# MINUTES OF TOWN PLANNING COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON 07 AUGUST 1995

The Minutes of Town Planning Committee Meeting held 07 August 1995 were confirmed as a true and correct record.

### PETITIONS AND DEPUTATIONS

DEPUTATION - PROPOSED RURAL SHED OUTSIDE OF BUILDING ENVELOPE -LOT 107 LEACH WAY, GNANGARA - [30/5105]

Mr B Sexton addressed the Committee in relation to the proposed rural shed outside of building envelope - Lot 107 Leach Way, Gnangara - Item TP307-09/95 refers. Mr Sexton explained that his wife had made the application as she was the registered owner of the block and submitted information in relation to this property. He gave an overview of the situation regarding the main reasons people purchase property within the rural area.

In reply to recommendations made at the last Council meeting on 26 July 1995, his main points were:

- 1 The shed was to be colorbond (green), not zincalume;
- 2 The only clearing required is for the shed base as the existing access drive, firebreak and an existing bush track have already been cleared;
- 3 An undesirable precedent has already been set by other premises in the area around Lake Gnangara;
- 4 The interpretation of Special Rural Zone conditions is not very explicit.

Mr Sexton requires the shed as he makes furniture and so has a lot of timber. He also works on small cars.

He said he would be prepared to implement an environmental study with the outcome to be a quality natural bush block.

Following questions from Councillors, the Chairman thanked Mr Sexton for addressing the Committee and advised that the matter would be considered later in the meeting.

DEPUTATION - PROPOSED TRANSPORT DEPOT, LOT 36 (129) TRICHET ROAD, WANNEROO - [30/5202]

Mr Chris Warrener of Land Planning Consultants, on behalf of the owner, Mr Ritchie, addressed the Committee in relation to the proposed transport depot, Lot 36 (129) Trichet Road, Wanneroo - Item TP328-09/95 refers.

Mr Warrener gave an overview of the situation regarding the proposed transport depot and spoke of the ambiguity of definition of "transport depot".

He outlined the types of vehicles/equipment kept at the property and made the following comments:

 Market gardeners in the area have trucks on their properties for the working of market gardens;

- Properties in the area were "working" rural rather than "rural lifestyle";
- Mr & Mrs Ritchie require to keep trucks on their property for security reasons;
- There were few truck movements from the property;
- Other trucks are based at Canning Vale;
- Mr Ritchie is away from between 3 8 months of the year;
- Complaints regarding trucks left running early in mornings are inaccurate;
- Vehicle repairs are carried out off-site;
- The trucks are located 25 metres off the road and have good natural screening in front of them. Mr Ritchie has offered to landscape the area between the property so that the view will be further obscured by trees.
- Mr Ritchie intends retiring in 5 years time and is not proposing to expand his business or buy any more trucks.

## TP305-09/95 PLANNING LEGISLATION AMENDMENT BILL 1995 - [970-3]

## CITY PLANNER'S REPORT

The Planning Legislation Amendment Bill 1995 was introduced into Parliament on Thursday 29 June 1995. The implications on the local government planning process and its operation generally have been assessed with a view to a Council position on the matter being conveyed to the State Government through the Western Australiam Municipal Association.

The City Planner reports that the Bill is aimed at bringing the planning and environmental evaluation procedures together at an early stage of the planning process and providing the Environmental Protection Authority with powers under the Environmental Protection Act to assess the environmental issues raised by Town Planning Schemes (and amendments to Schemes).

He provides background information and an assessment of the Bill. He comments that although it is imperative that local government remains committed to the overall objective to integrate the environmental and planning process and thus tramlined planning approval process, to do so at the risk of ceasing/delaying development in Western Australia and/or subject to a financial burden which is both inequitable and uncertain could not be supported.

MOVED Cr Cooper, SECONDED Cr O'Grady that Council:

acknowledges the Western Australian Municipal Association's (WAMA) position on the Planning legislation Amendment Bill as follows:

"That Local Government is outraged about the lack of meaningful consultation on the Legislation and the failure to address concerns identified by the WAMA Working Group (and summarised in Report TP305-09/95). In this respect, the progress of the Legislation should be delayed for as long as is necessary to properly address the concerns and the Hon Minister should accept the responsibility for facilitating meaningful consultation with Local Government";

supports the continued negotiation of the local government position on the legislation which:

- (a) clearly differentiates the role of local government from that of the developer in the case of being a "proponent" in the environmental assessment process;
- (b) removes inequitable financial implications from local government, particularly non-metropolitan local governments;
- (c) streamlines current delays in the planning approval process;
- (d) requires all environmental concerns to be addressed prior to the issue of planning consent or subdivision approval;
- (e) provides certainty and confidence in the land use planning process;
- (f) clearly sets out protocols for the implementation of the legislation, incorporated in legislation or regulation.

CARRIED

TP306-09/95 PROPOSED LANDSDALE SHOPPING CENTRE, LOTS 2 AND 3 (182) WANNEROO ROAD, WANNEROO - REQUEST FOR RELAXATION OF RETAIL CAR PARKING STANDARDS -[30/1031]

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT

1

Council has received a request from Coney Project Management for a reduction in Council's retail carparking standard from eight bays per  $100m^2$  of gross leasable area (GLA) to seven bays per  $100m^2$  GLA.

The City Planner provides background information on the development application and also gives details of a report into retail carparking in the City of Wanneroo which was submitted to Council at its June 1987 meeting.

He comments that as there has been no specific assessment of car parking demand for this centre and the developer is not constrained in terms of land to provide for the normal standard, it is inappropriate to grant the relaxation at this time.

