The Minutes of Community Services Committee Meeting held on 5 April 1993, were confirmed as a true and correct record.

PETITIONS AND DEPUTATIONS

DEPUTATION - "YOUTH SPEAK OUT" FORUM

The Youth Services Co-ordinator, Lucy Bennett, David Applebee and John Stewart from Commonwealth Employment Services addressed the Committee to present the outcomes of the "Youth Speak Out" Forum. The Youth Services Co-ordinator provided background information to the initiative called "Youth Speak Out" which involved approximately 100 young people attending a number of workshops at various locations in the City of Wanneroo. This was followed by a Youth Forum, held at Quinns Rocks when over 70 young people participated and discussed their concerns and ideas about education, employment and training within the municipality.

David Applebee addressed the subject of transport and the difficulties for young people particularly in Yanchep and Quinns Rocks attending training programmes, interviews or pursuing leisure activities when there was no public transport in and out of these areas during the day.

Lucy Bennett discussed the school system and stated she would like to see more work experience opportunities while students were still at school to enable them to find out the type of work they may wish to do and to establish contacts with employers. She would also like to see compulsory life support skills taught in schools. Students now required a high standard of education to be eligible for TAFE. More work needed to be done in providing training courses for those students without high academic ability.

John Stewart suggested methods of increasing local business by the introduction of citizen cards for trade discounts, free advertising and publishing of a local business directory.

He highlighted shortfalls in facilities for young people in the City of Wanneroo including youth accommodation and places where young people could meet and socialise rather than the Recreation Centres where organised team sports and fees were too high for the young unemployed.

Following a conference to be held in June at the City of Wanneroo, information would be collated into a report which would then be sent to local business associations, State and Federal Government service providers, the Ministry for Education, and local community newspapers.

Following questions from Councillors, the Mayor thanked the Deputation for addressing the Committee.

H40503 LICENCE & REGISTRATION - EATING HOUSES - [930-18]

ACTING CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT H40503

In August 1992, Council resolved to reaffirm its earlier commitment to set the amount of \$300 for the Licence and Registration of Eating Houses (Item G40804 refers).

The impact of this increase prompted numerous requests to pay the licence fee by instalment, and it was agreed that a minimum payment of \$50 per month would be acceptable. The Acting City Environmental Health Manager advises that a number of proprietors paid an initial payment and have since let their payments lapse.

He now seeks Council approval to initiate legal action against nine proprietors who are conducting eating houses without the requisite Licence and Registration.

The City Environmental Health Manager requested that Council defers initiating legal action against the proprietors and seeks payment through the debt recovery methods.

RECOMMENDATION

ACTING CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT H40505

The Acting City Environmental Health Manager provides a monthly update of the mosquito control programme and the incidence of Ross River Virus infections within the City of Wanneroo.

He anticipates the end of the current programme with the advent of cooler weather and the consequent decline of the mosquito population.

ACTING CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT H40506

In April, Council resolved that a report be submitted to Community Services Committee regarding the cost and feasibility of including health warning literature on dog excreta with all rate notices and to investigate appropriate health warning signs on parks and reserves relating to diseases caused by dog excreta. Information on diseases which may be transmitted from pets to humans is outlined in an article which is reproduced from Environmental Health WA Magazine. These diseases are preventable if domestic pet owners ensure their animals are kept free from parasites.

The Acting City Environmental Health Manager reports that appropriate literature can be produced and dispatched with rate notices at a cost of \$1,000.

The City Environmental Health Manager reported that adhesive health warning signs regarding dog excreta for installation in the City's parks would cost \$13.50 each. The number required is yet to be ascertained.

MOVED Cr Wood, SECONDED Cr MacLean that:

- 1 Council provides funds within the 1993/94 Budget for:
 - (a) the issue of health warning literature regarding dog excreta with all rates notices;

Council is advised that under the Health Department budgetary allocation for special projects a casual appointment of a Health Promotions Officer has been made to the Health Department to identify the status quo of Healthy Cities at national and state levels, to examine the possibilities of implementing Healthy Cities Projects in Wanneroo, and to identify the processes involved.

