## PUBLIC QUESTION/COMMENT TIME OF WHICH DUE NOTICE HAS BEEN GIVEN

QUESTIONS PUT OR COMMENTS MADE BY THE PUBLIC RELATING TO BUSINESS LISTED ON THE AGENDA.

Mrs A Stergiou, Secretary, CATA Disabled Group Inc submitted the following questions at the Council Meeting of 24 April 1996 in relation to the proposed Community Drop-in Centre, Alexander Heights:

Q1 What is the current status of the new contract with the receivers?

- A1 The new contract with the receivers is a Memorandum of Variation of Formal Agreement and was executed on 14 March 1996.
- Q2 When will the building be completed by the receivers?
- A2 It was expected the works would be completed within 3-4 weeks from signing of the agreement. This has not happened and is commented on later.
- Q3 Is a shortfall in funds for the project expected?
- A3 At the time of signing of the Memorandum, no shortfall in funds was expected. See comments below.
- 04 If there is a shortfall, who is responsible for payment?
- A4 This is a matter for Council to address.
- Q5 If there is a shortfall, how is this going to be paid?
- A5 See answer to Question 4.
- Q6 What is happening with the interest accrued on the money that was given in trust to the City of Wanneroo for completion of the project?
- A6 The issue of interest is to be considered by Council. However, should there be a shortfall in funds it is anticipated the interest will be applied to the project.
- Q7 Will the interest be credited to CATA Disable Group? How will this be done?
- A7 See answer to Question 6.

Mrs A Hine of Dundebar Road, Wanneroo submitted the following questions to Council at its meeting to be held on 29 May 1996:

- Q1 Could you explain the status of (Lot Pt 8 No 16) Calabrese Avenue?
- Al Mrs Hine has subsequently advised that by 'status' she means ownership and plans for future use and this is covered in Questions 2 and 3.
- Q2 Who is the owner of this lot?

A2 G & G Property Trust.

Q3 What are the plans for its future use?

A3 This lot is currently occupied by 'Wanneroo Used Tyres' establishment and a house which is currently being demolished.

> Under City of Wanneroo Town Planning Scheme No 1, the lot is zoned Service Industrial and under the Metropolitan Region Scheme, it is zoned Urban.

The lot is located within the 'Calabrese Triangle' area (being bounded by Calabrese Avenue, Mangano Place and Wanneroo Road) which is the subject of the following Council policy:

# 1

In determining applications for rezoning and/or development approval in respect of land within the area bounded by Wanneroo Road, Mangano Place and Calabrese Avenue, Council and the State Planning Commission shall have regard to the following:

- New development shall be in a manner that is complementary to existing development in terms of scale, design and appearance
- Development shall not be approved where the amenity of existing occupied dwellings is likely to be detrimentally affected
- No subdivision of land shall be permitted in order that the potential development intensity of the area may be constrained
- Amalgamation of lots may be considered where appropriate, in the interests of providing a co-ordinated development
- Development which cannot be adequately served by on-site water supply and waste disposal systems shall be discouraged
- Developments with traffic generating capacity which would require the significant upgrading of Mangano Place and Calabrese Avenue shall be discouraged
- No new crossovers shall be permitted to Wanneroo Road

- Car parking provision shall be in accordance with the appropriate provisions of the City of Wanneroo Town Planning Scheme No.1
- Wherever possible, access to new developments shall be via Villanova Street, Mangano Place or Calabrese Avenue, and not Wanneroo Road.
- The provision and maintenance of landscaping shall be in accordance with Council's requirements for "Service Industrial" zones
- Incompatible uses shall be separated by an approved screen wall and/or a landscaped buffer strip of at least 3.0 metres in width
- The present discreteness of the area shall be maintained
- Only developments that would benefit from close proximity to Wanneroo Road and which are, in Council's opinion, well suited to such a location shall be considered appropriate
- Site and building plans accompanying rezoning applications shall be adopted by Council as Development Guide Plans. Copies of the Development Guide Plans shall be forwarded with the amended documents to the State Planning Commission.
- Council shall have due regard for adopted Development Guide Plans when considering Applications for Approval to Commence Development.

There are no current development or subdivision applications relating to this lot and no current development or subdivision approvals waiting to be acted upon.

- Q4 Was this house or the next door house (burnt-out) registered on Heritage List?
- A4 Neither the house (currently being demolished) on Pt Lot 8 nor the burnt-out house on adjacent Lot 104 (18) are on Council's Municipal Inventory of Heritage Places. It may be noted that the house on Pt Lot 8 is being demolished with no demolition licence having been applied for or therefore issued.