He also advises that as it has always been the desire of the owners to increase the size of the centre at some stage in the future, it may be appropriate to consider granting a car parking relaxation, if properly justified, at a future stage of development.

Cr Cooper declared an interest in this item.

MOVED Cr Wood, SECONDED Cr Curtis that Council:

- 1 does not grant the request by Coney Project Management on behalf of Tah Land Pty Ltd for a reduction in the retail carparking standard for the Landsdale District Centre on Lots 2 and 3 Wanneroo Road, Landsdale, for the following reasons:
  - it has not been adequately demonstrated that a car parking relaxation is appropriate in this instance;
  - (b) sufficient land exists to provide for car parking in accordance with the City's current 8 bays per 100m<sup>2</sup> Gross Leasable Area requirement;
- 2 advises the applicant that it will consider a properly justified car parking relaxation as part of a future stage of development once the operating patterns for this centre and therefore car parking demand can be more accurately assessed.

CARRIED

Cr Cooper did not vote.

## TP307-09/95 PROPOSED RURAL SHED OUTSIDE OF BUILDING ENVELOPE - LOT 107 LEACH WAY, GNANGARA - [30/5105]

An application has been received from Ms Vasilka Liakos for a large shed to be located outside of the building envelope designated for her property at Lot 107 Leach Way, Gnangara. Lot 107 is located within Special Rural Zone No 25 which places emphasis on the retention of vegetation and the preservation of the rural/natural landscape.

The City Planner provides background information to the subject matter and an assessment of the proposal.

He reports that the proposed  $19m \times 12m \propto 6m$  zincalume shed would require the clearing of  $230m^2$  of native vegetation together with land required for access. He considers that the location of the proposed shed and the clearing of native vegetation would detract from the visual amenity of the area.

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT recommended that Council refuses the application for a rural shed on Lot 107 (29) Leach Way, Gnangara, as submitted by Mr V Liakos on the following grounds:

- 1 the proposed shed is outside the designated building envelope;
- 2 the proposed shed would detract from the existing landscape and the visual amenity of the area;
- 3 the construction of the proposed shed and access thereto would result in the removal of native vegetation;
- 4 the proposal would result in an undesirable precedent for the area.

MOVED Cr Cooper, SECONDED Cr O'Grady that consideration of the application for a rural shed on Lot 107 (29) Leach Way, Gnangara, as submitted by Ms V Liakos be deferred pending consideration of the additional information submitted by Mr B Sexton.

## TP308-09/95 PROPOSED 342 CARAVAN PARK AND ASSOCIATED FACILITIES ON LOT 4 (187) LAKELANDS DRIVE, GNANGARA - [30/5113]

## CITY PLANNER'S REPORT

An application has been submitted by Meyer Shircore & Associates on behalf of Glenister West Coast Pty Ltd, Glenister Investments Pty Ltd and Glenister Holdings Pty Ltd for a proposed caravan park on Lot 4 (187) Lakelands Drive, Gnangara. The City Planner provides background information to the subject matter and an assessment of the proposal. He advises that although the use is classified "AA" in the Rural zone, the proposal is considered inappropriate in this instance.

Cr Taylor declared an interest in this item.

MOVED Cr Cooper, SECONDED Cr Waters that Council refuses the application submitted by Meyer Shircore and Associates on behalf of Glenister West Coast Pty Ltd, Glenister Investments Pty Ltd and Glenister Holdings Pty Ltd for extensions to Lakelands Caravan Park on Lot 4 (187) Lakelands Drive, Lakelands as:

- 1 the development is inappropriate to the location and zoning as it represents an extensive medium density residential development;
- 2 the land use intensity and consequent traffic generation that would result from the proposal would significantly reduce the rural integrity and amenity of the area;
- 3 the proposal's demand for infrastructure and services is far larger than that provided for, proposed to be provided for or expected in a Rural zone;
- 4 the majority of the site is subject to periodic inundation/waterlogging;
- 5 environmentally the site is not capable of supporting the proposal without susceptibility to extensive damage;
- 6 the proposal is not in accordance with Council's minimum policy or By-law requirements;
- 7 approval to the proposal would create an undesirable precedent.

CARRIED

Cr Taylor did not vote.

TP309-09/95 ALKIMOS-EGLINTON - REZONING OF LAND UNDER COUNCIL'S TOWN PLANNING SCHEME NO 1 TO URBAN DEVELOPMENT ZONE AND ADOPTION OF DISTRICT 'STRATEGY' PLAN - [790-739, 319-7-1]

Feilman Planning Consultants have submitted an application on behalf of LandCorp and Eglinton Estates, for the rezoning of substantial areas of land at Alkimos and Eglinton for urban development. The City Planner provides background details and summarises the current rezoning application, which is supported by a District 'Strategy' (Structure) Plan. He also outlines the issues of concern, and proposes appropriate procedures for dealing with this application.

He comments that the amendment sought should not be initiated until such time as the appropriate matters have been the subject of adequate environmental assessment.