The City Environmental Health Manager reports on the status quo of the Healthy Cities following the completion of the three year pilot project which has seen commonwealth funding withdrawn but continued interest and support for Local Government initiatives by the Health Department of Western Australia, although the prospects of state funding is difficult to predict.

CITY LIBRARIAN'S REPORT H40510

The Library and Information Service of Western Australia (LISWA) has requested a submission from Council to the Library Board for additional bookstock to be supplied in the 1993/94 Development Programme.

The City Librarian reports on the reduction of the Development Programme to a one year process.

The Development Programme comprises three categories - Development, Additional Stock and Heavy Usage.

The City Librarian suggests that Council request additional books for the Woodvale and Yanchep/Two Rocks Libraries under the Additional Stock Programme.

Although Joondalup Library has not been scheduled to commence in 1993/94, stock selection will be a three year process and it is hoped the Library will open in 1996. As Joondalup Library is expected to be the largest public library in Western Australia it would seem appropriate for Council to request 20,000 volumes in the 1993/94 Development Programme.

MOVED Cr Wood, SECONDED Cr MacLean that Council submits an application to the Library Board 1993/94 Development Programme:

- 1 requesting 2471 volumes for the Woodvale Library and 2240 volumes for the Yanchep/Two Rocks Library under the Additional Stock Programme;

In October 1992 Council resolved to write to the local Members of Parliament expressing concern on the current state budget for public library stock and probable long term implications for establishing the Joondalup Library. A brief on the new Woodvale Library to emphasise stock problems facing new libraries was also provided.

Local members have corresponded with the Minister for the Arts, Peter Foss, on Council's behalf and forwarded his responses.

The Minister has acknowledged the special needs of the Joondalup Library but made no commitment to the project.

The City Librarian gives reasons why it is considered appropriate to correspond further with Members of Parliament to highlight the importance of Joondalup Library receiving funding under the LISWA 1993/94 budget.

MOVED Cr Wood, SECONDED Cr MacLean that Council corresponds with local Members of Parliament:

- 1 expressing appreciation for their interest in the Joondalup Library Project on Council's behalf;
- 2 highlighting the importance of the Joondalup Library receiving funding in the LISWA 1993/94 budget;

CITY RECREATION & CULTURAL SERVICES MANAGER'S REPORT H40516

Council, in its 1992/93 Budget, allocated \$30,000 towards the Cultural Development Fund. The aims of the Fund are:

- . to assist groups in the community to establish and become involved in cultural activities;
- to expand the range of cultural activities in the municipality;
 - to support cultural activities relevant to community groups;

- to provide opportunities for professional artists to interact with community groups;
- . to promote access and participation by community groups in cultural activities.

The Cultural Development Fund Peer Assessment Panel has now selected twenty seven successful recipients from fifty applications received.

The City Recreation and Cultural Services Manager provides details of the applications received and suggests that Council allocates an additional \$5,000 in the 1993/94 draft Budget to the Cultural Development Fund.

CITY RECREATION & CULTURAL SERVICES MANAGER'S REPORT H40519

The Institute of Recreation, in conjunction with the Ministry of Sport and Recreation, holds Recreation Management Awards every three years, the next being held this year. These Management Awards aim to recognise excellence in the management of facilities and programmes throughout Western Australia.

The categories of the Awards are:

- 1 Major Recreation Complex (including commercial)
- 2 Community Recreation Facility (Metropolitan)
- 3 Community Recreation Facility (Country)
- 4 Aquatic Facility
- 5 Recreation Programme

The Recreation Department is intending to submit applications for various recreation facilities and programmes.

The Institute of Recreation has approached the City of Wanneroo to host the Award presentations to be held in September.

