RETIREMENT OF CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER

Gordan Florance, the City Environmental Health Manager, retired recently after more than 30 years in local government.

During his eight year reign at Wanneroo, he presided over many changes which have resulted in Council taking a more modern and innovative approach to the delivery of its health services.

QUESTIONS PUT OR COMMENTS MADE BY THE PUBLIC RELATING TO BUSINESS LISTED ON THE AGENDA.

Mrs Sue Pertilé of Quinns Rocks has requested permission to address Council at its meeting of 26 July 1995 in relation to the proposed shop extensions on Lot 119 (80) Ocean Drive, Quinns Rock - Item TP235-07/95 refers.

Mrs Pertilé subsequently advised that she wished to withdraw her request to address Council.

PROPOSED CLOSURE OF PEDESTRIAN ACCESSWAY DANBURY CRESCENT, GIRRAWHEEN - TP253-07/95 REFERS

Mrs Kenny, Mr John Jaap, Mrs Michelle Welsh and Mr D Rajah of Girrawheen have requested permission to address Council at its meeting of 26 July 1995 in relation to the pedestrian accessway in Danbury Crescent, Girrawheen - Item TP253-07/95 refers; and submitted the following questions:

- Q1. If the allegations that Mrs Baraiolo have made are true then, why are Councillors voting on the closure of this laneway, when they have stated before it's not a Council issue, but it's a policing issue?
- A1. The control of vandalism is a Police matter, however, the decision on the future of the accessway can be made by Council.
- Q2. Is it true that Council has a policy of closure of laneways, if adjoining residents petition for their closure, irrespective of the wishes of other residents in the area?
- A2. No.
- Q3. Are the Council aware that the allegation supposedly made by Neighbourhood Watch were in fact details supplied by Mrs Baraiolo?
- A3. The letter received from Neighbourhood Watch provides Police statistics on three burglaries. No source is provided for the other information supplied by the Neighbourhood Watch.

A further letter has been received from Neighbourhood Watch advising that it wishes to remain impartial on the issue. It also advises that Mrs Baraiolo reported the finding of syringes and condoms, and the incidence of a couple engaging in sexual acts in the accessway to Neighbourhood Watch.

Q4. Mrs Baraiolo has stated to Council that putting extra lighting at the end of the laneway would not help as the majority of the problems occur during the day.

Do Councillors truly believe people are drinking alcohol, glue sniffing, injecting drugs, having sex in broad daylight in this laneway, while local residents and school children use it, when there's a park only 3 homes away with shelter from prving eves?

- A4. I am unable to answer this question and would suggest that you approach the Councillors themselves on this question.
- Q5. Are the Council aware of the possible closure of Blackmore or Girrawheen Primary School due to Education Department rationalisation which would increase the pedestrian flow to either one of these schools making this laneway a more valuable asset to the community?
- A5. No.
- Q6. How can Council contemplate closing the laneway, when their own Town Planning Department recommend it stays open and also Western Australian Planning Commission have advised that it does no support the closure of this accessway, and Girrawheen Pre-Primary and Primary School are opposed to the closure of the accessway which provides safe access to these schools?
- A6. The Town Planning Department provides advice to Council on an administrative level. The final decision on the future of the accessways is made by the Council.
- Q7. Should the laneway close, are the Council prepared to provide school children, parents and elderly with immediate safe footpaths to schools etc?
- A7. Footpaths are provided at present. If the accessway is closed and these are insufficient, the City Engineer will assess any further requirement for footpaths.

Mr John Jaap addressed the Council regarding the signing of Mrs Baraiolo's petition by residents who had no objection to the closure of the pedestrian accessway. He also advised that for seven and a half years this has been a quality residential area with no complaints about the laneway.

Ms Michelle Welsh addressed the Council on behalf of the Principal of Girrawheen Primary School, who asked the following questions:

Q1. Has consideration been given to the fact that Whitworth Avenue and Arnos Way lead to the main school entrance used by staff, parents of pre-primary and primary school students and visitors to the dental clinic?

If the walkway is closed children will conflict with this traffic along a route with many blind spots and footpath on the opposite side of the road.

- Q2. Is there an awareness that students from primary, high and private schools use the walkway to gain access to the shopping centre, scout hall, library, Hudson Reserve and to visit their friends?
- Q3. Mrs Welsh made reference to Cr Taylor's discussions with Mrs Baraiolo in relation to evidence of an intruder entering her property.
- A3 Cr Taylor advised that he did hold evidence to support Mrs Baraiolo's report to police of an intruder entering her property.

The Town Clerk advised that he would take Mrs Welsh's other questions Nos ${\bf 1}$ and ${\bf 2}$ on Notice.

this proposal have been more intensive than normally associated with development applications received by Council.

Mr Harman addressed the Council and advised he could see no reason why this matter should not be deferred pending result of the Public Inquiry.

TS223-07/95 WASTE MINIMISATION AND RECYCLING IN THE CITY OF WANNEROO - [508-4]

CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT

At its meeting in May, Council considered Report TS138-04/95 "Review of Recycling" and resolved to hold a workshop to allow more comprehensive consideration of waste minimisation and recycling.

The City Engineer submits reports on strategic issues, the current recycling situation, green waste and possible changes to the bulk collection service.

He advises that there are opportunities to provide increased levels of service within the current Budget and operational structures of Council.

He considers that Council's waste minimisation and recycling strategy should be wholistic in its scope and allow consideration of the range of issues that affect the environmental and economic sustainability of our community and sustainability. This will involve Council in greatly increased communication with the community.

MOVED Cr O'Grady, SECONDED Cr Magyar that Council:

- amends the guidelines adopted at item H10522 in May 1993 to read "That Council sets a guideline of having a long term average maximum subsidy of \$55 per tonne for any material in its kerbside recvoling programme;
- 2 directs the City Engineer to progress the preparation of an ecologically sustainable waste minimisation and recycling strategy for the residents of the City of Wanneroo incorporating:
 - (a) extensive community consultation;
 - (b) the principles of environmental and ecological sustainability;
 - (c) the whole range of waste streams generated by the residents of the City of Wanneroo both directly and in the wider Australian economy;
 - (d) the provision of reliable environmental information on the Australian and world scene

especially in relation to greenhouse effects and species preservation;

- (e) the involvement of community groups;
- (f) the use of "environmental credits" if cost effective in addressing issues of concern;
- makes provision of \$100,000 in the 1995/96 Budget at Account No 26848 to provide funding for the consultancy support required for the development of an Ecologically Sustainable Waste Minimisation and Recycling Strategy for the residents of the City of Wanneroo.

