise all planning applications under Part 3 of Town Planning Scheme No 1.

In commercial, mixed business and industrial areas, applications may be reported without advertising unless the proposal is considered to go beyond what may reasonably be expected in the area concerned or is likely to be excessively obtrusive.

In residential and rural areas, applications may be reported without advertising when the proposal is contrary to Council policy and cannot be recommended on town planning grounds. If Council wishes to consider the application further, it will require an application to be advertised for public comment.

In the event that an appeal is lodged against the refusal by Council of an application that has not been advertised, public opinion shall be canvassed by the City Planner before a response is made on the appeal.

In addition to any other means of advertising under Clauses 3.11 and 3.16 of Town Planning Scheme No 1, the Council will require an on-site sign as required by Clause 3.10 of the Scheme to be erected in accordance with the specifications in the appendix to this Manual";

- 2 modifies the wording of its on-site advertising sign specification in the Appendix to the Policy Manual by the substitution of the words "Council's Town Planning Department" for the words "Council Offices";
- 3 includes the new Advertising of Planning Proposals Policy at G3-02 in its Policy Manual;

- 4 delegates responsibility for the implementation of the Advertising of Planning Proposals Policy to the City Planner.

CARRIED

H50308 MODIFICATION OF POLICY ON CLOSURE OF PEDESTRIAN ACCESSWAYS - [520-2]**CITY PLANNER'S REPORT H50308**

In July 1992 Council adopted a policy of charging applicants for the costs incurred by Council in processing applications for the closure of pedestrian accessways. That policy was incorporated into the Policy Manual as Item G3-09. It is considered appropriate to expand the policy by including provisions for the disposal and distribution of the land contained within accessways that become closed.

The City Planner reports on the Policy on Closure of Pedestrian Accessways. He advises on modifying the Policy to include a requirement to amalgamate all the land within closed accessways into one or more of the adjoining properties in a manner which as near as practicable follows the extension of the boundaries of those lots and avoids creating dislocated pockets or strips that have no utility to an adjoining property.

MOVED Cr Freame, **SECONDED** Cr Rundle that Council incorporates into its policy on accessway closures the requirement for all the land within closed accessways to be amalgamated into one or more of the adjoining properties in accordance with good and proper planning principles.

CARRIED**H50309 AMUSEMENT MACHINE POLICY - [702-1, 770-4]****CITY PLANNER'S REPORT H50309**

The City Planner refers to the Amusement Machine Policy and reports on a review of the Policy to more adequately address the location of modern amusement centres.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

That Council deletes its existing Amusement Machine Policy G3-03 and substitutes the following new policy and delegates authority to the City Planner to implement the Amusement Machine Policy and to approve applications for amusement centres which are consistent with the policy:

"AMUSEMENT MACHINE POLICY**1 OBJECTIVE**

The objective of this policy is to control the incidental provision of amusement machines by individual business owners at their premises and to guide Council in the exercise of its discretion when applications for specialised amusement centres are considered.

2 INTERPRETATIONS

"Amusement Machine" includes what are commonly known as 'pin-ball' machines, computers, simulators and other devices, boards or tables, operated by one or more players for amusement, games or recreation.

"Amusement Centre" means premises used predominantly for the purposes of public amusement on a commercial basis where the public pay to play with or operate amusement machines.

3 POLICY

3.1 Amusement Machines

The Council recognises that proprietors often install amusement machines as an incidental part of a variety of businesses. To accommodate this in an acceptable manner the Council requires:-

- (i) The amusement machines to be kept in a visible location within the premises at all times.
- (ii) The patrons must be adequately supervised by an adult at all times to ensure they do not cause noise or other nuisance in or near the premises.

3.2 Amusement Centres

Council also recognises the demand for amusement centres which it considers to be an acceptable use in shopping centres, taverns and hotels, the Joondalup City Centre, Light/Service Industrial areas or similar, provided there are adequate buffers to protect adjacent residential amenity and adequate access and parking is available. However it discourages amusement centres in linear commercial or industrial developments along major roads.