The City Recreation and Cultural Services Manager considers that this would be an ideal opportunity for Council to play an active role in the marketing and exposure of its recreation facilities and suggests that the Craigie Leisure Centre would make an ideal venue for the event. MOVED Cr Wood, SECONDED Cr MacLean that Council:

- 1 agrees to host the 1993 Recreation Management Awards at the Craigie Leisure Centre on a date to be determined in September 1993;

H40521 USE OF HEATHRIDGE PARK CLUBROOMS BY SPORTING CLUBS [061-166-4]

CITY RECREATION & CULTURAL SERVICES MANAGER'S REPORT H40521

There have recently been several instances where bookings at the Heathridge Park Clubrooms have been displaced and disrupted due to a poor understanding, by the resident clubs, of Council's Policy relating to Clubrooms on Reserves.

In essence, this Policy states that:

"...clubs that contribute to the cost of a facility shall share usage and ongoing costs with Council in proportion to the contribution of each." The City Recreation and Cultural Services Manager reports on the financial contributions made by the Clubs and the percentage of time appointed to them. Problems have arisen where legitimate users have been turned away due to the Clubs holding unannounced meetings or functions. He considers it appropriate to remind these Clubs of their commitments and responsibilities in this regard.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

It was reported to the Community Services Committee on 10 May 1993 that the contribution to the Heathridge Park Clubrooms was made up as follows:

Ocean Ridge Junior Football Club \$15,000 Ocean Ridge Junior Cricket Club....\$ 5,000 Ocean Ridge Senior Cricket Club \$ 5,000 (Item H40521 refers)

These figures were obtained from the report submitted to Council in February 1991, recommending the acceptance of the construction tender (Item F10206 refers). However, prior to actually making their payments, the Ocean Ridge Junior Cricket Club withdrew its contribution. The shortfall was subsequently "made up" by the Junior Football Club, therefore, the actual contributions and respective apportionments over the course of a 12 month period are:

Ocean Ridge Junior Football Club \$20,000 22.5% (22.5 hrs/wk) Ocean Ridge Senior Cricket Club \$ 5,000 5.5% (5.5 hrs/wk)

These apportionments are based over a 52 week period, with no allowance made for "off season" use. It would be more appropriate, therefore, to allow 45 hrs/wk (22.5 hrs x 2) for the six "winter" months for the Junior Football Club, and 11 hrs/wk (5.5 hrs x 2) during the six "summer" months for the Senior Cricket Club. This clarification does not change the spirit of Report H40521, but requires the recommendation to refer to two clubs and not three.

MOVED Cr Wood, SECONDED Cr MacLean that Council authorises the City Recreation and Cultural Services Manager to emphasize with the three resident clubs the limitations of their tenure at the Heathridge Park Clubrooms as outlined in Report No H40521.

In March (Item H20305 refers) Council resolved to defer an application submitted by Mr J B & Mrs P E Tilbrook for a retail nursery on Lot 30 (27) Landsdale Road, Landsdale pending an investigation of overall traffic conditions along Landsdale Road between Skeit Road and Alexander Drive.

The City Planner reports on the background relating to the proposal and advice received from the Department of Planning and Urban Development.

He provides an assessment of the proposal and comments on a submission and petition received opposing the proposal.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

That consideration of Proposed Retail Nursery, Lot 30 (27) Landsdale Road, Landsdale be deferred pending a further report to May Council meeting.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Further to Report No H20509 and discussions held at the May Town Planning Committee on the above matter, I can now advise that following a meeting with the applicants, consensus was reached as outlined hereunder: the applicants have agreed that they will immediately undertake to construct approximately 24 additional car parking bays on Lot 39 Landsdale Road on the existing nursery (this nursery was approved under the old retail nursery definition);