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT recommended that Council:

- 1 endorses officers request to Feilman Planning
  Consultants to:
  - (a) provide the consent of affected owners to rezoning/structure planning;
  - (b) justify the extent of Urban Development zoning for the site, particularly over land included in the MRS amendments as reserves, private recreation zones and Central City Zone;
  - provide advice as to landowners proposals for the acquisition and construction of important regional roads;
- 2 confirms that the following issues require an adequate level of environmental assessment prior to Council considering initiating the amendment sought:
  - the precise location of the foreshore reserve/ urban development zone boundary that will provide an adequate buffer to Karli Spring;
  - (b) appropriate development densities and capacities for the areas upgradient of Karli Spring;
  - (c) identification of areas of significant flora not included in regional reserves;
- 3 requests the Ministry for Planning (in consultation with the City) to clarify appropriate procedures for environmental assessment, particularly of issues of regional/district concern; given the current proposed legislative initiatives to combine planning and environmental legislation;
- 4 prepares a further report to Council on receipt of the above advice.

### COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1 endorses officers request to Feilman Planning Consultants to:
  - (a) provide the consent of affected owners to rezoning/structure planning;
  - (b) justify the extent of Urban Development zoning for the site, particularly over land included in the MRS amendments as reserves, private recreation zones and Central City Zone;
  - (c) provide advice as to landowners proposals for the acquisition and construction of important regional roads;
- 2 confirms that the following issues require an adequate level of environmental assessment prior to Council considering initiating the amendment sought:
  - the precise location of the foreshore reserve/ urban development zone boundary that will provide an adequate buffer to Karli Spring;
  - (b) appropriate development densities and capacities for the areas upgradient of Karli Spring;
  - (c) identification of areas of significant flora not included in regional reserves;
  - (d) buffer requirements in respect of the Water Authority sewerage and groundwater treatment plant sites;
- 3 requests the Ministry for Planning (in consultation with the City) to clarify appropriate procedures for environmental assessment, particularly of issues of regional/district concern; given the current proposed legislative initiatives to combine planning and environmental legislation;
- 4 prepares a further report to Council on receipt of the above advice.

## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The City Planner advised that the consultants for the owner had requested several matters be reconsidered. He requested this

item be deferred and referred back to Town Planning Committee for further consideration.

MOVED Cr Cooper, SECONDED Cr Waters that consideration of this matter be deferred and a further report be submitted to Town Planning Committee dealing with matters raised by the consultants.

## CITY PLANNER'S REPORT

  - (a) Council does not support the rezoning of portions of Pt Lot 402 and 500 Hartman Drive as proposed, but rather, has initiated a Light Industrial zoning for the reasons described in Report TP310-09/95. It should also be noted that unless LandCorp can show sufficient justification why a

General Industrial zoning would be appropriate in this location, Council is not prepared to alter its position;

- (b) in the interest of facilitating the development of the area, it has resolved to seek the amendment on the basis as described above, however, before granting final approval to Amendment No 717 it will require:
  - an approved local structure plan for the area bounded by Hartman Drive, Ocean Reef Road, Mirrabooka Avenue and Gnangara Road;
  - (ii) a letter of undertaking being submitted from LandCorp stating that it will make the necessary infrastructure contributions for the subject cell on the basis as set out in the WAPC letter to Council dated 3 May 1994. CARRIED

MOVED Cr Cooper, SECONDED Cr O'Grady that Council defers consideration of rezoning and recoding of portion of Pt Lot M1362 Whitfords Avenue, Hillarys from Hotel to Residential R40 for one month pending enquiries with Ministry of Sport and Recreation as to the long term plans for Ern Halliday Camp Site. ## TP313-09/95 PROPOSED REZONING AND RECODING OF LOTS 2 AND 4 PRIEST ROAD, LANDSDALE - [790-599, 790-699]

### CITY PLANNER'S REPORT

Amendment No 599 proposes to rezone/recode Lots 2 and 4 Priest Road, Landsdale from Rural to Residential Development R20. Amendment No 699 proposes to subsequently recode a portion of Lot 4 to R40.

- 2 the Water Authority of Western Australia undertakes to resolve the matter concerning the compensation with the three owner-Councils;
- 3 the Water Authority of Western Australia meets all survey/subdivision costs involved.

# TP323-09/95 MINDARIE KEYS: TERMINATION OF PROJECT AGREEMENT [740-1]

The State Government and the owners of the Mindarie Keys project, Gumflower Pty Ltd and Mindarie Investment Pty Ltd, seek Council's agreement to an assigning of Mindarie Investment's interest in the project to Gumflower Pty Ltd and subsequently a termination of the 1985 "State Agreement" regarding the project which this City is a party to, along with the State Government and the Landowners concerned.

The City Planner provides background details of the project and an assessment of the obligations made by the landowners to the Council. He advises that these obligations were fulfilled with the exception of the construction of a pedestrian underpass under Marmion Avenue, south of its intersection with Anchorage Drive.

He also reports that a concern to Council relates to the breakwaters, as under the State Agreement, the landowner is obliged to maintain them until 1998. The breakwaters are included within Crown Reserve 41659 which was vested in Council in 1991.

He recommends that Council not agree to the termination of the State Agreement until the State Government gives Council an undertaking that it will accept a joint vesting of Reserve 41659 such that the State will be responsible for maintenance of the breakwaters.

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT recommended that Council agrees to the deeds to assign the interests of Mindarie Investment Pty Ltd in the Mindarie Keys project to Gumflower Pty Ltd and to terminate the Mindarie Keys State Agreement, subject to:

- 1 the City Planner, on advice from Council's solicitors, being satisfied that the security provided in respect of the obligation to construct the Marmion Avenue underpass is adequately protected;
- 2 the Minister for Transport providing an undertaking that the State Government will accept a joint vesting with the City for Reserve 41659 such that the State will accept maintenance responsibility for the Mindarie Keys breakwaters in perpetuity, once that obligation upon the operator of the harbour ceases.

### COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

That Council agrees to the deeds to assign the interests of Mindarie Investment Pty Ltd in the Mindarie Keys project to Gumflower Pty Ltd and to terminate the Mindarie Keys State Agreement, subject to:

- 1 the City Planner, on advice from Council's solicitors, being satisfied that the security provided in respect of the obligation to construct the Marmion Avenue underpass is adequately protected;
- 2 the Minister for Transport providing an undertaking that the State Government will accept a joint vesting with the City for Reserve 41659 such that the State will accept maintenance responsibility for the Mindarie Keys

breakwaters in perpetuity, once that obligation upon the operator of the harbour ceases;

3 the public open space on the north-west corner of Marmion Avenue and Anchorage Drive being developed to the satisfaction of the City Parks Manager.

## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The City Planner advises that Part 2 of the current recommendation deals with the issue of long term maintenance responsibility for the breakwaters. It recommends that Council require an undertaking from the Minister for Transport that the State will accept a joint vesting of the reserve encompassing the breakwater for this purpose, and that this be a condition of Council's approval to the Termination Deed.

The above position had been provisionally conveyed to the Mindarie Keys owner's solicitors, Deacons Graham & James (formerly Sly & Weigal) who had in turn proposed to the Department of Transport (DOT) that a deed be prepared to satisfy Council. The solicitors have now advised that DOT and Crown Law are instead looking to vary the Termination Deed to cover this matter. We will not know if this is acceptable or not until we have had a chance to see the exact nature of the change proposed to the Termination Deed and have sought Council's solicitors' opinion on it.

In the meantime, to allow the City further flexibility in being able to deal with this matter, it would be appropriate if Part 2 of the current recommendation before Council had the following wording added to it:

> "..., or the Termination Deed being amended to the satisfaction of the City Planner, upon advice from Council's solicitors, in a manner which achieves the same outcome in terms of the State's responsibility for maintenance of the breakwaters".

# TP324-09/95 PROPOSED CLOSURE OF MILITARY ROAD, YANCHEP [510-0]

Council, at its meeting on 28 June 1995 (Item TP222-06/95 refers) resolved to advertise the proposed closure of a portion of Military Road, Yanchep.

The City Planner provides background details of the subject matter. He reports that at the close of the thirty-five day advertising period no objections were received to the proposed closure and the Minister for Lands should now be requested to close the road.

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT recommended that Council requests the Hon Minister for Lands to close the portion of Military Road, Yanchep within the City of Wanneroo's boundary in accordance with Section 288A of the Local Government Act.

### COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

That consideration of the closure of portion of Military Road, Yanchep be deferred pending investigation of land tenure adjoining Military Road and the correct location of the City's northern boundary.

### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The Town Planning Committee, at its meeting on 11 September 1995 resolved to defer consideration of the closure of portion of Military Road, Yanchep pending investigation of land tenure adjoining Military Road and the correct location of the City's northern boundary.

The City Planner advises that the Department of Land Administration has confirmed that the land surrounding the portion of Military Road to be closed is State Forest No 65 and that no freehold or Crown leasehold lots are reliant on the road for legal access. A senior officer from the Department of Conservation and Land Management has advised that there are hobby farms along Military Road, however they are further north of the State Forest and the road being closed. The hobby farms would therefore be serviced by the proposed Boronia Road and the balance of Military Road. The Quarry Reserve 39413 is vested in CALM who has supported the closure of the road.

The Council boundaries shown on the plan attached to Report TP324-09/95 have been checked and are correct. A plan is attached showing the amendments to the Local Authority boundary since 1923, (Appendix XXXXII refers).

The Shire of Gingin requested the road to be closed as the public use of the road is increasing to such an extent that considerable funds are required for the upgrading of the road. It is proposed to construct and use a forestry road known as Boronia Road as an alternative route as this would save a few kilometres of unsealed surface. The portion of Military Road being closed will be used by CALM as a fire access route.

MOVED Cr O'Grady, SECONDED Cr Waters that Council requests the Hon Minister for Lands to close the portion of Military Road, Yanchep within the City of Wanneroo's boundary in accordance with Section 288A of the Local Government Act.

The City Planner provides background information for the proposal and an evaluation of the submissions received. He reports on the development of Bowling Greens and Tennis Courts at Craigie Open Space and comments on the petition received objecting to Council's decision to consider the establishment of additional recreation facilities.

He suggests that a 'concept "option" plan' be prepared to include a 'golf novelty game', a 'golf driving range and associated practice facilities' and 'field archery' in addition to tennis courts/bowling greens as previously determined by Council. Club Golf Pty Ltd, Sunstate Pty Ltd, World Pitch and Putt Co Ltd, Target Golf International and Busselton Archery are recommended to be invited to submit detailed proposals.