CARRIED

TS224-07/95 RECYCLING AND WASTE MINIMISATION CURRENT OPERATIONS - [508-4]

CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT

Council is active in a number of recycling and waste minimisation activities and faces some decisions that need to be made for the coming financial year.

The City Engineer provides an overview of the current situation and addresses the issues which require consideration in the kerbside recycling programme.

He outlines opportunities for Council to establish a long term newspaper, cardboard and phone book collection service at no or minimal cost and considers the remaining kerbside collection programme remain with Council's workforce.

MOVED Cr O'Grady, SECONDED Cr Magyar that Council:

- 1 calls for expressions of interest for operation of a kerbside collection programme for newspaper, cardboard and phone books on a fortnightly or four weekly basis;
- 2 reviews its day labour kerbside collection service after it reviews its secondary waste treatment and waste minimisation and recycling strategies.

CARRIED

TS225-07/95 BULK COLLECTION AND GREENS RECYCLING - [508-1]

The current bulk collection started as a hard waste collection to help residents remove large items such as furniture that could otherwise be fairly expensive or difficult. In the early 1980's it was changed to incorporate green waste and changed from strategically placed cromlin bins to a Sunday verge

collection. The operation changed to a weekday in 1988 with the introduction of the 240 litre carts.

The service rotates through the municipality and each area gets a pick up about every 9 months. This year the service costs about \$127 per tomne for pick up plus tipping fees of about \$17 per tonne. This equates to a cost per property of about \$13.25. Over 50% of the material put out for collection is green waste.

The City Engineer reports on the options available to Council for the bulk collection, including the separation of green waste at source.

He advises that the bulk collection is a non core, but popular part of Council's Waste Collection Service and suggests that the current service be modified to increase the amount of clean green material available for collection by requiring it to be stacked separately from other rubbish.

CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT recommended that Council adopts the following policy in relation to the bulk collection service:

- as far as practical, green waste suitable for mulching be collected separately;
- 2 that green waste put out for the bulk collection be uncontaminated by and placed separately from other rubbish.

MOVED Cr O'Grady, SECONDED Cr Magyar that Council:

- 1 adopts the following policy in relation to the bulk collection service:
 - (a) as far as practical, green waste suitable for mulching be collected separately;
 - (b) that green waste put out for the bulk collection be uncontaminated by and placed separately from other rubbish;
- 2 seeks a report on the management and cost options for operating a greens drop off facility at the Badgerup Road tip site.

MINUTES OF TOWN PLANNING COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON 12 JUNE 1995

The Minutes of Town Planning Committee Meeting held 12 June 1995 were confirmed as a true and correct record.

PETITIONS AND DEPUTATIONS

DEPUTATION - PROPOSED RESORT DEVELOPMENT, LOT 3 (1397) CORNER WANNEROO AND BURNS BEACH ROADS, WANNEROO - [30/33]

Mr Greg Rowe of Greg Rowe and Associates on behalf of Goldrange Pty Ltd, addressed the Committee in relation to the proposed resort development, Lot 3 (1397) Corner Wanneroo and Burns Beach Roads, Wanneroo - Item TP268-07/95 refers.

Mr Greg Rowe on behalf of Mr Ray Jackson, gave background information to this application where it is proposed to construct a resort type development comprising 42 self-contained chalet units, restaurant, function room, chapel and caretaker's residence.

The chalets are to be single storey, of Colonial architectural design, with on-site parking and will provide family chalet accommodation at reasonable prices.

The development is to be connected to deep sewerage and reticulated water and approval for the connection of both services has been obtained from the appropriate authority.

Mr Rowe advised that this development would be well located to attract future tourist potential in the North West Corridor and would go some way to fulfilling a short fall in accommodation and recreation facilities in this particular area.

Accordingly, the applicant sought Council's approval for the development of a resort type facility on Lot 3 (1397) Corner Wanneroo and Burns Beach Roads, Wanneroo.

Following questions from Councillors, the Chairman thanked the deputation for addressing the Committee and advised that the matter would be considered later in the meeting.

DEPUTATION - PROPOSED CLOSURE OF PEDESTRIAN ACCESSMAY BETWEEN GAYFORD WAY AND DANBURY CRESCENT, GIRRAWHEEN - [510-1114, 510-1115]

Mrs Sandra Baraiolo addressed the Committee in relation to the proposed closure of the pedestrian accessway between Gayford Way and Danbury Crescent, Girrawheen - Item TP253-07/95 refers.

Mrs Baraiolo gave an overview of the situation regarding the problems associated with the pedestrian accessway since the first petition was lodged with Council in 1988.

She sighted the main problems as being youths using the accessway for drug-taking and consuming alcohol, tormenting her dog, used unprotected syringes left lying about, causing an

extreme health danger to unsuspecting children, and strangers approaching her young children.

Mrs Baraiolo is of the firm belief that the accessway between Danbury Crescent and Gayford Way, Girrawheen should be closed in order that the residents in the immediate area can maintain the quality of life she feels they are entitled to.

Following questions from Councillors, the Chairman thanked the deputation for addressing the Committee and advised that the matter would be considered later in the meeting.

DEPUTATION - PROPOSED CLOSURE OF PEDESTRIAN ACCESSWAY BETWEEN GAYFORD WAY AND DANBURY CRESCENT, GIRRAWHEEN - [510-1114, 510-1115]

Mr John Jaap addressed the Committee in relation to the proposed closure of the pedestrian accessway between Gayford Way and Danbury Crescent, Girrawheen - Item TP253-07/95 refers.

Mr Jaap spoke on behalf of the residents who would like to see the pedestrian accessway remain open.