- 2 they will also, upon the issue of Council's approval, construct in limestone base a car park and driveway access to Lot 30 Landsdale Road as a interim measure in an attempt to alleviate any parking congestion within that street;
- 3 they will also accept the issue of a new planning approval for the existing retail nursery on Lot 39 Landsdale Road. This would be in the terms as now proposed by Council for the new nursery definition (as outlined in Amendment No 622, Item H20518) when the new retail nursery on Lot 30 Landsdale Road commences sales to the public (it is anticipated that it may taken some 12 months to establish a new retail nursery on Lot 30). Council should formally resolve to grant that new approval now on the basis that it will take effect when the retail nursery on Lot 30 commences sales;
- 4 Council agreeing to the issue of a retail nursery approval to Lot 30 Landsdale Road generally in accordance with the plans received. More detailed plans will be submitted showing accurately the car park and shed location for this development;
- 5 the proposed parking prohibition for Landsdale Road as outlined in Report H10410 be rescinded and replaced with a new parking prohibition during the times specified only along the northern alignment of Landsdale Road from the western boundary of Lot 31 to the eastern boundary of Lot 32 as shown on Attachment No 1.

The applicants will also need to confirm in writing that they accept the negotiated terms as outlined above together with any other development conditions considered necessary.

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT H20518

The City Planner reports that Amendment No 622 proposes modifying scheme definitions relating to nurseries and introducing a separate definition for "Landscape Supplies". It was initiated by Council in April 1992 (Item G20408 refers) and is being advertised for comment until 18 May 1993. To date, no objections have been received. He gives details of the current definition of a retail nursery and discusses the modification of the definition. He advises that legal advice has been sought on the proposed definition. If the definitions are modified, the Council's intent will be clarified without any material changes to the amendment as advertised for public comment.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Although the public comment period for Amendment 622 closed on 18 May 1993, a late objection has been received from Land Planning Consultants on behalf of A & J Stampalia. They object to the intention to prohibit landscaping supplies in the Rural zone and suggest this rather become an "AA" use class. If Council so modifies the amendment to meet the objection, it will have the discretion to consider applications for landscape supplies in the Rural zone on the merits of each case and approval will have the right of appeal.

In 1986, the Council opposed specialised landscape supply establishments in the Rural zone when it initiated Amendment 352. That amendment favoured allowing only the incidental sale of landscape supplies from retail nurseries. Landscape supplies remain appropriate uses in Commercial, Industrial and Mixed Business zones as Amendment 622 intends, and the City Planner does not believe that such commercial enterprises, which do not rely on the agricultural potential of rural land, should be encouraged in the Rural zone.

Cr Nosow declared an interest in this item.

MOVED Cr Marwick, SECONDED Cr Freame that Council:

- 1 modifies Amendment No 622 to Town Planning Scheme No 1
 by:
 - (a) deleting the definition of "Retail Nursery" and substituting the following term and definition:

"Nursery" means land and/or buildings used for the propagation, nurturing and growing of plants, and where that is the predominant use may include the retail sale of seeds, bulbs, seedlings, shrubs, trees or other nursery stock propagated and grown on the site, and additionally plant containers; fertilizers, soil conditioners, weedicides and pesticides, sold in bags or other containers; and gardening implements, sprinklers and home reticulation equipment;

- (b) in the Zoning Table, substituting for the use class "Retail Nursery" the use class "Nursery";
- (c) inserting a definition of "Landscape Supply" as follows:

"Landscape Supply" means the use of land/or a building for the sale of woodchips, logs, rocks, sand, stone, paving slabs and other items intended for landscaping purposes;

- (d) inserting the use class "Landscape Supply" in the zoning table as a "D" use in the "Commercial, Light and Service Industrial, Whitford Town Centre and Two Rocks Town Centre" zones and as an "AA" use in the "Joondalup City Centre and the Mixed Business" zone, and as an "X" use in all other zones;
- 2 adopts Modified Amendment No 622 to Town Planning Scheme No 1 to amend the definition of "Retail Nursery" and insert a definition for "Landscape Supply" into the Scheme Text;
- 3 authorises the affixation of the Common Seal to the amending documents;
- 4 forwards the modified Amendment to the Hon Minister for Planning seeking final approval for Amendment No 622.