- Q5 Is there any protection on this house or any of the large mature trees on this particular Lot Pt 8(16)?
- A5 The house (currently being demolished) on Pt Lot 8 is not the subject of any form of heritage protection.

Mrs Hine has subsequently advised that the large mature trees she refers to are in fact on Lot 104 (No 18) on the lot abutting to the north. These trees are not the subject of any form of protection.

- Q6 If there is no protection on the trees at present, can they please be looked at urgently and assessed. Also a large Tuart down on the vacant block adjacent to the BP Garage at the 13 Mile Peg.
- A6 These trees have previously been assessed by the Acting City Parks Manager. The trees are of species Erithrina ('Flame Tree') and Milia ('Lilac'). The conclusion drawn for the assessment was that these trees did not warrant inclusion on the tree preservation list.

The large tree adjacent to the BP Garage has also previously been assessed by the Acting City Parks Manager with the same conclusion being reached. However, the Acting City Parks Manager also advises that should a development application be received for the land concerned, the retention of this tree, along with a number of other nearby trees, would be encouraged.

# Miss Helen Hillary

Miss Helen Hillary of Warburton Avenue, Padbury has requested to address Council at its meeting on 29 May 1996 in relation to the proposed Child Care Centre, Lots 108 and 109 (78 and 80) Warburton Avenue, Padbury - Item TP99-05/96 refers.

Miss Hillary stated it was her belief that it was Council's obligation to represent the people, that is the ratepayers, that is herself. She advised there had been 28 objections, both mailed and faxed; as well as 200 signatures on a petition objecting to the proposed child minding centre in Warburton Avenue.

Her main objection to the proposed child care centre was based solely on safety reasons.

Miss Hillary felt that the operating times of 7 am to 6 pm daily, whilst not creating traffic problems at the present time, would eventually do so in the future. Once the staff allocation for carparking bays had been taken into consideration, only nine bays would remain for parents' use - people would then park on the verge area. She advised that combined with the close proximity of the shopping centre driveway and parking on the verge would create further traffic hazards.

Miss Hillary stated the park behind the shopping centre, which at present is in a run-down condition, may be a better location for parking.

She raised the point where at the Town Planning Committee meeting of 20 May 1996 it was stated that the bus stop outside the proposed child care centre would be relocated 2 metres east and would still be on the developers' property. Miss Hillary advised that the bus stop was relocated today (29 May 1996), but west of the proposed development site and is now located outside 76 Warburton Avenue.

Miss Hillary stated she vehemently opposed the proposed child care centre in a subjective and realistic way and thanked Council for the opportunity of addressing this evening's meeting.

# Pat Hassett

Pat Hassett, Director of Padbury Child Minding Centre Inc, advised that this centre was a community based, non-profit centre which had operated in the community of Padbury for 9 years.

She spoke on behalf of the parent body and wished to clarify a number of points that had been raised and publicised in relation to the proposed development at 78 & 80 Warburton Avenue, Padbury and the Padbury Child Minding Centre Inc.

Pat Hassett advised the Padbury Child Minding Centre was not a privately owned centre. The building and the land were owned by both the State and Federal Governments. She was an employee of that incorporated body, she did not own the centre.

She stated Padbury was not an up and coming growing area requiring further child care centres. Padbury Child Minding Centre did not currently have waiting lists for placement of children as stated in the press. It was the belief of their parent incorporated body that Council had an obligation to uphold the community based centre that currently exists in Padbury.

# Mrs Gay Brooker

Mrs Gay Brooker thanked Council for the opportunity of addressing this evening's meeting and thanked those Councillors who gave up their Friday evening (24 May 1996) to attend the Special Meeting of Electors in relation to the proposed telecommunications tower to be erected at the Warwick Police Station.

She stated the main objection to the erection of the telecommunications tower for mobile phones was based on the fact that it may be a potential health risk to children. Mrs Brooker referred to copies of all scientific studies that have been conducted in this regard where it was felt that there may be a potential health problem.

Mrs Brooker advised that neither of the 3 carriers involved would guarantee that there is not a risk to the health of not only children, but the general community at large.

Mrs Brooker referred to photographs she had taken of telecommunications towers and displayed a photograph of such a tower at Whitfords Node north, which is located in a public park; at least 500 metres from the nearest residence. She advised this distance was that recommended by Doctor Neil Cherry to locate these towers away from children.

In regard to the proposed tower to be erected at the Warwick Police Station, she felt the alternative site option of Warwick Open Space was quite suitable.

# MINUTES OF TECHNICAL SERVICES COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON 15 APRIL 1996

The Minutes of the Technical Services Committee Meeting held on 15 April 1996, were confirmed as a true and correct record.