He advised that the accessway is frequently used on any one particular day, not only by school children travelling to and from school, but also by parents for this same purpose. The accessway also provides a route for senior citizens commuting to and from local shops, chemists and other nearby facilities. It also allows them ready access to nearby Hudson Park.

Mr Jaap has been informed by the Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator for this vicinity that this laneway is not a problem and that over the past six months there have been no reported break-ins in the area.

Following questions from Councillors, the Chairman thanked the deputation for addressing the Committee and advised that the matter would be considered later in the meeting.

DEPUTATION - PROPOSED VODAFONE TELECOMMUNICATIONS TOWER ON RESERVE 12038 SHORAN COURT, OCEAN REEF - [30/4986]

Mr Rory O'Brien on behalf of Vodafone and Ms Emily Pink of Telstra addressed the Committee in relation to the proposed Vodafone telecommunications tower on Reserve 12038 Shoran Court, Ocean Reef - Item TP233-07/95 refers.

Mr O'Brien advised that the application from Vodafone has been in progress since October last year and there is now a matter of urgency surrounding this as the applicant had obligations to the Commonwealth Government to have this telecommunications tower up and running by April 1995. As a result of the delay, Vodafone are now in breach of their contract and are therefore keen to bring this matter to a conclusion.

He stated that the design of these towers will be such that they are able to be utilised by more than one carrier. The tower in question will be used by Vodafone, Telstra, Optus and the Police Department.

Mr O'Brien acknowledged the concerns of the community with regard to these towers and advised that there is no interference with television sets or other electrical appliances. He also made mention of the fact that a large portion of people living in this area used mobile phones and would therefore require an efficient service to handle their needs.

Alternative sites would need to be looked at if this application was not approved, but Mr O'Brien was of the firm belief that this was the best available site in the area.

Following questions from Councillors, the Chairman thanked the deputation for addressing the Committee and advised that the matter would be considered later in the meeting.

Council has received an application submitted by Mr M Sparta for a child care centre on Lot 52 (2) Eddystone Avenue and Lot 73 (20) Glenunga Way (cnr Whitfords Avenue) Craigie. The proposal has not been advertised as it is considered that it cannot be recommended on either Engineering or Town Planning grounds.

The City Planner reports that of primary concern is the location of the subject site where it would have an adverse impact, in terms of traffic generation and conflict, on the surrounding residential development in Glenunga Way.

He also advises that the development proposal fails to provide 19 car bays pursuant to Council's draft Child Care Centres Policy. As a consequence, this application is not supported.

The City Planner gives an assessment of the application and advises that the proposed development constitutes an intensive agricultural use of the land which is considered an unacceptable land use within a Priority 1 groundwater supply area.

AMENDMENT NO 695: REZONING AND RECODING OF PT LOT 15 WANNEROO ROAD, WANNEROO - [790-695]

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT

In October 1994, Council resolved to support Amendment No 695 to rezone Pt Lot 15 Wanneroo Road, Wanneroo from Rural to Residential Development R5 and R15 (Item I21005 refers). The amending documents were forwarded to the Minister for Planning for approval to advertise. The advertising period closed on 18 May 1995, following which 27 objections and one letter of support were received. The main objections related to environmental, traffic and access issues and most had generally been addressed. Other concerns, however, will need to be further examined at the subdivision stage of development and finalisation of the amendment was recommended.

The City Planner reports that the Project Managers for Mr Spiers, Satterley and Company have submitted further information and finalisation of Amendment 695 is again supported.

RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- finally adopts Amendment No 695 to Town Planning Scheme No 1 to rezone and recode Pt Lot 15 Wanneroo Road, Wanneroo from Rural to Residential Development R5 and R15 subject to:
 - (a) an approved local structure plan for this area;
 - (b) preparation of a surface and groundwater hydrological management plan to the satisfaction of the Council, Department of Environmental Protection and Water Authority of WA;

2 advises the applicant that it is concerned with the traffic implications of this development on Scenic Drive and that appropriate traffic calming measures, such as a roundabout, will need to be provided when Pt Lot 15 is subdivided.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The City Planner submitted additional information to relation to Point 1(b) above.

Alan Tingey & Associates, Environmental Scientists, have evaluated the abovementioned lot with particular attention given to the western low-lying portion. Their comments are additional to previous advice of 28 June 1994 which notes that the low-lying areas of Lot 15 have been cleared of native vegetation which would have comprised reeds and flooded gum woodlands. The value of this portion of land to waterbirds and other wetland fauna has therefore been significantly reduced.

It concludes that the proposed artificial wetland to treat stormwater drainage of the development will have greater benefits to wildlife than the existing Kikuyu pasture and a few wading birds.

Consulting Engineers, Cossill & Webley, have submitted a geotechnical study and drainage and nutrient management plan which are considered satisfactory. The removal of organic-rich soils and backfilling of the affected areas is recommended prior to development. Waterlogging of the low-lying western portions of the site is stated to be the result of the water table intersecting the groundwater table rather than from the upwelling of the groundwater under artesian pressure from deep within the soil profile. This would seem to refute the claim of Poinciana Place resident Mr Brien that there are natural springs in this area.

Jim Davies & Associates submitted a Drainage and Management Plan, based on relatively limited but satisfactory data, which estimated "average groundwater levels" across the site.

Two options for drainage management were put forward. These are:

- sedimentation basin discharging to recharge area;
- sedimentation basin discharging to an artificial wetland.

Both options would satisfy criteria set by the Water Authority of Western Australia (WAWA) and the Department of Environmental

Protection (DEP) but the artificial wetland option is preferred because of the greater nutrient attenuation capacity and is consistent with water sensitive urban design.

Although some uncertainty probably exists regarding the groundwater levels, the installation of sub-soil drainage combined with maximum water level control for Lake Joondalup (both assumed) should obviate any doubt in this regard.

Overall, the documentation submitted is an acceptable basis for determining the acceptability of a drainage study to WAWA and DEP and Council should amend its resolution 2(b) of TP249-07/95 to include environmental assessment as follows and forwards the submitted documents to the relevant authorities:

"2(b) preparation of surface and groundwater and environmental management plans to the satisfaction of the Council, Department of Environmental Protection and the Water Authority of Western Australia."