MOVED Cr Cooper, SECONDED Cr O'Grady that Council:

- 1 receives the thirteen submissions received in response to its advertising inviting registrations of interest to establish, lease and operate a commercially based golf orientated or other recreation facility on part of Reserve 32858 Craigie;
- 2 writes to the Commissioner of Main Roads Western Australia requesting amalgamation of the surplus Freeway reserve area, (if any) situated at the north-western corner of Mitchell Freeway and Whitfords Avenue with the Craigie Open Space on Reserve 32858 vested in the City of Wanneroo;
- 3 receives the "Concept Option Plan" and "Case 1 'Least' Land Requirement" plan shown at Attachment Nos 12 and 13 to Report TP327-09/95 for the purpose of allowing detailed proposals to be invited on the basis of particular sites for developments, noting that these preliminary plans do not represent any commitments by the Council to the particular facilities shown, or the matter of the overall future of the Craigie Open Space;
- 4 sends notices to the following proponents, along with the Concept 'Option' Plan mentioned at (3) above, inviting them to submit detailed proposals pursuant to the Local Government Tenders for Contracts Regulations, such proposals to specifically address social equity, environmental and economic issues arising from their proposals:
  - (a) Club Golf P/L;
  - (b) Sunstate P/L;
  - (c) World Pitch and Putt Cor Ltd;
  - (d) Target Golf International;
  - (e) Busselton Archery Park
  - following receipt and assessment of the detailed proposals referred to in (4) above, prepares a

'preferred' preliminary concept plan for the Craigie Open Space to be released for public comment;

6 further considers the 309 signature petition received regarding the Craigie Open Space at the time of considering the public comments received arising from (5) above, noting that a final concept plan will be prepared in conjunction with consideration of the public comments and the finalising of negotiations with the proponents (if proposals are to be accepted) and that the proposed extent of any further development of the reserve will be determined by Council at that time. CARRED

## TP328-09/95 PROPOSED TRANSPORT DEPOT, LOT 36 (129) TRICHET ROAD, WANNEROO - [30/5202]

## CITY PLANNER'S REPORT

Land Planning Consultants on behalf of L D Ritchie seek Council approval for a Transport Depot on Lot 36 (129) Trichet Road, Wanneroo. The application is the result of Council action after receiving a complaint on 4 May 1995, alleging that the owners were using the property as a Transport Depot.

The City Planner provides background details to the subject matter. He reports that Lot 26 Trichet Road is 4.0469ha and is zoned Rural. He considers the site is over-developed and the business inappropriate to the location. If approval was to be considered it should be subject to 30 days advertising and no objections being received.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1 refuses the application for a Transport Depot on Lot 36 (129) Trichet Road, Wanneroo submitted by Land Planning Consultants on behalf of L D Ritchie as:
  - (a) the transport depot land use is not suited to the area;
  - (b) the scale of current business is above that normally expected within a rural zoning and better located within an industrial zone;

- (c) controls and monitoring of suggested start times and noise controls could not be implemented realistically;
- (d) the adjoining strata owner objects to the application;
- (e) the application's approval would create a precedent for other activities of this nature;
- (f) the proposal has a negative impact on the amenity of the area;
- 2 requests the owners of Lot 36 (129) Trichet Road, Wanneroo, Mr L D and Mrs S Ritchie, to cease the use of the property as a transport depot, on a permanent basis, within 28 days of notification;
- 3 refers the matter to its solicitors for legal action, if the use continues beyond the notified time.

### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The City Planner advises that he has had discussions with Council's solicitors who have indicated that there is a potential problem with the activity because of the strata title arrangement between the objector and the proponent in that the development is proposed on land that is on common property technically owned by both parties.

Following discussions with Council's solicitors it is considered that this matter be deferred with a view to preparing a policy for Council to consider in relation to commercial vehicles in the Rural Zones. It may also be wise to address the question in the Special Rural Zones and the Special Residential Zones in order to prepare a comprehensive policy. The following recommendation is therefore proposed.

MOVED Cr Cooper, SECONDED Cr Waters that Council defers consideration of the application for a Transport Depot on Lot 36 (129) Trichet Road, Wanneroo submitted by Land Planning Consultants on behalf of L D Ritchie pending receipt of a policy which may assist Council in making a determination on this matter.

## TP329-09/95 PROPOSED RETAINING WALLS OVER 2 METRES IN HEIGHT - MACQUARIE HEIGHTS SUBDIVISION, LOT 31 (694) WANNERCO ROAD, HOCKING - [740-94871]

Gutteridge Haskins & Davey Consulting Engineers, on behalf of AHL Holdings Pty Ltd, propose to construct a retaining wall exceeding 2 metres in height in Stage 1 of the Macquarie Heights subdivision, whereas the City Building Surveyor is authorised to approve retaining walls up to 2 metres in height.

The City Planner reports that the additional height difference of 0.2 metres will have no significant impact on the amenity of the proposed lots. He provides background details of the subject land and the proposal for a Golf and Archery Park on it. He comments that the archery park component of the application is not a prescribed use and its land use intensity is higher than golf and is therefore not supported.

He advises that privacy of local residents abutting Lot 152 will be protected by the 20m setback from fairways and the landscaping within these setbacks. The land use is private Recreation - Golf only under the Development Guide Plan and the proposed golf activity can be accommodated on this site.

MOVED Cr Cooper, SECONDED Cr O'Grady that Council:

- 1 refuses the archery park component of the application submitted for Lot 152 (135) Lakelands Drive by Kevin Mahney Australian Golf Masters Pty Ltd on behalf of T and K Fedys as:
  - (a) the use does not comply with the Development Guide Plan for Special Rural Zone No 7;
  - (b) the use and resultant traffic generation is considered too intense for this lot and would detract from the amenity of the locality;
- 2 approves the golf and associated facilities component of the application submitted on Lot 152 (135) Lakelands Drive by Kevin Mahney Australian Golf Masters Pty Ltd on behalf of T and K Fedys, subject to:
- amended plans being received that comply with all Council's requirements with regard to setbacks and car parking;
  - (b) appropriate approvals being received from the Department of Environmental Protection and the Western Australian Water Authority;
  - (c) other standard and appropriate conditions. CARRIED

The offers from both gentlemen were presented to the meeting of the Finance and Community Services Committee on 18 September 1995. Report CS171-09/95 recommended that Council awards a "Licence to Occupy" at a fee of \$185 per week to the "Wanneroo Coffee Lounge" as payment for the hire of the klosk facility in accordance with the attached licence, subject to planning approval being granted.