#### PETITIONS AND DEPUTATIONS

# DEPUTATION - FOOTPATH CONSTRUCTION - ALFRETON WAY, DUNCRAIG - [510-1770]

Mr Lethbridge addressed the Committee in relation to opposition to the construction of a footpath in Alfreton Way, Duncraig.

Mr Lethbridge distributed a map to the Committee of the area concerned in Alfreton Way, Duncraig and advised that he represented certain residents of Alfreton Way, Duncraig who were opposed to the construction of a footpath on this road and in this regard referred to a previous 53 signature petition forwarded to Council in 1993.

He sited the main objections to the construction of a footpath as being:

- Alfreton Way is a single entry/exit road and is not designed for a heavy traffic flow;
- Glengarry Primary School has a declining population and has dropped by 120 students in the last 3 years;
- the number of pedestrians using the road does not warrant the expenditure of funds on a footpath;
- pedestrians can use existing footpaths to the school without using Alfreton Way;
- verges all have maintained lawns and parents and children chose to walk along Alfreton Way because it is quite picturesque;
- the responsibility for the children's safety lies solely with the parents and not Council;
- most children will continue to walk along the western border of Alfreton Way, as detailed in a recent study.

Mr Lethbridge raised his concerns in relation to a one day study undertaken by Council on traffic and pedestrian movements in Alfreton Way and questioned the results of this study.

He felt that appropriate research should be undertaken before the matter is finalised.

Mr Lethbridge queried the size of the dual footpath as he believed that it would not be warranted in Alfreton Way and felt that it should be downgraded to a single use footpath.

In conclusion Mr Lethbridge expressed concern about the number of trucks from the Hope Group utilising Alfreton Way as he felt that this could lead to Alfreton Way becoming a light industrial area.

Mr Barry Bateman then addressed the Committee and referred to the minutes of the Technical Services Committee held on 15 April 1996 where it was recommended that the footpath be constructed adjacent to the kerb on the east side of Alfreton Way.

He raised his concerns in relation to this recommendation as he believed that it was not the same recommendation as handed down from the Doveridge Traffic Study as they had given a definite 'no' to the construction of the footpath.

Mr Bateman also referred to a recommendation by the North East Duncraig Study Group which supported additional parking embayments in Doveridge Drive and commented that nothing has yet been done in this recard.

He queried the results of a recent Council vehicle and pedestrian study undertaken in Alfreton Way as he felt that more pedestrians used the west side of Alfreton Way to travel to and from school, not the east side as reported in the study.

Also in relation to Council's recent study, Mr Bateman believed that no account was taken of the fact that 45% of the total number of pedestrians enter and exit by the east-west leg of Alfreton Way and this was also the route taken by school traffic to exit the area.

He commented that if Council is constructing a footpath for the safety of the children in the area, it would also be necessary for a footpath to be constructed on the west side of Alfreton Way.

Mr Bateman felt that local traffic movement was not a problem in Alfreton Way and the extra traffic was generated by parents dropping off and picking up children.

He believed that if there was adequate parking facilities in the front of the school, they would almost certainly be used by most parents.

Mr McGuiness then addressed the Committee, explaining that he had children who attended Glengarry Primary School and who walked along the verge and felt that they were safe doing this.

He questioned the width of the proposed 2.1m footpath and commented that there were only two footpaths of that width in the area, neither of which was adjacent to any residential properties and felt that there was no precedent for a footpath this wide and believed a 1.2m footpath would be adequate.

Mr McGuiness queried a sandstone ramp near the school and felt that it would be more appropriate for Council to expend funds on changing this to a concrete ramp.

Following questions from Councillors, the Chairman thanked the deputation for addressing the Committee.

DEPUTATION - FOOTPATH CONSTRUCTION - ALFRETON WAY, DUNCRAIG - [510-1770]

Mr Peter Taylor addressed the Committee in relation to the construction of a footpath in Alfreton Way, Duncraig.

At Mr Taylor's request, the Chief Executive Officer (Elect) read the contents of a fax distributed to the Committee from Mr Peter Farrell, Acting Principal of Glengarry Primary School, in support of the establishment of footpaths and cycleways to alleviate the necessity for children to walk or ride on roads -Appendix I refers.

Mr Taylor explained that in relation to the proposed footpath, the sole reason for the construction of the footpath is the safety of children and parents to gain access to the school.

He commented that parents and children use Alfreton Way as the streets and walk-ways north of the school generate extra traffic into the area and vehicles also use Alfreton Way as a favoured access to the school.

For this reason, Mr Taylor believed that it was necessary for the parents and children using Alfreton Way to be able to do so in safety and explained that they are currently forced to walk on the road.

He felt that if a footpath was constructed in Alfreton Way, parents would encourage children to walk to school and thus lessen vehicle usage in the area.