4 ADVERTISING

Council's policy for advertising planning proposals shall apply to applications for amusement centres."

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The Policy and Resources Committee inserted the words "taverns and hotels" in paragraph 3.2 of the proposed policy which deals

with amusement centres. This was not the intention, bearing in mind that the provision of amusement machines by hotel and tavern proprietors is adequately, and more appropriately, dealt with at paragraph 3.1 of the policy. The "variety of businesses" contemplated in paragraph 3.1 includes taverns, hotels, recreation centres delis, etc. Therefore the following new recommendation is submitted.

MOVED Cr Dammers, **SECONDED** Cr Marwick that Council deletes its existing Amusement Machine Policy G3-03, substitutes the following new policy, and delegates authority to the City Planner to implement the Amusement Machine Policy and to approve applications for amusement centres which are consistent with the policy:

1 OBJECTIVE

The objective of this policy is to control the incidental provision of amusement machines by individual business owners at their premises and to guide Council in the exercise of its discretion when applications for specialised amusement centres are considered.

The magistrate rejects Mr Phillips' submission on a technicality raised by Council's solicitors.

The 10th Anniversary of Ocean Ridge Community Centre will be celebrated on Saturday 3 April with an "Open Day". A wide range of activities and displays have been organised which will include the Mucky Duck Bush Band.

The City Recreation and Cultural Services Manager reports on the success of Leisure and "Learn to Swim" programmes at Warwick, Craigie, Wanneroo and Sorrento/Duncraig Leisure Centres and Aquamotion.

In 1991 the Committee broadened its membership base to allow up to eleven community representatives to join the group and the Committee's Terms of Reference was amended accordingly.

The City Recreation and Cultural Services Manager reports that the increased membership has become unwieldy and several resignations have been received.

He suggests that the number of community representatives be reduced to eight and this will require an amendment to the Committee's Terms of Reference.

Last month it was reported that the Caretaker at Gloucester Lodge Museum (Mr Brian Phipps) had submitted a medical certificate covering seven weeks sick leave.

Mr Phipps, who sustained a back injury in a traffic accident three years ago, has been informed that his complaint is being aggravated by the cleaning duties associated with his present position at the Museum. He has advised the City Recreation and Cultural Services Manager that he may have to submit his resignation at the expiration of the sick leave period.

The City Recreation and Cultural Services Manager reports on measures which have been taken to clean and open the museum until Mr Phipps' employment prospects are determined.

He suggests alternative arrangements for the future management of the museum should the caretaker's position become vacant.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

That, in the event of the Gloucester Lodge Museum caretaker's position becoming vacant, Council appoints two part time attendants to assist with the collection of admission charges and the sale of souvenirs.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The City Recreation & Cultural Services Manager's Report H40413 recommended that in the event of the Gloucester Lodge Museum caretaker's position becoming vacant, two part time attendants be appointed to assist Council with the collection of admission charges and the sale of souvenirs.

At its meeting on 5 April 1993, the Community Services Committee was advised that as the caretaker's wife was the present curator of the museum it could be assumed that her situation would have to be reviewed if Mr Phipps resigned and they vacated the premises.

On the following day the caretaker delivered his and his wife's resignations to the City Recreation & Cultural Services Manager's office. Mr Phipps will cease employment with the City of Wanneroo on 28 April 1993, when his sick leave expires. There was no resignation date on the letter received from Mrs Phipps so it is assumed that she wished to terminate her service on 6 April 1993. They also vacated the premises on that date.

On 7 April, the City Recreation & Cultural Services Manager attended the monthly meeting of the Gloucester Lodge Museum Management Committee to bring the members up to date with the developments.