In addition, to satisfy Council's other condition of final approval, a revised local structure plan was submitted on 26 June 1995 for the subject lot which requires advertising for public comment and approval by Council (appended). This is acceptable to Council but it is known that the Gospel Baptist Church on Lot 9 Backshall Place is keen to develop recreational facilities on the proposed public open space north of the church, which has not been taken into consideration.

As indicated at the previous Town Planning Committee meeting, a tour was arranged by Satterleys to acquaint the residents of Timberlands with the standard of development generally undertaken by the Satterley Group.

The tour was held on Saturday 15 July 1995 and was attended by seven residents; representatives from Satterleys and their Environmental Consultants, Councillor Cooper and myself.

During the tour and subsequent site inspection, a number of issues were discussed and there appeared to be general consensus from the residents that a satisfactory development would result. To achieve this, the development manager as outlined in his letter of 17 July 1995 (Appendix XXIII refers), has undertaken to create a landscaped wetland; introduce traffic management devices on Scenic Drive, which is the estate's primary entry road, provide uniform fencing and landscaping along the northern boundary of Lot 15, as well as circulating to the residents, concept plans of the drainage wetland area when this has been compoleted.

The plan forming Appendix XXIV hereto is the revised plan which shows the proposed entry from the entire estate to Calabrese Avenue thereby reducing the long-term traffic movement from the Scenic Drive entry.

They have also undertaken to develop this estate in a style and quality of the Beaumaris Estate at Iluka.

A further issue raised by an owner in Poinciana Place was the extent of filling that would occur and the effect that this would have on the adjoining properties. In this regard the developer manager undertook to ameliorate any nuisance by ensuring the filling material would be dampened and appropriate protective screens would be installed.

Cr Taylor entered the Chamber at this point, the time being $8.35\ \text{pm}.$

MOVED Cr Cooper, SECONDED Cr Wood that Council:

- finally adopts Amendment No 695 to Town Planning Scheme No 1 to rezone and recode Part Lot 15 Wanneroo Road, Wanneroo from Rural to Residential Development R5 and R15, subject to:
 - (a) preparation of a surface and groundwater and environmental management plans to the satisfaction of the Council, Department of Environmental Protection and the Water Authority of Western Australia;
 - (b) subject to (a) above, advise of Council's preference for the establishment of an artificial lake and wetland adjacent to the western boundary of the site for drainage disposal;
 - (c) commitments made by the developer manager in his letters of 20 June 1995 and 17 July 1995;
 - (d) traffic calming measures being implemented at the developer manager's cost, at the junction of Scenic Drive and the estate road, to the satisfaction of the City Engineer;
 - (e) the applicants undertaking to accommodate any changes required along the southern boundary as a result of the six weeks advertising period, arising from 2. below;
- 2 adopts the structure plan as submitted, in so far as it relates to Part Lot 15 Wanneroo Road, Wanneroo and

advertises the draft structure plan for the area bounded by Scenic Drive, Wanneroo Road, Calabrese Avenue and Ocean Reef Road, for a period of six weeks.

TP250-07/95 AMENDMENT NO 731 TO TOWN PLANNING SCHEME NO 1: STRUCTURE PLANNING - [790-731, 780-1, 319-7-1]

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT

In August 1994, the Alkimos-Eglinton Metropolitan Region Scheme Major Amendment took effect, resulting in substantial Urban and Central City Area zones being put in place over that area.

In November 1994, the main landowners in the Alkimos-Eglinton area, LandCorp and Eglinton Estates, together with their consultants, arranged a meeting with Council officers to discuss their intentions to commence development in that area in the near future (in about two years time). To facilitate that development, they proposed a planning mechanism similar to that applied to the Ellenbrook area in the Shire of Swan.

The City Planner reports on two new zones - a "Centre Zone" and an "Urban Zone", which are proposed together with a new part in the Scheme Text. The purpose is to establish procedures which will allow development to proceed according to Agreed Structure Plans. This will remove the need for Scheme Amendments to control the development in the new zones and will avoid unnecessary delays.

MOVED Cr Cooper, SECONDED Cr Magyar that Council supports Amendment No 731 to Town Planning Scheme No 1 to introduce structure planning provisions, a "Centre Zone" and an "Urban Development Zone".

TP251-07/95 MODIFICATION TO AMENDMENT NO 694 FOR RELOCATION OF PUBLIC OPEN SPACE WITHIN THE MEADOWLANDS

OF PUBLIC OPEN SPACE WITHIN THE MEADOWLANDS SPECIAL RURAL ZONE (NO 15) - [790-694]

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT

Amendment No 694 initiated in July 1992 (Item G20739 refers) seeks modification of the Meadowlands Special Rural Zone Development Guide Plan by relocating the public open space within this Special Rural Zone (No 15) from Lot 67 Zest Court to Part Lot 24 Timely Hostess Mews, Mariginiup.

In May of this year, the Government, through the Minister for Planning, presented to Parliament its response to the Select Committee Report on Metropolitan Development and Groundwater Supplies. The Government's response is generally supportive of the Select Committee's recommendations. The Minister for Planning and the Minister for Water Resources and the Environment have also now replied to Council's enquiry of earlier this year as to the Government's intentions for the Lake Pinjar area. Those intentions are consistent with the Government's response to the Select Committee report and essentially entail government acquisition of the privately owned land in the Priority One Source Protection Area which involves most of the Lake Pinjar area.

The City Planner reports on the Minister's statement and his letter which indicated that a senior government officer's working group will prepare an interim strategy to assist in dealing with development applications in sensitive groundwater areas (especially Lake Pinjar) in the short term. He advises

that this working group is still to commence work and expressed concern that Council will continue to receive applications in the Lake Pinjar area.

Cr Dammers declared an interest in this item.