Mr Mark Jennaway then addressed the Committee, explaining that he was the initial person who started the petition in favour of the footpath, due to one of his children nearly being knocked over by a car while being escorted to the primary school by his wife and also referred to another accident in the area approximately 3 years ago.

He commented that it was unsafe for children to walk on the verge as there were obstructions along that side of the street.

Mr Jennaway believed that this street was one of the major access routes for the children to the primary school and was concerned that once in the street they had to walk on the road.

Mrs Jenny Taylor then addressed the Committee to give a personal view as she was a parent who lived in Alfreton Way fronting the proposed footpath and was 100% in support of the construction of the footpath.

She advised that she had used this road at various times over the last 8 years as an accessway to the primary school and was concerned about the safety of children as they had to walk along the road because of the problem in the area.

Mrs Taylor felt that a footpath would make the area safe for children to walk to school and would also be a safe place for children to play in front of their house, instead of on the road.

She stated that her daughter had been driven to school by a day care mum who lived six houses away, as it was not safe for her to accompany the child to school and believed that a footpath in Alfreton Way was of the utmost importance for the safety of children in the area.

Following questions from Councillors, the Chairman thanked the deputation for addressing the Committee.

Discussion ensued. Cr Hancock indicated that she wished to submit a rescission motion on this matter. The Chief Executive Officer (Elect) advised Cr Hancock he would draft an appropriate document for her consideration.

As constructed amended plan application was received by Council on 30 April 1996. The amended plans did not include a surveyed site plan.

Although a footing inspection was carried out on the front unit on 19 May 1994 by the District Building Surveyor, the lack of site survey pegs and the angle of the front boundary would have made it difficult for the Building Surveyor to determine if the building had been set out according to the approved plans, bearing in mind that it is the responsibility of the builder to ensure that the building is set out and constructed in accordance with the approval.

# Town Planning

Advice from Town Planning indicates that due to lack of information required from the builder (no surveyed site plan) they are not sure if action can be taken under the Town Planning Development Act.

# MINUTES OF TOWN PLANNING COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON 10 APRIL 1996

The Minutes of Town Planning Committee Meeting held on 10 April 1996 were confirmed as a true and correct record.

#### PETITIONS AND DEPUTATIONS

DEPUTATION - PROPOSED AMENDMENT NO 759 TO TOWN PLANNING SCHEME NO 1 TO REZONE LOT 32 CORNER MENCHETTI AND WANNEROO ROADS, NEERABUP FROM RURAL TO RURAL (ADDITIONAL USE) RURAL STORE -[790-759]

Mr Greg Rowe of Greg Rowe and Associates addressed the Committee in relation to proposed Amendment No 759 to Town Planning Scheme No 1 to Rezone Lot 32 Corner Menchetti and Wanneroo Roads, Neerabup from Rural to Rural (Additional Use) Rural Store - Item TP98-05/96 refers.

Mr Rowe advised the Committee that the existing Market Garden Sales has been owned by the Macri family for some time and explained that it is an outlet that provides a facility for people in the area and also passing trade to have access to market garden sales.

He stated that his clients were concerned with the expanding urban front and they believed that market gardening might not be possible in the future and so sought to ensure a continuation of their role on this land by legitimising a standard range of goods to be sold at their store.

In reply to Council's refusal of this application, Mr Rowe made the following points:

- the Preliminary Draft, Local Rural Strategy is not a formally adopted document and does not give a definitive argument why this site should be inappropriate and why two service station sites would be more appropriate;
- access to the site would be by way of Menchetti Road, not Wanneroo Road;
- the proposed change is to expand the use to convenience goods and will operate from the existing building;
- aesthetics and essential rural character of the area will not be changed.

In conclusion Mr Rowe stated that there were no true rural stores in this vicinity, as service stations did not fulfil this role, and questioned the distinction of why a rural store could not be achieved from market garden sales in a rural area. Mr Macri then addressed the Committee and pointed out that their business was already established and a going concern.

He explained that the main access to the store is off a side street and there is no intention to have Wanneroo Road as an access.

Mr Macri advised that they wished to provide a better range of service to their existing customers and did not want to make any changes to the building.

In conclusion Mr Macri stated that they had made significant modifications to their car park and distributed copies of their submission to the Committee.

Following guestions from Councillors, the Chairman thanked the deputation for addressing the Committee and advised that the matter would be considered later in the meeting.

# DEPUTATION - PROPOSED CHILD CARE CENTRE, LOTS 108 AND 109 (78 & 80) WARBURTON AVENUE, PADBURY - [30/5323]

Mr Ray Atkinson and Mr Tony Love addressed the Committee in relation to proposed Child Care Centre, Lots 108 and 109 (78 & 80) Warburton Avenue, Padbury - Item TP99-05/96 refers.