The City Planner reports that in September 1992, an application was received from the Department of Infrastructure and Government Asset's seeking Council approval for the rezoning of a portion of Reserve 37756 Henniker Way, Koondoola from "Public Purpose - Primary School" to "Residential Development".

In November 1992 (Item G21113 refers) Council resolved to support the amendment. In March, the Minister for Planning granted approval for the amendment to be advertised for public comment. The advertising period closed on 27 April 1993 and one submission has been received.

The City Planner reports on the submission received and recommends the objection should not be upheld and that the Minister's final approval to the amendment be sought.

In June 1992, Council considered public submissions received in relation to the proposal and resolved to adopt Amendment No 557 to Town Planning Scheme No 1 and forward the submissions to the Hon Minister for Planning, seeking final approval to Amendment No 557.

In the light of this, they requested that Council forwards the documentation for Amendment No 592 to the Minister for Planning requesting reconsideration of the decision to refuse advertising the amendment. subject to a satisfactory conclusion to the deputation, it will forward the documents for Amendment No 592 to the Minister for Planning requesting reconsideration of approval to advertise; subject to the outcome of point 1 above advises the applicants that in the interest of facilitating the prompt development of the land it has resolved to seek the above amendment but before granting final approval to Amendment No 592, it will require:

- an Interim Rural Strategy Plan for the area bounded by Neaves Road, Pinjar Road, Caporn Street, Rousset Road, Townsend Road and the State Forest;
- (b) a more detailed Structure Plan for the area bounded by Neaves Road, Adams Road, the proposed north-south road, Rousset Road (southern end), Townsend Road, the State Forest and the western boundary of the Meadowlands Special Rural Zone;
- (c) a revised detailed Special Rural Zone proposed for the subject land which accords with the outcome of (a) and (b) above.

H20522 PROPOSED MODIFICATION: AMENDMENT NO 595 REZONING VARIOUS LOTS, EAST ROAD AND WANNEROO ROAD, WANNEROO -[790-595]

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT H20522

In February 1992 (Item G20226 refers) Council initiated Amendment No 595 to rezone Lots 14, 15, 17, 18 and 19 East Road, Lot 19 Archer Street and Lots 7, 8, 2, 34 and 31 Wanneroo Road, from "Rural" to "Residential Development R20".

The City Planner reports on the background and current situation relating to the proposed Amendment No 595. He gives details of concerns over the impact of existing poultry farms on residential development.

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT H20526

Amendment No 528 was initiated at Council's February 1990 meeting (Item E20204 refers) and was later modified at Council's February 1991 meeting (Item F20237 refers).

The City Planner advises that the amendment seeks to rezone a portion of Lot 31 where it abuts Hester Avenue in Merriwa to accommodate a service station.

He reports that advertising of the amendment closes on 11 May 1993 and at the time of writing the report, no submissions had been received.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

A service station site had been included in the structure planning for this area since December 1989. The City had always made it clear that the applicant should not construe this as a use approval and that such a proposal would require consideration through the formal planning process.

Upon request of the applicant, Council at its February 1990 meeting (Item E20204 refers) resolved to initiate a rezoning to accommodate a service station on a triangular piece of land bounded by Hester Avenue, the old Quinns Road and a proposed local distributor road.

Generally, it is preferred to locate service stations in conjunction with district centres, which are normally located on regional roads, or in conjunction with neighbourhood centres, which are normally located within the suburb. In this case it was considered that the following points constituted sufficient justification to support such a zoning.

> 3There was no opportunity for the development of a service station along this section of Hester Avenue in conjunction with a commercial centre and there is a case for the provision of a limited number of service stations on major roads to serve regional traffic.

> 4The site was constrained by Telecom cables running along its northern boundary creating a difficult site to find suitable uses for.

A subdivision application in line with the amendment was approved by the Department of Planning and Urban Development (DPUD) in April 1990 (Appendix No IX).

