Cr Mackintosh began proceedings and thanked past Councillors Hurst and Kadak for their contribution to the Festival over the past 2 years.

4 JOONDALUP FESTIVAL INTRODUCTION

To welcome new Councillors to the committee, J Boyd began the meeting with a presentation on the Joondalup Festival, including its aims and objectives. The 2003 Festival video will made be available for Councillor's viewing.

J Boyd outlined the Cultural Development Program comprising of visual arts, performing arts and special events. The Festival is a cross-council event and Cultural Development works closely with Marketing Services, Operations & Infrastructure Management, Financial Services and the City's Health Officers to present a quality program in a safe environment.

The Festival and Summer Events are programmed to local community needs based on 39% of the Joondalup community being under 24 years old, and 80% under 50 years old. As 48% of the community are young families most of the events are free. The positioning statement for the Festival is 'to be the most significant event for community cultural participation in Western Australia' and the Festival is most successfully in this regard. Participation is growing steadily each year and over 5,500 community members participated in the presentation of the 2003 Joondalup Festival.

Cr Brewer left the meeting at 6.40pm.

Cr Prospero highlighted that a fashion parade might be a good community based activity to include in the Festival and stated concerns regarding the lack of life in the CBD. The festival and summer events are key areas that address these issues. Ideas of international food events and extending the summer concert series were also raised in relation to enlivening the CBD.

M Smith left the meeting at 7.00pm.

J Boyd gave an update on the 2004 Festival working on the theme 'Global Village'. A major application was being submitted to celebrate Living in Harmony in collaboration with Edith Cowan University. Submissions were also going to Healthway, Lotteries West, Festivals Australia, Australia Council and ArtsWA. Healthway will also be approached but for a triennial agreement.