Mr Atkinson explained that in relation to concerns raised by local residents against the development of this child care centre, they had researched some of those objections and looked at information supplied by the Town Planning Department and summarised the five major points raised, namely:

- I Increase in traffic flow at Warburton Avenue -Warburton Avenue is not overloaded and drop off and pick up times for children at a child care centre would not conflict with retail trading hours;
- 2 Verge parking on residential sites the proposed development does not allow for verge parking and has more than 15 parking bays;
- 3 Increased noise levels to surrounding properties children in small supervised groups inside most of the time and the centre is closed at night time and on weekends;
- 4 Decreased value of surrounding properties existing properties at the proposed site are rental properties and in poor condition and the proposed development will be visually pleasing and designed to fit in with the surrounding area;

Relocation of bus stop - this does not present a problem with expected traffic flow as the bus stop is only being moved a couple of metres.

Following guestions from Councillors, the Chairman thanked the deputation for addressing the Committee and advised that the matter would be considered later in the meeting.

# DEPUTATION - PROPOSED VODAFONE TELECOMMUNICATIONS TOWER ON RESERVE 34118 (37) EDDINGTON ROAD, WARWICK - [30/4829]

Mr Rory O'Brien of O'Brien Planning Consultants and Mr Graeme Elliott of Australian Radiation Laboratory addressed the Committee in relation to proposed Vodafone Telecommunications Tower on Reserve 34118 (37) Eddington Road, Warwick - Item TP105-05/96 refers.

Mr O'Brien gave a slide presentation in relation to the proposed Vodafone Telecommunications Tower, showing present and proposed transceiver stations and details of the proposed site at Warwick.

He referred to a recent public meeting where the main concern of the community was in relation to the radiation emissions from the tower and advised that Vodafone had arranged for Mr Graeme Elliott of the Australian Radiation Laboratory to attend the Town Planning meeting to address radiation issues.

Mr Graeme Elliott then presented several slides explaining radiation emissions and informed the Committee of the results of recent measurements he had taken of radiation emissions from a similar tower to the one proposed.

In conclusion Mr Elliott considered that scientific information is that phone tower emissions have no adverse health effects.

Following guestions from Councillors, the Chairman thanked the deputation for addressing the Committee and advised that the matter would be considered later in the meeting.

# TP98-05/96 PROPOSED AMENDMENT NO 759 TO TOWN PLANNING SCHEME NO 1 TO REZONE LOT 32 CORNER MENCHETTI AND WANNEROO ROADS, NEERABUP FROM RURAL TO RURAL (ADDITIONAL USE) RURAL STORE - [790-759]

Greg Rowe & Associates, on behalf of Fleura Pty Ltd, have made application to rezone Lot 32 corner Menchetti and Wanneroo Roads, Neerabup from Rural to Rural (additional use) Rural Store.

The City Planner provides background details to the subject matter and submits an assessment of the proposal.

He advises that although Council supported three previous rezoning applications in 1989 and 1990 (Amendment Nos 473, 511 and 547) in each case the Hon Minister for Planning refused permission to advertise and therefore this application cannot be supported.

CITY PLANNER'S REPORT recommended that Council advises Greg Rowe & Associates that the application to rezone Lot 32 corner Menchetti and Wanneroo Roads, Neerabup from Rural to Rural (Additional Use) Rural Store is not supported on the following grounds, that:

- Rural Store on Lot 32 corner Menchetti and Wanneroo Roads, Neerabup is contrary to the Local Rural Strategy proposed for the area;
- 2 the development of a Rural Store on Lot 32 corner Menchetti and Wanneroo Roads, Neerabup would represent ad hoc linear development on an Important Regional Road;
- 3 the proposal represents a sporadic retail development and is contrary to the planning provisions of shopping facilities in that part of Wanneroo.

At the Town Planning Committee meeting it was "Moved Cr Duffy Seconded Cr Hancock that Council supports the application to rezone Lot 32 corner Menchetti and Wanneroo Roads, Neerabup from Rural to Rural (Additional Use) Rural Store"

This motion was Lost By Division as follows:

In Favour of the MOTION: Crs Duffy, Hancock and Wight.

Against the MOTION: Crs Major, Freame and Magyar.

## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The City Planner referred to requests for information on two letters presented at Council's Town Planning Committee on Monday 20 May 1996 relating to the property, the subject of Item TP98-05/96.