In November 1990, the applicant submitted a revised subdivisional design changing the size and configuration of the site (Appendix NOX) These changes were made possible due to the relocation of the Telecom cables from the old Quinns Road to Hester Avenue. Council considered the changes at its February 1991 (Item F20237 refers) and resolved to modify the amendment to conform with the later subdivisional design. The Department of Planning and Urban Development approved the revised subdivision in August 1991. It should be noted that upon approval of each subdivisional design the applicant was advised not to construe it as a zoning approval. In both cases the subdivisional design could have allowed the development of grouped housing - a discretionary landuse under the present "Residential Development" zone. To date the site and immediate vicinity remain undeveloped.

As Council has been made aware, advertising of the amendment has now closed and four letters of objection were received. One further objection was received after the May Town Planning Committee meeting. The issues identified in these submissions were outlined in a memorandum to Report H20526.

Although one of the reasons Council originally supported this amendment is now no longer relevant. It is considered that there is still a case for the development of a service station in this location as:

- 1 The site is located close to a future freeway interchange which will result in high volumes of regional traffic along Hester Avenue.
- 2 There is no opportunity along this section of Hester Avenue for the development of a service station in conjunction with a commercial centre.
- 3 Safe access and egress arrangements are to be confirmed through a legal agreement between the City of Wanneroo and the landowner.
- 4 The site has been identified in structure planning for the area since 1989.

The recommendation to finalise Amendment No 528 as outlined in Report No H20526 is therefore considered justified. Should Council decide not to follow this recommendation the approved subdivisional design could quite easily accommodate a residential landuse.

MOVED Cr Dammers, SECONDED Cr Wood that Council:

- 1 finally adopts Amendment No 528 to Town Planning Scheme
 No 1;
- 2 authorises the affixation of the Common Seal to, and the signing of the amending documents and the legal agreement referred to in Report H20526.

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT H20527

Council had previously refused a similar application which it had advertised under its policy at that time. The residents of Combe Place had an expectation that only single homes would be approved and numerous objections were received. Council subsequently refused Mr Ong's application on the bases of the previous objections.

The City Planner reports that the applicant appealed to the Hon Minister for Planning. The Minister considered that there is a case for the development to proceed and decided to uphold the appeal.

The City Planner reports that the proposed closure was advertised in the Wanneroo Times and a letter was sent to 34 of the residents in the vicinity. At the close of advertising, four written objections were received.

He advises that the objectors requested that Clyo Way remain open to allow pedestrian access to the bus service along Dampier Avenue. However, closure would not inconvenience the residents in the vicinity and the amalgamation of the land into the adjoining St Ives Development would alleviate the existing eyesore.

The City Planner reports that a 4-signature petition has been received requesting Council to reconsider its objection on the basis of recent anti-social, bordering on criminal, behaviour by juveniles in the accessway.

Unfortunately, due to the existence of SECWA's services and padmount site, closure of the accessway cannot proceed.

MOVED Cr Dammers, SECONDED Cr Wood that Council reiterates its previous Resolution F21019 not to proceed with the closure of the pedestrian accessway between Ensign Way and Nautical Grove, Beldon.

H20530 REQUESTED CLOSURE OF PEDESTRIAN ACCESSWAY BETWEEN TROTMAN CRESCENT AND FRIGATE CRESCENT, VANCHEP -[510-520]

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT H20530

In July 1992, Council resolved to initiate preliminary closure procedures by advertising in respect of the pedestrian accessway between Frigate Crescent and Trotman Crescent, Yanchep.

The City Planner reports that at the close of advertising, no objections were received. However, the Department of Planning and Urban Development has opposed the closure of the accessway on the grounds that the closure would reduce the accessibility to nearby public open space.

He advises that the subject pedestrian accessway does not form part of an easily recognisable pedestrian/cycle network and it is not considered that residents would be faced with significantly longer journeys if the accessway is closed. Two adjoining landowners have agreed to purchase the land within the accessway.