A further condition was added to that recommendation by the Finance and Community Services Committee. It was considered necessary that Ministerial approval be granted for these arrangements under Section 267 of the Local Government Act 1960.

Following consultation, the Town Clerk is of the opinion that because of the approach from Mr Wittkamp properly, the lease of the klosk should be advertised inviting public tenders. This additional effluent disposal will require prior approval, and inspection upon installation, by Council's Health Department in accordance with the above Regulations.
- 3 In the case of existing "alternating" septic systems, when requested by an Environmental Health Officer, exposure by the applicant of the lids of each tank/soakwell/leach drain, sufficient to confirm their precise location.

# C457-09/95 NORTHERN METROPOLITAN REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT ORGANISATION - LOCAL GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATION -[312-2, 320-0]

The WA Municipal Association has been approached by the Northern Metropolitan Regional Development Organisation (NMRDO) to solicit nominations for local government representation on the NMRDO Steering Committee.

In December 1994 Council nominated Cr Cooper for appointment to the interim RDO Steering Committee which had oversight for the establishment of the Northern Metropolitan RDO. Cr Cooper was successful in obtaining appointment to that interim committee and has subsequently been appointed by virtue of his standing in the business community as a member of the Northern Metropolitan RDO Board.

WAMA now seeks nominations to fill two vacancies as local government representatives. The basic qualification for nominees is an interest and/or experience in regional development initiatives or regional and industrial growth. The initial term is 1 year, renewable up to a 3 year term, commencing in October 1995. The day, time and location of meetings is yet to be determined, however it is anticipated that meetings will be of approximately 2 hours duration. Consideration is presently being given to the payment of expenses for attendance, including loss of income and travelling expenses.

Nominations close on Thursday 28 September 1995. Should Council wish to submit a nomination, it will be necessary to set aside Council's policy in respect of the communication of Council resolutions.

# C458-09/95 REGIONAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ENTITY - [320-0, 404-13]

Council will be aware of the many organisations established to represent interests within the City of Wanneroo in the area of economic development. Much discussion has been generated over recent years as the various bodies have pursued their respective missions, sought to establish awareness and credibility, and often competed for the limited pool of funds available to further their initiatives.

At a meeting held on 28 July 1995 between representatives of many of those groups, it was proposed that a regional entity group be established to represent the combined interests of the region in terms of economic development. Council has been asked to indicate its position in the matter.

The principal arguments for the establishment of such a group stem from concerns expressed by the Wanneroo Goes For Jobs Group, specifically:

- "1 The number of different community organisations seeking funds from the same sources, creating an impression of a proliferation of organisations with similar aims all competing for funding from the same source.
  - 2 An apparent lack of interaction and cohesion among the community organisations.
  - 3 The impression that there are a number of organisations with similar aims spending time, money and effort addressing the same issues."

Whilst the validity of these concerns is acknowledged, it is contended that the Regional Economic Development Group (RED Group) provides the appropriate mechanism for coordinating the efforts of organisations within the region whose aims and objectives centre on business formation, business and industry retention and expansion, the development of business opportunities and employment creation.

It is therefore considered unnecessary to establish another peak body within the region, but rather, to ensure appropriate input and resource utilisation of the existing Regional Economic Development Group. Council's current funding commitment to the RED Group is \$35,000 for 1995/96.

Another issue that should be addressed at this time is Council's representation on the Northern Advisory Body.

The Northern Advisory Body evolved from a regional representative group formerly known as the Northern Suburbs Labour Market Advisory Body. That group was formed with the principal function of endeavouring to improve regional labour market services through activities of coordination, integration and stimulation. The "region" was determined as the Northern Metropolitan statistical division, excluding the south eastern corridor of the City of Stirling. The size of the region adopted was based on the premise that it would be large enough to warrant an advisory body capable of accepting a macro perspective without becoming involved in local or parochial issues.

It was intended that the Body would address labour market planning and delivery issues, and would make a regional contribution based on advice and comment to both Government and industry.

The Northern Advisory Body is comprised of key regional representatives of the business and industry sectors, employment and training agencies and community based organisations. The City of Wanneroo is represented on the Advisory Body by the Executive Assistant as the Town Clerk's nominee.

Past and ongoing activities of the Body include:

- actively promoting the needs of the region to Government;
- organizing monthly workshops with local business people to identify issues which are of concern to them and affecting their profitability, operating performance and employment growth;
- gathering comprehensive local economic data on business numbers, types, employment skill requirements etc;
- employer training seminars explaining financial support available to hire or train more people;
- the development of a small business enterprise and training centre;
- the allocation of regional youth training funds and the application of funding through the Office of Labour Market Adjustment; and
- the implementation of a programme to employ out of work apprentices.

To the extent that the Advisory Body seeks to stimulate economic development, its function is now duplicated within the City of Wanneroo by the RED Group and Wanneroo Goes For Jobs. Given the size of the region represented by the Northern Advisory Body, it is considered more appropriate that Council invests its resources in supporting the RED Group as a representative body for a region comprising solely the City of Wanneroo.

This is not to say that Council should withdraw from recognising its role within the northern metropolitan region as a key player in economic development; its representation on the Northern Metropolitan Regional Development Organisation will ensure that a macro perspective is maintained in matters of regional significance.