The first, addressed to the Hon Iain MacLean MLC from the Hon Minister for Planning, Richard Lewis MLA, dated 25 April 1995 related to the landowner's approach to the Hon Minister for assistance in gaining an approval to expand his market garden sales operation. The letter was in connection to a development application considered by Council in June 1995 (TP193-06/95). The application sought to renew an approval to use Lot 32 for Market Garden Sales. The application was required as Council's Market Garden Sales Policy limits these activities to twelve months approval, with an extension, permissible by the City Planner, upon the completion of an annual review.

The application was approved by Council subject to a list of applicable conditions including:

- 3 fruit and vegetable produce, cool drink and pre-packaged ice-cream, being the only permitted sales;
- 4 the total area for sales of fruit and vegetables not to exceed 100m<sup>2</sup> excluding any coolroom which shall not exceed 30m<sup>2</sup>;
- 9 the use of the land for market garden sales ceasing by 31 July 1997 unless a further application is made to and approved by Council prior to that date.

The particular paragraph referred to at the Town Planning Committee meeting: "Obviously, as Minister it is not appropriate for me to become directly involved but as I believe Mr Macri has been dealt with harshly by Council I thought my comments may be of assistance if the matter is to be reconsidered." relates to the abovementioned application and was included as an appendix document in a subsequent appeal against the above three conditions.

The Hon Minister's comments were considered as part of the City's appeal response, however, Council's policy is clear in its Market Garden Sales definition, permissible space for operations and permitted goods for sale and the letter would have no relevance to a rezoning amendment. Council is reminded that the Minister's appeal decision denied any change to Condition 3 and modified Conditions 4 and 9 to read:

- 4 the market garden sales outlet (comprising fruit and vegetable produce, cold drink and pre-packaged ice-cream) is to be confined to the brick clad front half of the existing building;
- 9 the use of the land for market garden sales can only occur while Lot 32 is predominantly used as a market garden. Market garden sales must cease therefore, upon the cessation of the market gardening operation.

The second letter, addressed to the Town Clerk from the Minister for Local Government, Mr Paul Omodei, and received by the City on 6 February 1996, mirrored the applicant's rezoning amendment request documents. - 2 written agreement to allow other telecommunication carriers on the structure and the site if required;
- 3 written confirmation from the other carriers as to their interests in the site and potential for co-location.

#### COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

- 1 defers consideration of this matter pending the outcome of the public meeting to be held on 24 May 1996;
- 2 further considers this matter at the Full Council meeting to be held on 29 May 1996.

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The City Planner referred to the public meeting held on 24 May 1996, and the letter from Vodafone dated 28 May 1996 (Appendix XXVI refers). In consideration of Vodafone's attendance at various Council and non-Council meetings and its understanding of community fears, Vodafone proposes a new site in the vicinity of the tennis club in the Warwick Open Space.

This new location is in response to requests from the local community to relocate the tower and facilities building from the original Warwick Police Station site. This location would remove the tower away from the primary school and aged persons development and create a more substantial buffer to residential lots.

The relocation would require an increase in the tower's height from 30 to 40 metres. This increase is the result of the land's lower elevation compared to that of the Warwick Police Station site.

As the tower is in the same general location and recognises community concerns (although Vodafone considers them unwarranted), Vodafone requests Council's support without the need for further advertising.

Prior to this support being granted, negotiations would be required between the City and Vodafone with regard to leasing arrangements and approvals would be required from the Western Australian Planning Commission as the Warwick Open Space is reserved under the Metropolitan Region Scheme, and from the Department of Environment Protection as the site is subject to System 6 Recommendations.

However, on the basis of information obtained from the public meeting held on 24 May 1996 and in consideration of previous advice given to Council the new location is recommended without a need for further advertising.

MOVED Cr Magyar, SECONDED Cr Freame that Council advises Vodafone that it supports the development of the telecommunications tower and facilities building on Lot 145 (719) Beach Road, Warwick, in the vicinity of the tennis courts, subject to:

# ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The City Planner advised that Richard Pawluk and Associates, on behalf of Peet and Co (who are prospective purchasers of a portion of Lot 35) are seeking Council support to several modifications to Amendment No 651 which is the subject of a report to Council being considered at its May meeting.

One of the matters dealt with in this report is a request from Peet and Co for Council to reconsider its previous position in relation to the provision of a 10% public open space contribution for this lot. Councillors are advised that Council previously resolved that 10% public open space should be provided abutting the western boundary of the Parks and Recreation reservation within Lot 35 to provide a grater separation between the wetland and the proposed development on Lot 35. Peet and Co has requested, however, that this be provided in the form of a cash-in-lieu contribution as opposed to land.

To assist Councillors with their consideration of this matter a plan has been prepared that clearly demonstrates the current boundary of the Parks and Recreation reservation over Lot 35, the extent of the wetland in this vicinity and the extent of the 10% public open space being requested. (Appendix XVVI refers).