MOVED Cr Dammers, SECONDED Cr Wood that Council agrees to the closure of the pedestrian accessway between Trotman Crescent and Frigate Crescent, Yanchep subject to the benefiting adjoining land owners meeting all costs involved.

H20531 STORAGE OF BUSES AND UNSIGHTLY APPEARANCE: MR R SMART, LOT 2692 (952) FINJAR ROAD, FINJAR - [250/2692/952, 30/3898]

The City Planner reports on the storage of buses and unsightly appearance of Lot 2692 (952) Pinjar Road, Pinjar.

He gives details of the background relating to this matter and Council's resolution (Item H20333 refers) on 24 March 1993.

The resolution was considered vague and possibly "ultra vires" and referred to Council's solicitors for their opinion. The response from Council's solicitors was that the resolution may be open to an interpretation which is contrary to Council's intentions.

In April, Council considered the application for a Motor Bus Depot (Item H20417 refers) and Storage of Buses/Unsightly Appearance (Item H20418 refers). Council refused the application for a Motor Bus Depot and deferred consideration of Item H20418 until May Council meeting.

The City Planner reports on the present situation and details the actions necessary to satisfactorily progress the application.

RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- advises Mr R Smart the storage of up to nine omnibuses and assorted other equipment on Lot 2692 (952) Pinjar Road, Pinjar is not considered an acceptable activity in the Rural zone generally or in the Lake Pinjar area in particular and the offending items should be removed from the property before 30 June 1993 to the satisfaction of the City Planner or Council will take appropriate legal action against him;
- 2 advises Mr R Smart if the omnibuses and various other equipment are satisfactorily removed from Lot 2692 (952) Pinjar Road, Pinjar by 30 June 1993 he may then apply to Council for permission to conduct a Home Occupation (Operation of Two Only Buses) from the property;
- 3 takes appropriate legal actions to ensure the unacceptable use of Lot 2692 (952) Pinjar Road, Pinjar ceases if the various items have not been removed from the property by 30 June 1993.

A basic tenet of "local government" is that it be responsive to the constantly changing social, political, economic and physical environment within which it carries out its functions. In this context, it is imperative that an authority the size of the City of Wanneroo operate within a framework that observes due democratic process whilst affording expediency in the conduct of business with and for its community.

Council has seen with the submission of the draft new Local Government Act, the report of the Panel of Inquiry and the earlier 'Organisational Review' by Deloitte Ross Tohmatsu, that a new "open" style of local government will provide the necessary accountability that is the prerequisite for greater autonomy and indeed, greater credibility for local government. It was with this principle in mind that I proposed, in December 1991, that Council give consideration to the conduct of two open Council meetings each month, served by only the Policy and Resources Committee and the other Standing Committees to meet as and when required. Due to circumstances prevailing at that time, consideration of this matter was deferred.

Detail of the proposed change to Council meeting structure has been submitted to each of the current Standing Committees during the May round of meetings, together with prior reports detailing the proposal in full. The response from the Standing Committees has been supportive of such change, resulting in recommendations that Council adopt the new format as suggested, but that a

category be included in the revised agenda to provide for "Members Items for Reports".

In the course of committee deliberations, concern was expressed that a proper evaluation of the proposed format could not be carried out by elected members new to Council, as they had not had the opportunity to operate under the current system. Whilst members elected in the future may similarly be faced with a system new to them, it is suggested that a delay in the introduction of the revised format until 1 September 1993 will overcome the immediate concern.

It has been stated also in the course of committee discussion in respect of this matter, that a commitment by both Council and the administration to conduct a thorough trial of the new format must include an acknowledgement that "teething problems" may be experienced, and that advantage be taken of the close working relationships enjoyed at the City in order to refine the format to the benefit of the Council and its ratepayers. To this end, I concur with the suggestion by the Mayor that a workshop be conducted to work through the proposal and afford members the opportunity to familiarise themselves with the format prior to the conduct of official Council business.