It is considered however that a concentration of support for the RED Group, together with the maintenance of close liaison with the Northern Advisory Body, will best achieve the advancement of Council's interests and role in the economic development of the City of Wanneroo.

Cr Cooper stated the RED Group had requested that Mr Paul Higgs, Executive Assistant, be appointed as Member. Town Clerk advised he would attend to this matter.

MOVED Cr Wood, SECONDED Cr O'Grady that Council:

- 1 advises the RED Group and Wanneroo Goes for Jobs that it supports the RED Group as the peak body for economic development within the City of Wanneroo and would not seek representation on a newly formed group that would essentially duplicate the role of the RED Group;
- 2 advises the Northern Advisory Body that given its commitment to the Northern Metropolitan Regional Development Organisation and the Regional Economic Development Group, Council will not now be represented on the Northern Advisory Body;
- 3 commends the Northern Advisory Body on its contribution to the rationalisation of labour market service planning and delivery within the region, and invites the continuation of liaison with the City of Wanneroo on matters of regional and local significance. CARTIED

# C459-09/95 MARMION AVENUE/BURNS BEACH ROAD - INSTALLATION OF TRAFFIC SIGNALS - [510-0007]

Main Road WA has confirmed that the installation of traffic signals at the Marmion Avenue/Burns Beach Road intersection is

programmed for October, subject to the formal approval by Council of the design and associated parking prohibitions.

The proposed intersection details are shown at Appendix XXXV. No major modifications are proposed to the existing intersection to accommodate traffic signals.

The proposed "NO STANDING ANY TIME" prohibitions associated with the Main Roads Traffic Signal Area are shown on Appendix XXXVI. These prohibitions are standard for intersections with traffic signals.

It is considered that the installation of advance warning flashing amber lights in Marmion Avenue can assist in drivers awareness of the signalised intersection. This type of treatment has been implemented on major highways in the metropolitan area.

# C460-09/95 PERRY'S PADDOCK DEVELOPMENT AND MANAGEMENT PLAN [057-4]

The Mayor, together with the Historical Sites Advisory Committee and the committee organising the Perry's Paddock Picnic Day, are keen to have the draft Perry's Paddock plans released for public comment at the Perry's Paddock Picnic Day to be held on 22 October 1995. For this to be done, Council endorsement of the draft plans for release is required which means that the matter needs to be considered at the Council meeting to be held 27 September 1995.

Perry's Paddock Development and Management Plan

At its meeting of 20 September 1995, the Historical Sites Advisory Committee considered the draft Perry's Paddock Master Plan and draft Stage One Development Plan for that site which had been prepared by Council's appointed consultant, Whelans. These draft plans are shown in Appendices XXVVII and XXVVII.

Councillors have been separately provided with a copy of the brief explanatory report prepared by the consultant. The intention is that subject to Council endorsement, the draft plans will be drawn up to proper presentation standard and a more comprehensive report will be prepared, both for release at the Perry's Paddock Picnic Day to be held on 22 October 1995. (The Hon Minister for Environment, Peter Foss, has been invited to participate in the release of the Draft Plans and his office has recently advised that he is happy to do this.)

The Historical Sites Advisory Committee has recommended to Council that:

- 1 the draft plans be endorsed as drafts suitable for release at the Picnic Day for a public comment period of 4 weeks;
- 2 the draft plans be formally referred to the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) for consideration. (This is in view of DEP officers' advice given to the consultant that the proposal to modify the northern end of Walluburnup Swamp may be likely to lead the EPA to require formal environmental assessment of that proposal.)

#### RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1 endorses the Draft Perry's Paddock Master Plan dated 28 August 1995 and the Draft Perry's Paddock Stage 1 Development Plan dated 13 September 1995 as drafts suitable for release at the Perry's Paddock Picnic Day to be held on 22 October 1995 for a public comment period of four weeks;
- 2 formally refers the draft plans referred to in 1 above to the Department of Environmental Protection for consideration.

## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The City Planner advises that when the matter was discussed at the last Historical Sites Advisory Committee meeting, it was

felt desirable that a brief summary document regarding the draft plan be available at the Picnic Day so that people attending the Picnic Day would have something to take away to peruse and assist them in making comment on the draft plans if they wished to.

This matter has been discussed with Council's consultant, Whelans, who have recommended that consideration be given to the preparation of a brochure. They have obtained quotes from a printer who has quoted \$3700 for 2000 brochures, or \$4300 for 5000 brochures. This is for coloured brochures; costs for black and white brochures are about the same due to artwork having to be prepared. The City Planner would support 5000 brochures being printed considering the likely number of people attending the Picnic Day, the added provision of brochures to Council libraries and Council offices, and the relatively small extra cost involved compared to 2000 brochures.

## C464-09/95 ESTIMATES: COSTING PRESSURES - [730-8-8-1]

The Quantity Surveyors for the Joondalup Civic and Cultural Facilities Project, Ralph & Beattie Bosworth Pty Ltd, report on changing trends within the tender market. They report as follows:

> "Overall Construction Costs - Building costs in Perth have remained static or risen slightly since 1990. After five years of relative stability recent tender results indicate that tenderers are pricing in escalation at the rate of 5 percent plus per annum. Obviously a large project such as this would incur these costs to accommodate future high escalation.

Formwork - Very recent and high increases in cost, 30-50 per cent. This project would be affected as there is a large amount of formwork.

<u>structural Steelwork</u> - Tender results have shown a high increase in the cost of structural steelwork, perhaps in the range of 20 to 30 per cent.

The overall affect on this project should be small due to the limited amount of steelwork in relation to other materials.