MOVED Cr Waters, SECONDED Cr Freame that Council:

- generally supports the Government's response to the Select Committee's report;
- advises the Minister for Planning that to avoid prolonged uncertainty and anxiety for landowners in the Priority 1 areas, it is important that the review of Priority Area boundaries be completed as soon as possible and that for the finally determined priority 1 areas, it is made quite clear as to whether these areas are to be totally acquired as indicated in the Ministerial Statement, or whether there may be some prospect for continued private ownership and occupancy, depending upon compatibility of landowner land use intentions and groundwater protection requirements;
- advises the Ministry for Planning that Council wishes to see the interim strategy relating to development applications in Priority 1 Source Protection Areas, particularly the Lake Pinjar area, prepared by the Government working group as quickly as possible, and in the meantime, suggest than an understanding should be reached as a matter of urgency between the Ministry and Council as to how development applications should be handled prior to the interim strategy being in place;
- 4 seeks Council's involvement on the Working Group because of its long-term involvement and intimate knowledge of the areas involved.

That Council supports the request by the residents of Hurst Trail, Clarkson, for increasing the height of the fencing at the head of this cul-de-sac, such works to be at the applicant's expense.

- . Review of Proposed Changes to Environmental Conditions Gnangara Mound (GM) Groundwater Resources (Section 46).

The strategies proposed in each of the documents raise issues on which Council comment is considered appropriate

The City Planner makes comments on the two documents and concludes that the PWF strategy is an extremely significant initiative by WAWA in that it endeavours to set a strategic framework for future water supply development within a major part of the State and identifies the need for the community to tackle issues fundamental to the notion of ecologically/environmentally sustainable development.

The GM Groundwater allocation and management strategy effectively forms part of the PWF strategy and accordingly, sustainability related issues are also of relevance.

It is recommended that Council lodges submissions relating to these documents with the Environmental Protection Authority.

The City Planner submitted two recent reports from WA Water Authority which gives an overview of Perth's Water Future.

MANAGER'S REPORT

- (a) authorises affixation of the Common Seal to, and endorses the signing of, the amending documents;
- (b) forwards Amendment No 555 to the Hon Minister for endorsement for final approval and publication in the Government Gazette."
- 2 adopts the structure plan submitted by Gray & Lewis SP 1A (as revised March 1995) as the Development Guide Plan for Pt Lots 6 and 7 and Lots 100 and 24 Wanneroo Road, Kingsley;

The City Planner advised that the only way of obtaining an adequate degree of control and certainty that direct lot vehicular access on to Wanneroo Road will be able to be prevented is to put in place the Parks and Recreation reserve proposed under the amendment. The Commission has therefore been requested to seek the Minister's approval to re-advertising of Amendment 657 in its current form, for a minimum advertising period of 21 days.

CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT

For the past two summer seasons, an escalation in the practice of sandboarding has occurred within the City's dune systems. The concentration of this activity on specific dune faces and the increasing number of people participating is of great concern. Underpinning the growth in this activity is the high profile marketing of sandboards in surf shops and other retail outlets.

Destruction of dune vegetation and movement of dune sands is resulting in tens of thousands of dollars of additional dune repair expenditure each year. The allocation of specified sandboarding dunes earmarked for future development has been considered but is not a viable solution. It is not likely that participants in the activity will travel far to special sites and the maintenance of such sites would be a considerable liability to the City.

The City Engineer reports on the ongoing problems associated with the control of illegal sandboarding and suggests a number of strategies to reduce the effects of sandboarding on the coastal dune system.

MOVED Cr Moloney, SECONDED Cr Lynn that Council:

- 1 rejects minority pressure to create legal sandboarding
 sites and adopts a long term "No Sandboarding" policy
 within all dunes under Council's control;
- 2 endorses the drafting of a request to the Western Australian Municipal Association to make a recommendation to State Parliament, on Western Australia's Coastal Councils' behalf, to introduce legislation which enforces sandboarding manufacturers and retailers to permanently attach a message to sandboards along the lines of the following:
 - "Sandboarding is illegal in Western Australian coastal dune systems unless areas are signposted as dedicated sandboarding sites. Infringement penalties apply. Please respect the fragile nature of the State's coastal dune system";
- 3 endorses the strategic plan to draft and introduce a local law relating to sandboarding, as soon as the new Local Government Act is promulgated;
- 4 writes to the Ministers for the Environment and Sport and Recreation regarding the impact of sandboarding on the coastal dunal system;
- 5 awaits submission for establishment of a sandboarding park on private land.

CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT

A submission has been received from Nelson, Mardardy and Associates Pty Limited on behalf of Peet & Co for a feature street lighting scheme for the South Yanchep development.

A meeting with representatives from Mater Dai College, Edgewater Primary School, Wayde Smith MLA and Councillor Ewen-Chappell took place on 25 May 1995 when the need to 'traffic calm' the section of Treetop Avenue which passes both schools was identified.

The City Engineer reports on the results of a recent traffic survey which indicated the need to reduce the speed of traffic along Treetop Avenue. The recent installation of a roundabout at the junction of Treetop Avenue and Outlook Drive has addressed that issue and has provided a significant traffic calming effect near the Edgewater Primary School.

- lists in the 1996/97 year of the Traffic Management Forward Plan, the installation of a roundabout at the junction of Treetop Avenue and Pioneer Drive, Edgewater;

- 3 advises all interested parties accordingly.

Council, at its March 1995 meeting, resolved that a report be submitted on the cost and feasibility of providing limestone base to the rear accessway between Edward and Harris Streets on Pinjar Road, Mariginiup (Item TS91-03/95 refers). The laneway is a dedicated road.

The City Engineer provides background information to the subject matter and an assessment of the proposal. He considers the provision of \$12,000 for a limestone surface to the laneway is not warranted as utilisation of the laneway would be minimal.

The City Building Surveyor and the City Recreation and Cultural Services Manager report on the options to Council for the re-commissioning of the noise limiting apparatus and the lifting of the current 10.30 pm curfew on the hall.

CITY BUILDING SURVEYOR'S REPORT

Following the banning of the use of organochlorines after 30 June 1995, the National Registration Authority for Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals (NRA) announced that it had approved the use of DURSBAN PRE-CONSTRUCTION TERMITICIDE, the product will be sold by DowElanco (Australia). It contains the active ingredient chlorpyrifos.