Councillors will note from the plan that the applicant has proposed development within the Parks and Recreation reserve where the boundary of the site is located some 18 metres into (or east) of the reservation boundary. Notwithstanding that this is an error, the edge of the lake has been identified on the plan clearly demonstrating how close it is to be Parks and Recreation boundary in this vicinity (approximately 5-10 metres at its closest). The actual wetland, however, extends some 30-40 metres further west into that part of Lot 35 proposed to be developed with housing. Consequently it is critical that the public open space contribution be maintained as shown on the plan (and as previously required by Council) to ensure that some semblance of a buffer is maintained to ensure that development is not permitted to encroach into the wetland as proposed by the developer.

Finally, Councillors will also note that historically where subdivision was proposed adjacent to many wetlands (particularly east of Wanneroo Road) it was accepted practice to provide a buffer of at least 30 metres. More recently, the Environmental Protection Authority and Water Corporation have established a 50 metre (minimum) buffer referred to as the area of critical influence.

MOVED Cr Wight, SECONDED Cr Duffy that consideration of modification to Amendment No 651 - proposed rezoning of a portion of Lot 35 corner Woodvale Drive and Duffy Terrace, Woodvale be deferred and referred back to Town Planning Committee.

The assistance was limited to representation on days when evidence is given by past or present Councillors or officers and for cross examination of evidence where evidence is material to the interest of the City and its officers to the Councillors being represented.

Assistance was also to be provided for necessary preparation and for financial submission.

The Town Clerk advised he had received a summons and was aware that the Mayor Cr Dammers, Cr Freame and the City Building Surveyor had received summonses to appear before the Commission.

Councillors Cooper and Major also advised that they had received a summons to appear.

The Town Clerk suggested that in view of the urgency of the matter, it be agreed that he be given authority to refer the request back to the Minister for Local Government because of the similarities of the requests, particularly as one had been approved and one, the City of Wanneroo, had been rejected.

No significant problems were experienced during the period leading up to 4 May nor on election day itself. Voter turnout

was low, and other than isolated reports of electors queuing, all polling places operated satisfactorily.

One non-conforming advertisement was brought to my attention. The candidate concerned has been advised and the Minister for Local Government informed of this minor breach.

During the counting of votes in South West Ward, it was discovered that two Section 111 votes (preliminary votes issued to an elector whose name does not appear on the electoral roll), had been issued and deposited directly within the ballot box rather than enclosed in a special envelope which serves as an application/declaration by an elector for this class of vote. The Section 111 envelopes were subsequently checked and these two electors found to be eligible to vote. Appendix XXI hereto is a full report from the Deputy Returning Officer on this matter.

During the process of parcelling papers used at the elections, a further four Section 11 votes from South Ward were discovered. These votes had been placed with Presiding Officer's polling materials rather than being deposited directly into the ballot box. A subsequent check reveals that two of the votes would have been accepted and two rejected on the grounds of the persons not being on the electoral roll.

Election results are not materially affected by these incidents.

After final distribution of preferences for the second position in the South West Ward, Vicki Hancock was declared elected. It represented a win by three votes over Walter Hales. I understand it is probable there will be a Court of Disputed Returns called for over this close result.

Appendix XXII hereto is a copy of "Return of Election: Form 19 which shows election results and percentages of electors who voted.

An alternative offer has been made by Prestige Hino to supply a Hino model FD3HLL at the reduced price of \$111,207.00. The 10,400 kgs gross vehicle mass of this truck is less than the minimum 10,500 kgs gross vehicle mass requested at tender specification.

As tenders were not called to this reduced specification, the competitiveness of the revised offer cannot be determined and therefore does not present the preferred option in the circumstances.

The second low tender at Tender Number 126-95/96 was that of Major Motors Pty Ltd to supply an Isuzu FSR650 recycling truck for \$116,655.00. This price is only \$429.43 greater than the Prestige Hino tender and is recommended accordingly.

Each year Council conducts the Student Scholarship Award. The Student Scholarship awards are made to ten high school students who reside in the City of Wanneroo.

The scholarship award is primarily based on academic achievements, however community contributions are taken into consideration. Six full scholarships of \$2000, and up to four half scholarships of \$1000 are awarded each year. The awards are made in equal payments to the students in years 11 and 12 of their schooling.

The scholarship program commenced in 1981 when 6 full scholarships were awarded. Last year the scholarship program was expanded, for the first time, and an additional four half scholarships of \$1000 were awarded. It has been suggested by the Student Scholarship Award Panel that the number of scholarships be increased by four full scholarships and two half scholarships. This would bring the total number of scholarships. Since 1981, when the Scholarship program commenced, the population of the City has more than doubled and the percentage of 15 year old students has increased each year. The number and quality of Scholarship Award entries has grown significantly over the years and it is considered appropriate that the number of Scholarships awarded be increased to reflect this.