He advised the Committee that he had prepared a report to the Community Services Committee recommending the appointment of two part time attendants at Gloucester Lodge Museum on a job share basis. This recommendation was made in view of the fact that an alarm system was now installed in the premises and the City Recreation & Cultural Services Manager did not believe a full time live in caretaker was a critical issue. He also reminded the Committee that there was a continual deterioration of the living quarters at the museum due to the problem of dampness entering the building fabric. Council was advised in October 1992 that the toilet and shower recess in the caretaker's flat needed upgrading and \$5,000 would be required to rectify these and other maintenance issues in this particular area.

Council resolved in November 1992 (Item G41115 refers) to assume a minimal maintenance regime at the museum in order that the structural amenity of the premises and general health standards are maintained.

The Gloucester Lodge Museum Management Committee is of the opinion that a live in cleaner/caretaker is necessary because the museum is in an isolated situation and no one would hear the alarm if it was activated through unauthorised entry.

Although the City Recreation & Cultural Services Manager has reservations concerning the appointment of another live in caretaker because of the adverse living conditions at the museum, he believes it would be appropriate for Council to receive a report outlining current costs of upgrading the caretaker's flat and other implications associated with this course of action.

Accordingly, he requests that it be recommended that Report H40413 be deferred and that a further report be provided to the Community Services Committee on the implications associated with the appointment of a live in cleaner/caretaker at the Gloucester Lodge Museum.

A community artist, Mr Malcolm King, was contracted to work closely with aerosol artists, schools and local residents in the painting of a series of murals on bus shelters and an underpass in the municipality.

The success of this programme was reported to Council in November 1992 and up to the present time the 4 bus shelters and underpasses muralised have not suffered graffiti damage.

Similar community mural arts programmes in Brisbane and Melbourne support the establishment of an ongoing community mural arts programme as a means of reducing graffiti vandalism.

The City Recreation and Cultural Services Manager presents the views of the Building and Engineering Departments and suggests that a community artist should be included in the task force if and when it is established.

The Wanneroo Community Arts Council was subsequently wound up in January 1992 in accordance with the articles of the Association.

The City Recreation and Cultural Services Manager provides details of plans to establish a Cultural Development Advisory Committee to establish a long term strategy to develop an Integrated Cultural Policy. WAMA and Community Arts Network will be assisting Council in the development of this policy.

The structure and terms of reference of the Cultural Development Advisory Committee will need to be endorsed by Council.

 - (c) within the 20 hectare policy area, flood secure areas and accessways should be naturally occurring as a result of natural topographic elevation but if a naturally occurring site does not exist, can also be created through the placement of clean filling material;
 - (d) within the 4 hectare policy area, flood secure areas and accessways must be naturally occurring as a result of natural topographic elevation;
 - (e) where natural flood secure areas and accessways can be identified, it is the subdividers'

responsibility to identify these areas on the plan of subdivision;

- (f) where filling is necessary to create flood secure areas and accessways, this will be the responsibility of the person subdividing the site to be done at the time of subdivision;
- (g) the placement of filling material to create a flood secure area and accessways constitutes development and therefore requires Council approval;

- 5 requests a further report on the revised Rural Subdivision Policy for Town Planning Committee's May 1993 meeting.

The City Planner reports on the background relating to the subject lot and gives details of the proposal.

In the assessment of the application, the City Planner addresses a number of concerns and advises that the application should be refused based on these concerns.

- 4 the proposed development introduces potentially polluting activities into this environmentally sensitive area, being both a Priority 1 Groundwater Source Area and Underground Water Pollution Control Area;
- 5 if approved, it will set an undesirable precedent for further non-rural development on rural land within this locality;
- 6 the activity is an inappropriate use within the Lake Pinjar basin.

H20418 STORAGE OF BUSES AND UNSIGHTLY APPEARANCE: LOT 2692 (952) PINJAR ROAD, PINJAR - [250/2692/952]

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT H20418

The City Planner reports on legal advice in regard to Council's resolution (Item H20333 refers) concerning the storage of buses and unsightly appearance of Lot 2692 (952) Pinjar Road, Pinjar.

Cr Davies asked the following question to the Town Clerk:

The resolution that we are being asked to rescind was passed by Council at its March Meeting, the Minutes of this Meeting have

been made public, when can a Council resolution be legally acted upon?