The NRA has taken the unusual step of announcing the availability of DURSBAN PRE-CONSTRUCTION TERMITICIDE because of the urgent need for the building and pest control industries to be aware that an alternative to the organochlorines was now available. The chemical barrier would be used under the concrete floor slab, and in some proposals, around the edge of the house.

The City Building Surveyor provides background information to the subject matter and an assessment of the product. He reports that the organophosphates have a limited life span and will not extend for the life of a building and will require changes to the construction process to allow for re-treatment.

He advises that there are alternative physical barriers to force termites to the external walls of a building where their entry would be noticed and corrective action taken.

MOVED Cr Moloney, SECONDED Cr Lynn that Council, in considering applications for building licences:

- 1 refuses applications where chemical barriers are proposed that do not provide for effective re-treatment of the soil;
- 2 reviews its position with respect to chemical barriers following proposed amendments to the Building Regulations.

During Public Question Time at Council's meeting of 28 June 1995, the question of the City's response to the announcement of the resumption of French nuclear testing in the Pacific was raised.

Town Clerk reports that subsequent to Council's meeting, the WA Municipal Association has advised that two motions have been received for the LGA and CUCA Annual General Meetings to "condemn French nuclear testing on the Muroroa Atoll".

He outlined options for an appropriate response by Council.

TOWN CLERK'S REPORT recommended that Council:

- writes to the French Ambassador to Australia expressing, on behalf of the residents of Wanneroo, our strong opposition to the French Government's intention to resume nuclear testing at Muroroa Atoll;
- 2 communicates its position on the matter to the WA Municipal Association;
- 3 instructs its delegates to the LGA Annual General Meeting to vote in favour of the motion submitted by the City of Bunbury in respect of this matter and listed at Item 5.1 of the Agenda Paper.

Cr Magyar referred to papers he submitted to the Policy Committee of 21 June 1995, from People for Nuclear Disarmament (WA) "World Court Project" requesting public support and donations. He requested that this project be considered in conjunction with Report FA87-07/95 and asked that additional information be submitted for consideration of this matter at Full Council Meeting of 26 July 1995.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The Town Clerk reports, at the Policy Committee meeting of 21 June 1995, Councillor Magyar submitted papers from People for Nuclear Disarmament (WA) in respect of the "World Court Project". (Appendix XXVI refers).

As Report FA87-07/95 seeks an indication of Council's position on nuclear testing in the Pacific, it is perhaps appropriate to establish Council's overall position in relation to nuclear weapons.

The intention of the World Court Project is to obtain an advisory opinion from the World Court on the legal status of the threat or use of nuclear weapons under existing international law. The People for Nuclear Disarmament (WA) seek Council's endorsement of a Declaration of Public Conscience, stating that nuclear weapons are "morally wrong" and supporting the request for a World Court opinion. A copy of the declaration appears as Appendix XXVII.

It is noted that donations to the World Court Project are also invited. Given that defence is a Federal Government Role, it is considered unlikely that a donation to such a project would fall within the "purposes" of a local authority contemplated by the Local Government Act. Accordingly, it is considered appropriate to seek Ministerial consent to donate to the cause, should Council resolve to make a contribution.

MOVED Cr Magyar, SECONDED Cr Waters that Point 2 to the Recommendation to Report FA87-07/95 be deleted and the following points be inserted:

- "2 on behalf of the people of Wanneroo complete a
 "Declaration of Public Conscience" that it is this
 Council's deeply held belief that nuclear weapons are
 morally wrong, and that it supports the initiative to
 request an advisory opinion from the World Court on the
 legality of nuclear weapons;
- 3 urges its citizens to privately complete the "Declaration of Public Conscience";
- 4 writes to the Minister of Local Government requesting permission to donate \$100 to the World Court Project;
- 5 authorises its delegates to the North Metro Zone of the Local Government Association to move to amend the Motion on Item 5.1 to include:
- "4 WAMA on behalf of the people of Western Australia complete a "Declaration of Public conscience" that it is WAMA's deeply held belief that nuclear weapons are morally wrong, and that it supports the initiative to request an advisory opinion from the World Court on the legality of nuclear weapons";
- 6 on behalf of the people of Wanneroo, writes to Greenpeace expressing its thanks for its efforts to stop nuclear testing."

Discussion ensued. Cr Magyar, with the approval of Cr Waters, advised that he wished to have the Motion WITHDRAWN

CS122-07/95 SMOKE EMISSION - SOLID FUEL COMBUSTION STOVES [305-5, 865-3]

ACTING CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT

At its meeting on 21 June 1995 the Policy Committee requested a report to consider regulating or banning the use of solid fuel combustion stoves in populated areas.

The Acting City Environmental Health Manager reports that problems associated with smoke emissions from domestic chimneys and flues were first referred to the Environmental Protection Authority (now Department of Environmental Protection or DEP) by this City as early as September 1987. With the Health Act (1911) specifically excluding emissions from domestic chimneys the situation has remained unchanged since 1987, however, positive developments have occurred since then.

He advises that in April 1994 DEP commissioned a study known as the "Perth Haze Study" to compliment data already collected by a previous study on photochemical smog for the same area. The study is expected to qualify and quantify the extent of air pollution and to assist in firm initiatives to address emissions of solid fuel combustion along with other sources of air pollution.

As the Perth Haze Study is expected to conclude in October 1995, it is considered Council should await further developments after that date.

MOVED Cr Wood, SECONDED Cr Taylor that Council defers further submissions to the Department of Environmental Protection regarding solid fuel combustion heaters until after the Report and recommendations of the Perth Haze Study have been published.

CS123-07/95 REMOVAL OF ASBESTOS FROM A VACANT LOT [291/53/13]

ACTING CITY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER'S REPORT

On 26 May 1995 a Health Notice was issued to Bounders Green Pty Ltd requiring them, within seven days, to remove and correctly dispose of asbestos scattered throughout the vacant land at Lot 53 (13) Leach Street, Marmion.

The Acting City Environmental Health Manager submits background information to the subject matter and advises that two follow-up inspections by an Environmental Health Officer in June and July have revealed that clean-up operations had not occurred.

