Funding is dependant on incorporation.

Partial funding is supported as the organisation has prepared a management plan for the bushland and has registered the bushland with "Land for Wildlife". The recommendation for part funding of \$2500 should not be seen as setting a precedent for acceptance of late submissions. Preservation of Joondalup's natural heritage and landscape amenity by not for profit organisations complies with the City's funding guidelines.