<u>Masonry (Brickwork)</u> - The potential exists for very high cost increases to masonry/brickwork. Curtin University's John Curtin project, which is due to commence construction shortly will have a very large number of bricklayers employed, enough to influence the market supply.

The services trades appear to still be very competitive with no sharp cost increases apparent. Escalation in cost has been included in the budget at about 3% per annum. Likely increases of up to 5% per annum would obviously result in up to 4% cost overrun."

If these cost pressures translate into the Joondalup Civic and Cultural Facilities Project the budget will be severely impacted creating the need to reduce the scope of the works or revise the budget.

# C465-09/95 FUNCTION AREAS AND COFFEE SHOP MANAGEMENT OPTIONS - [730-8-8-1]

The 7 July the Joondalup Civic and Cultural Facilities Occasional Committee and the July 1995 Council meeting authorised the engagement of a Consultant to advise on the options, conditions and feasibility of leasing the Coffee Shop, function area and kitchen and servicing of the dining room, item OC40-07/95 refers.

Klaus Richter and Associates, who has extensive experience in the preparation of hospitality-related agreements, was appointed. The methodology they applied to addressing Councils requirements was to examine the key factors that would point to the best options for the management of each area. These were:

- (i) financial viability of the operation;
- (ii) amount of on-going or investment by the operator;
- (iii) ownership and tenure of the business;
  - (iv) compatibility of operation, if more than one area is considered by a single operator.

The features and options are summarised as follows:

- 1 Coffee Shop
  - The Coffee Shop is only financially viable as an owner/operator concern:
    - . propose normal lease;
    - lessee responsible for total fitout including dumb waiter;

- rent to be established closer to the opening time having regard for established rents in the area; lease to make provision for:
  - . minimum opening times
    - . range of food sold
    - . use of dumb waiter to transport supplies
    - . level of fit-out
    - . maintenance and cleanliness
    - . option periods for extension of lease
- 2 Council Dining Room and Lounge Areas
  - As a stand-alone business it is not commercially viable due to:
    - . low turnover with little prospect for growth
    - . small functions and dinners leading to inefficiency of operation (from business perspective)
    - . difficult in staffing and maintaining consistency.
  - . Should be precluded from a lease arrangement;
  - . Council carry out full fit out to kitchen (back of house areas);
  - Implement a management arrangement that contains similar conditions as the existing catering arrangement with regard to type of meals and price;
  - Recommended that the operator of the Function Centre be allowed to hold the management agreement for the Dining and Lounge area, and that it be conditional that the operators of one area must at all times be the operator of the other.
- 3 Function Area

There are two broad approaches to the running of the Function Centre:

- Control over the area is maintained by Council, with services provided by external contractors; and
- The entire area is managed by an external party with the intent to promote utilisation of the venue by the general public.

Under the second option, Councils requirements for the centre can be provided for by provisions that ensure priority of access or use by Council so that functions promoted by the Manager did not clash with Council functions.

- . Recommended that the operator promotes the venue
- A lease agreement is entered into.
- . The lease provides for:
  - . promotion of the civic and cultural facilities
  - . specific use by Council of the area
  - . rent based on percentage turnover.

#### Comment

The Coffee Shop proposals are relatively simple. Report advised that the lease of the kiosk in the Joondalup Administration Centre will expire in August 1996. It is proposed that the current lessees are advised of Councils proposals to provide for a Coffee Shop in the library building and invite them to maintain their current lease until the coffee shop is opened; anticipated to be about April/May 1997. They may also wish to tender for the coffee shop lease.

The Dining Room Lounge area has operated successfully under the catering agreement with Council staff providing steward service as required. This could be expected to continue.

The key to successful management of the function area will be the interest in the market place and the availability of suitable operators. Advertising for expression of interest is one way of determining this. Failure to attract a suitable operator will lead to Council managing the venue and incurring the fitout cost (approx \$190,000).

- 1 agrees in principle to:
  - (a) leasing the Coffee Shop;
  - (b) management of the Dining Room and Lounge in a similar manner to the existing arrangements;
  - (c) leasing the management of the Function Centre;

- 3 authorises the drafting of individual lease agreements for the Coffee Shop and function Centre for the committees consideration;

4 proceeds with the documentation of the Civic and Cultural Facilities documentation on the basis the lessees will be responsible for the fitout of the Coffee Shop and the Function Centre kitchen. CARFIED

Most of the entry statements in Wanneroo have been designed to be in keeping with the environment and natural limestome theme and it may be inappropriate to have a large marble sign as proposed. However, in view of the size and scale of the development which will see subsequent stages of construction ensuing, it may not be inappropriate for Council to consider this request in this case. As it is proposed to have the statement in place prior to the opening and in view of Council's timetable and the need to discuss possible designs, it is suggested that Council delegates the consideration of this matter to the Mayor, Chairman Town Planning Committee and Town Clerk for determination of this application.

It would also be necessary to ensure that the entry statement on the eastern side of Country Club Boulevard matches that now proposed by the Resort. It may therefore be necessary for the Resort to look at both sites with a view to installing similar design entry statements.

It is therefore recommended that the Council delegates to the Mayor, Chairman Town Planning Committee and Town Clerk, authority to determine this application following discussion with the Joondalup Country Club Resort Hotel to achieve an acceptable standard of entry statement for the estate.

However as objections were raised during further discussion and the precise wording of the motion had not been agreed upon, the Mayor then declared the status quo would remain and requests for copies of documents would be subject to the provisions of the Standing Order By-laws.
