1. MINUTES -

The minutes of the meeting held on Wednesday 14 June 2000, were confirmed, and noted.

2. MEETING PURPOSE

The Chairperson explained that the purpose of the meeting was to consider applications under the current round of Bicentennial Trust funding, and consequently make recommendations to Council regarding fund allocations.

Members noted that 44 applications were received under the current round. One late application was also tabled, (from Challenge Brass Band) but was not considered due to receipt after the closing date.

3. APPLICATION ASSESMENT

Before assessing each application, the following members declared an interest and consequent removal from the voting process for applications noted below.

Members were also made aware that total funds available in the Trust were \$57,607. Given GST implications, that means each project funded must be provided with an additional 10% for tax purposes, funds available for allocation totalled \$51,847.

With these funding decisions recommended, the Chair informed members of the Working Party that a total of \$20,113 remained in the Trust.

He moved a recommendation that these funds be expended during this funding round of the Trust, due to its impending closure in 2001 and the Centenary of Federation to be celebrated next year, meaning that a Bicentennial Trust may no longer be relevant to the community.

Motions on the expenditure of remaining funds were then received from members of the Working Party.

Mr Joe Hawkins moved that the remaining funds be expended on a project recognising the Bicentennial Trust in the Heritage Listed Perry's Paddock.

Discussion of this motion saw the following issues raised:

- Ownership of Perry's Paddock not falling under either of the Cities of Wanneroo or Joondalup, but instead resting with the State Government
- The perception that work in Perry's Paddock (within the City of Wanneroo) may not be an equitable division of remaining funds

After further discussion, it was agreed that;

The Bicentennial Trust Working Party recommend to the Cities of Wanneroo and Joondalup that the remaining Bicentennial Trust funds (\$20,113) be divided equally between the two Cities and used by each City for the commission of a piece of artwork recognising the Bicentennial to be displayed in each of the two local government areas.

It was decided by consensus that this recommendation be forwarded to the Council's of the two respective Cities.

4. MEETING CLOSURE

Given that funding recommendations made by the Working Party expend the remainder of funds available to the Bicentennial Trust, the Chair noted that this meeting signified the official closure of the Working Party.

Both Mr Chris Hall (City of Joondalup) and Cr Glynis Monks (City of Wanneroo) took the opportunity to thank members of the Working Party for their dedication to the objectives of the Bicentennial Trust over the past 12 years.

Mr Hall further noted that an appreciation function for members of the Working Party would be held in the upcoming months, with all members receiving an invitation to the event once details were finalised.

There being no further business, the meeting was declared closed at 8.35pm.