The Town Clerk gave the following answer:

The Council policy provides that no decision be acted upon until 3 o'clock on the Friday. However, having said that it is the responsibility of the Clerk, if he believes that a decision has been taken which is either illegal or has some legal problems that he ought to pursue, to ensure that the Council is not in any way placed in any predicament or that it acted illegally.

Ken Gifford, QC, who is known as an authority on Local Government law in Australia, writes in his book, "When a Council is exercising any of its statutory powers, the Council Clerk must be careful to ensure that the resolutions are in strict compliance with the power upon which they are based. The resolutions are within the powers of the Council and if it exceeds those powers it will be ultra virus." As you will recall Cr Davies I made the comment at the last Council meeting that I believed this decision was contrary to the zoning by-laws.

Immediately after the Council meeting I spoke to the City Planner, the City Planner had also expressed a similar view if you remember and asked me what to do. I said first thing in the morning we will check with the legal advisers of the Council to confirm or otherwise what I believed. Had I been wrong, I would have certainly acted on it, following 3 o'clock on the Friday. As you know the matter was referred to the Town Planning Committee with legal opinions which I think substantiated my concerns. I believe my action was strictly in accordance with the responsibility required of my position.

Cr Davies then asked:

Mr Clerk that is not what I am questioning. I think it is a bit misleading that the Minutes are released to the public. The public may believe that once the Minutes are released that they can be acted upon which doesn't seem to be the case. If they can't be acted upon until they have been accepted at the next Council meeting, should they not be released to the public until they have been accepted at the next full Council meeting as being correct.

The Town Clerk answered:

Mr Mayor through you to Cr Davies, it is generally held and again by Gifford and by other legal opinions, that a decision of Council, whether the affected person is in the gallery or not and hears the decision, is not binding until it is transmitted in the normal course of business to the applicant or the person involved. Even if the applicant, or the person involved acts on the decision despite it not being transmitted formally in writing by the Council to that person, it is not binding until it does.

MOVED Cr Rundle, **SECONDED** Cr Gilmore that Council:

1 rescinds resolution H20333 of the Council meeting held
24 March 1993, viz:

"That Council:

- 1 instruct Mr Smart to move the buses to the rear of the property within six weeks;
- 2 advise Mr Smart that he has 12 months in which to complete his two sheds and all remaining buses to be removed within this 12 month period.";
- 2 defers consideration of the requests to store buses and the unsightly appearance of Lot 2692 (952) Pinjar Road, Pinjar to the May Town Planning Committee.

At the commencement of works a fence was erected around the site perimeter and consequently the area previously used by train commuters as a make shift car park was reduced from a 150 vehicle capacity to approximately a 50 vehicle capacity. This resulted in the commuters parking their vehicles along the length of Collier Pass.

The amount of vehicles parking on both sides of Collier Pass resulted in Transperth notifying the Engineering Department that the safety of bus drivers and passengers was being compromised by the reduction of trafficable lanes and turning space along this road, particularly where the pavement width is 8.1m.

The concern expressed by Transperth led to an on site meeting between representatives from Council's Engineering Department, LandCorp and Transperth to assess the situation.

Transperth representatives pointed out that the Joondalup Station was a Kiss'n'Ride facility and that all day parking would not be provided in the future. Park'n'Ride facilities are available at Edgewater Station and at the soon to be completed Currambine Station.

There are two temporary car parks provided for commuters as shown on Appendix XIX. However, this existing off street parking is on LandCorp property and is expected to diminish as development of the Joondalup Station surrounds continues.

Ultimately Collier Pass will become a dual carriageway thus preventing street parking.

As an interim measure, both Transperth and LandCorp representatives requested that appropriate parking prohibitions be implemented.

In the interest of safety, it is proposed that the "NO STANDING ANYTIME" prohibition, as shown on Appendix XIX, be signed on both sides of Collier Pass.