In many cases the Scholarship Awards assist some of our most aspiring young people to complete high school and make valuable contributions to our community. It could only be an advantage to Council to assist as many of these young people as possible.

#### C243-05/96 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY PLAN - IMPLEMENTATION UPDATE - [206-134]

The following summary of Information Technology Plan implementation activity is provided for Council's information. It is intended to provide a monthly report as the various elements of the plan are addressed.

#### CORE SYSTEMS

Strategy 1 of Council's adopted Information Technology Plan is the replacement of Core Systems ; i.e. "those which support Council's main business activities, processing individual transactions relative to business services".

In addressing this strategy, an in-house Committee, chaired by the Deputy Town Clerk and comprising key departmental staff members, was established to work with Deakin Consulting in the preparation of tender specifications (and subsequently, in the evaluation of tenders). Expressions of Interest were subsequently invited and the committee is currently in the process of evaluating the Registrants.

This process includes the checking of reference sites provided by those companies who have submitted Registrations of Interest. The Computer Services Manager and Deakin Consulting are currently working together to complete this process and produce a report to assist the Committee in making the selection of the short list of companies who will be invited to tender. In the meantime, Deakin Consulting have been working with Departmental staff to produce a comprehensive tender specification which will detail requirements which vendors will base their tender on.

#### ORGANISATIONAL SUPPORT SYSTEMS

Strategy 3 of the Information Technology Plan relates to the establishment of co-ordinated Organisation Support systems (i.e. implementing tools for the co-ordinated collection, preparation and dissemination of information to both the internal and the external customers of the organisation). The strategy requires :

"Standardisation of PC support tools ... and changing all secretarial and support staff to PC's

Adoption of PC based communication tools (electronic mail, etc)

Review and replace the corporate Document and Records Management Systems."

Again, an in-house Committee has now received tenders for the provision of services to review organisation support requirements, to recommend a solution and to assist in the implementation of the adopted solution.

It is the Committee's intention to finalise the selection phase during the week ending 31 May 1996. To assist the Committee in the detailed evaluation of the tenders, I have engaged the services of a local government document management systems specialist, Mr R Dury, on a fee for service basis, at an estimated cost of \$500. (Recommendation refers)

#### PC-BASED NETWORK

Strategy 4 of the Information Technology Plan will see the replacement of the current network with a PC-based network, providing the interface aspect of the core systems and the organisational support systems.

The Computer Services Manager has advised that the network infrastructure, which includes the installation of network switches, routers and hubs along with category 5 UTP cabling has now peor completed in the Joondalup Administration Centre. This now provides Local Area Network capabilities throughout the building. All major Libraries plus the Works Depot are now equipped with Local Area Network capabilities and communicate over high speed lines to the main Administration Building. Recreation Centres will be converted to the same facilities in the coming year.

Some 80 PC's will be installed in this financial year and a program of replacing all existing terminals in the City of Wanneroo should be completed in the next financial year. This will involve the installation of approximately 170 PC's on top of which the new Joondalup Library will be equipped with 60 PC's and associated equipment (printers, CD-ROM stacks).

To assist staff in the transition to a PC-based operating environment, a dedicated Computer Training Facility has been established at Council's Welfare Services building in Kingsley.

#### INDUSTRY PARTNER

Strategy 10 of Council's Information Technology Plan requires the adoption of an "Industry Partnership" approach to manage the

overall transition to the new systems. The appointment of an external consultant to oversee the management of all projects related to the Information Technology Plan will be addressed during June 1996 with advertisements calling for tenders to be placed during the first week of June.

MOVED Cr Major, SECONDED Cr Freame that Council endorses the engagement of Mr Rod Dury, on a fee for service basis, to assist in the evaluation of Council's Organisational Support System requirements.

The consultant was engaged on the understanding that consultation with the Nyoongah Circle of Elders would need to be arranged separately by the City.

Accordingly consultation was arranged with the Nyoongah Circle of Elders, through the Department of Aboriginal Affairs. The on-site consultation took place on Tuesday 14 May 1996 at 12.00 noon. The accepted attendance fee for the informants was \$50 per person. Fifty-two people attended and this works out to \$2,600. This is more than the \$815 balance remaining from deducting the consultant's fee from the originally approved \$12,000. (It should be noted that the number of persons attending the meeting was not able to be known beforehand - it was a case of counting the number attending on the day.

The Shire of Kent asks that Councils of a similar view express their concerns to the Premier, the Minister for Police, the Leader of the Opposition and all Members of Parliament.