The Finance & Community Services Committee requested the Acting City Environmental Health Manager to approach Bounders Green Pty

Ltd to gain verification that the material had been disposed of at an approved site.

MOVED Cr Wood, SECONDED Cr Taylor that Council:

C362-07/95 ESTABLISHMENT OF HOUSE COMMITTEE - [200-0]

At Council's meeting of 28 June 1995 (Item FA65-06/95 refers) a report was requested on the possibility of establishing a House Committee. This report examines that proposal.

In the early 1980's, an informal arrangement was in place whereby the President, the Chairman of the Finance and Administrative Resources Committee, and the Shire Clerk formed an Occasional Committee to address minor matters of internal protocol, house style, approved function format and the like.

This arrangement continued, albeit on an ad hoc basis, at the discretion of the President/Mayor of the day.

The arrangement proved most useful on those occasions when matters required urgent discussion and, whilst not necessarily sensitive, were matters of a purely internal nature requiring input by both elected members and the administration. Matters that would require expenditure or the establishment of guidelines or policy were subsequently referred by the House Committee to the appropriate Standing Committee.

In the absence of a formal committee, these matters have generally been determined by the Town Clerk in consultation with the Mayor. It is considered that a formal mechanism should exist to address such matters. The creation of a House Committee as an Occasional Committee would provide for the timely consideration of minor "housekeeping" and internal protocol issues in an appropriate forum.

It should be noted that as an Occasional Committee, the House Committee may not enter into a contract or other commitment or undertaking without first having the express authority of the Council and further, remains fully answerable to the Council. (Section 179, Local Government Act 1960 as amended refers).

At the 28 June 1995 meeting of Council, committee representation was suggested as comprising the Mayor, the Deputy Mayor Councillor Freame, Councillor Lynn and Councillor Ewen-Chappell.

MOVED Cr Wood, SECONDED Cr Molonev that Council:

- establishes a House Committee as an Occasional Committee of Council, such committee being authorised to consider and determine minor matters relating to internal affairs, civic protocol and related issues;
- 2 appoints the Mayor, the Deputy Mayor Councillor Freame, Councillor Lynn and Councillor Ewen-Chappell to the House Committee.

C364-07/95 PARKING FACILITIES BY-LAWS - [920-5, 509-0-1]

Council amended its Parking Facilities By-laws in March 1994 to incorporate the symbolic signage associated with the Australian Standard AS1742.11. As part of this amendment, the definitions of "no parking area" and "no standing area" were limited only to "a portion of a carriageway" rather than the previous definition which incorporated "other areas where designated".

Legal advice from Kott Gunning confirms that the current definitions of "no parking area" and "no standing area" do not allow Council to enforce signs prohibiting parking and standing on street verges.

It has been recommended by Kott Gunning that the definitions of "no standing area" and "no parking area" be amended to read "means a portion of carriageway or verge that lies:...."

MOVED Cr Wood, SECONDED Cr Moloney that Council:

- 1 adopts the proposed amendments to its Parking Facilities By-laws as shown on Appendix III hereto;
- 2 authorises the affixation of the Common Seal to, and endorses the signing of, the By-law documents;
- 3 authorises administration action in accordance with Section 190 of the Local Government Act 1960 to have the proposed By-law amendment promulgated.

MINDARIE REGIONAL COUNCIL - AMENDMENT TO CONSTITUTION AND LEASE AGREEMENT FOR LOT 17 TAMALA PARK - [508-5-5]

The financial arrangements between the Cities of Perth, Stirling and Wanneroo in relation to the operation of the Mindarie Regional Council have been under active review for over two years. This has included changes required by the splitting of the City of Perth.

The main cause for the review was the City of Stirling wanting to change the original principles of relationship as it felt disadvantaged in having to contribute towards the capital infrastructure at Tamala Park in accordance with the original agreement.

In April, the Treasurers of the three Cities reached an agreement which was adopted by the Mindarie Regional Council. This related to the lease agreement for Tamala Park, financial managements and amendments to the Mindarie Regional Council Constitution.

Council has now been asked to formally support the changes to the lease agreement and the constitution.

LEASE

The lease agreement was originally set up with an annual rental of \$1.00 or an agreed fee with provision for a full commercial lease fee if there was a dispute between the Mindarie Regional Council and the owners. The three owners have not formally asked for the lease fee to be changed until now. The City of Stirling has been arguing that a full commercial fee should have been paid from when tipping commenced in 1991. It also provides for any surplus to become part of the lease fee. Due to higher than necessary tipping fees, the Regional Council has built up a surplus of over \$2 million.

The amendment sets the lease fee at:

- a \$854,182 for the period 1 July 1991 to 30 June 1994;
- b after 1 July 1994, the lease fee is calculated using a formula incorporating the original purchase value of the land and the two year bond rate set by the Reserve Bank of Australia.

This is considered to be a reasonable compromise to the conflict and deletes the reference to additional rent. The full amendment forms Appendix XIX hereto.

The Regional Council has resolved to approach the land owners in regard to the requirement in the "Criteria for Landfill Management" to maintain a 500m buffer to all tipping areas. Since we are processing a change to the lease agreement, this should be addressed.

An appropriate amendment would be to insert a new clause (13) to read:-

"13. Buffer Zone

In recognition of the Lessee's use of the leased land as a landfill site, the Lessor agrees not to develop other portions of the land currently forming Lot 17, Mindarie for uses that would conflict with the current and future buffer requirements set out by the appropriate State Government instrumentalities and the Regional Council's Environmental Management and Monitoring Programme as being required around the fill area and other activities on the leased land."

The long term impact of this change would be to delay subdivision of part of the northern portion of Lot 17 so that people do not end up living so close to the tip site that they can successfully agitate for its closure.

It must be considered very unlikely that land filling would be allowed west of Marmion Avenue. Connolly Drive and the land east of Connolly Drive are also not required for the operations of Tamala Park. There is a portion of land to be deleted from the south side of the lease area for a Water Authority reserve as per Council resolution TPT6-02/95.

It would be appropriate, per clause 11 of the lease, to delete these three areas from the lease. This would leave the Regional Council controlling the land inside its boundary fence and would allow these changes to all be processed at the one time.

