1	G K & J M Lilleyman	19a Stratford Place KINGSLEY WA 6026	Objects to closure but considers that closure of Kilburn Rise will lead to additional pressure on other PAWs in the area. Recommends that all PAWs be closed.	Each PAW is subject to a separate application however it may be likely that should Kilburn Rise PAW be closed then its users would seek alternative routes through the closest PAWs which would be Acton Rise and Stoke Rise. PAWs do still play an important role in the walkability of neighbourhoods and the pedestrian network.
2	K Smith-Ryan	14a Chiswick Place KINGSLEY WA 6026	Supports closure of PAW. Notes association between house burglary and PAWs; increasing anti-social behaviour and vandalism associated with PAWs and Kingsley generally; does not agree with the argument that PAWs provide quicker access.	PAWs have been created to create ease of access to areas for pedestrians. Information obtained from the Police and City Watch patrols indicate that reported incidents had no direct link to the PAWs.
3	M Macintyre	18 Stoke Rise KINGSLEY WA 6026	Requests that consideration be given to the closure of the PAW in Stoke Rise. Objects to Kilburn Rise PAW being closed without the closure of PAWs in Stoke Rise and Acton Rise. Notes that Stoke Rise and Acton Rise PAWs are close to well lit roads and nearer to alternative access routes and therefore their closure would have less impact than the closure of Kilburn Rise which is further from alternative access routes and would have a greater impact.	Refer to above comments for No 1. It is agreed that the alternative access to Acton Rise and Stoke Rise around the main road network is marginally closer and more convenient than the additional distance required to walk to Kilburn Rise.
4	J & P Rutherford	17 Acton Rise KINGSLEY WA 6026	Objects to the closure. As a resident of Acton Rise is concerned that closure of Kilburn Rise PAW will lead to more pedestrian movement and anti-social behaviour in Acton Rise.	PAWs can be very convenient pedestrian alternatives to the main road system and surveys indicate that users will be inconvenienced by its closure despite alternative PAWs in the area.
5	Name and Address withheld		Objects to the closure. Considers that the PAW is an important access link and does not consider that it is responsible for problems of vandalism or anti-social behaviour.	Nuisance Impact Assessment identifies that there is no significant correlation between anti-social behaviour and vandalism in the area and the subject PAW. The surveys indicate that the PAW is still used by residents on a regular

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				basis.
*6	Mr J and Mrs D Jones	21 Trinity Way KINGSLEY WA 6026	Submission from applicant supporting closure. Further information regarding anti-social behaviour endured. Sump oil poured in and around property and container thrown on roof. For the second time two trees planted on verge vandalised. Tap on property constantly being turned on and eventually vandalised by being cut with bolt cutters. Sprinkler heads broken. Letterbox repaired or replaced several times.	Information obtained from the Police and City Watch patrols does not indicate that the anti-social incidents reported are directly linked to the existence of the PAW.