CONSTITUTION

The change in the constitution firstly addresses the change in membership of the Regional Council. It splits the City of Perth's representation into four so that it and the three new Councils have one representative each. It also increases the membership for the Cities of Stirling and Wanneroo to four members. Council will need to nominate a fourth Councillor representative when the new constitution becomes effective.

The amendments also address the financial arrangements. Section 4A.1 clarifies the situation when a member municipality tips at another facility without the approval of the Mindarie Regional

Council. This is in line with the procedure and penalty paid by the City of Wanneroo when it tipped at Red Hill for a short period.

It also clarifies that the member Councils are responsible for the capital and interest payments on loans raised by the Mindarie Regional Council and specifically charged to the account of the municipalities.

This requires some clarity as the Mindarie Regional Council is considering secondary treatment systems that could require loans of up to \$40\$ million.

The proposed amendments are shown in Appendix XX and the resulting full constitution in Appendix XXI.

CONFLICT

The City of Stirling currently has a contract until the year 2004 to tip at the Yirrigan tip site. The Mindarie Regional Council has given the City of Stirling permission to use alternative facilities despite the resulting higher tip fees required from the other member Councils. The above amendments are an attempt to rationalise the financial contributions and benefits for the various parties and equitably address the concerns of the City of Stirling.

Legal advice is that the Mindarie Regional Council can revoke the approval for Stirling to tip other than at Tamala Park at any time.

There has been statements from the City of Stirling indicating that it is considering not supporting the above amendments because it would be financially better off with a strict legal interpretation of the original agreements.

This situation exists because of the Mindarie Regional Council budget surplus from overcharging tipping Councils and the failure of the Regional Council to have the member municipalities pay the capital and interest payments on the loans. These factors would not be a problem if all members of the Regional Council were tipping at Tamala Park.

If the City of Stirling is not willing to support the proposed amendments, then it would be appropriate for it to become a tipping member at Tamala Park. The City of Stirling Council meets twice a month, so it would have ample opportunity to fully assess its position by 1 October 1995.

Council needs to be aware that the City of Stirling has expressed a long term interest in using the Yirrigan facility

and may feel that the financial commitments to the Mindarie Regional Council may become onerous, particularly in light of possible future loans for secondary treatment systems. This could result in it wanting to leave the Mindarie Regional Council. This would have a number of repercussions, including buying out Stirling's interest in the Mindarie Regional Council and the possible need to purchase some or all of its interest in Lot 17.

MOVED Cr Wood, SECONDED Cr Moloney that Council:

- advises the Mindarie Regional Council that it agrees to the proposed amendments to the Mindarie Regional Council constitution, as detailed in Appendix XX hereto and authorises the affixation of the common seal to the amended constitution for the Mindarie Regional Council and endorses the signing of the documents;
- advises the Mindarie Regional Council that it agrees to the proposed amendments to the lease agreement for Lot 17 Mindarie, as detailed in Appendix XIX hereto and authorises the affixation of the common seal to the lease amendments and endorses the signing of the documents;
- 3 advises the Mindarie Regional Council and the Cities of Perth and Stirling that it proposes an amendment to the lease for Lot 17 Mindarie:
 - (a) to insert a new clause (13) to read:

"13. Buffer Zone

In recognition of the Lesse's use of the leased land as a landfill site, the Lessor agrees not to develop other portions of the land currently forming Lot 17, Mindarie for uses that would conflict with the current and future buffer requirements set out by the appropriate State Government instrumentalities and the Regional Council's Environmental Management and Monitoring Programme as being required around the fill area and other activities on the leased land."

- (b) under clause 11 to amend the lease area to delete:
 - (i) the land west of Marmion Avenue;
 - (ii) the land east of Connolly Drive;

- (iii) the portion of land proposed for a Water Authority reserve on portion of the southern boundary;
- 4 appoints Councillor Waters as a representative on the Mindarie Regional Council to be effective when the amendments to the constitution are assented to by the Governor;
- The City of Wanneroo representatives on the Mindarie Regional Council be authorised that in the event of the City of Stirling not supporting the amendments of the lease and constitution, it moves a motion for the Mindarie Regional Council to revoke, effective 1 October 1995 or appropriate date, the permission for the City of Stirling to tip anywhere except at Tamala Park.

C366-07/95 PROPOSED MEETING WITH MINISTER FOR FAMILY AND CHILDREN'S SERVICES - [012-0-1]

As Councillors are aware, the City is committed to facilitating a co-ordinated approach to the planning and development of the provision of human services particularly in the new and developing suburbs of the municipality.

To this end Council has agreed to create a new position of Human Services Planning Co-ordinator and in addition has recently endorsed a comprehensive youth policy that highlights its role in the co-ordination and planning of youth services.

Over the past year or so, the Minister for Family and Children's Services, Hon Roger Nicholls MLA, has made a number of decisions that impact on the people of Wanneroo and in some cases, will significantly disrupt plans being made at the local level.

The Integrated Human Services Planning project and the recently endorsed Youth Services Policy have highlighted the City of Wanneroo's role in co-ordination and planning of services on behalf of its residents and it is imperative that Council seek to establish an effective working relationship with the Minister.

Some decisions would appear to have been made without clear reference to local circumstances and without any prior warning that they were being considered. It is therefore essential that a constructive relationship be developed with the Minister to ensure Council's crucial role in human services planning is taken into account in the decision making processes of the Minister.

MOVED Cr Wood, SECONDED Cr Moloney that:

- 1 Council seeks a deputation with the Hon Roger Nicholls MLA, Minister for Family and Children's Services to:
 - (a) discuss Council's concerns and to draw to his attention the local consequences of some of the decisions made by his office and Department;
 - (b) acquaint him with Council's planning processes and the co-ordinated planning that occurs at the local level:
 - (c) seeks his agreement to a co-operative planning process in which the City participates in policy and service planning decisions that affect its residents;
 - (d) identify basic processes for managing a co-operative planning process;
- 2 the deputation consists of the Mayor, Cr A Dammers, Cr B Cooper, Cr A Hall, the Town Clerk and Manager - Welfare Services.
