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3 BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MEETING HELD ON 28TH APRIL 2004

3.1 City of Joondalup's Bio-diversity Strategy

David Pike gave the Committee an overview of the progress being made with the City's Bio-diversity Strategy. He said the field survey work had been completed for the ninety nine reserves managed by the City that contain remnant bushland and that work will now commence to assess bushland on private land in accordance with the Perth Bio-diversity Project templates. David advised that during his field survey work he

was concerned by the number of irrigation sprinklers that were watering areas of bushland and that irrigation water was detrimental to the health of native bushland. He said that the greatest threat to the remnant bushland in the City's parks were as follows:

- Fire.
- Irrigation practices.
- Lawn mowers encroaching into bushland.
- Children building cubby houses and BMX tracks.
- Weed growth.
- Rubbish dumping.

4 **GENERAL BUSINESS**

4.1 Address by Linda Taman of the Swan Catchment Centre

Linda Taman, Regional Coordinator, North-East Catchment Committee, addressed the committee on a number of issues surrounding natural resource management on the Swan Coastal Plain. Linda spoke about the way funding from Natural Heritage Trust Stage Two (N.H.T.2.) will be devolved. She went on to explain that fifteen councils form the North-East Catchment area, including Wanneroo and the City of Joondalup. She added that four million dollars will be available to be spent on natural resource management in the metropolitan area.

S Magyar asked Linda what other funding was available other than N.H.T.2. Linda advised that funding is available to community groups through the Swan Alcoa Landcare Programme and the Enviro Fund. Linda will be contacting all councils in the North-East region in the next few weeks to see how the Swan Catchment Centre can assist them. Linda also gave a summary of the current projects she is involved in with other councils.

4.2 Fusilade Application Winter 2004

The Committee discussed the application of the selective herbicide Fusilade. Concerns were raised in relation to the effectiveness of the spraying program. It was highlighted that the City is taking a new direction in the rehabilitation and restoration of the City's natural areas. Council staff are formulating a tender that will encompass all tasks associated with natural area preservation works which will reduce the reliance on the weed spraying program.

5 OTHER MATTERS

5.1 Conservation Advisory Committee Strategic Planning Workshop

Peter Pikor informed the Committee that he is exploring the possibility of introducing a facilitator to organise a workshop to assist with the strategic direction of the Committee. Members fully endorsed the idea and Peter went on to say he envisaged the workshop to take place in July/August of this year.

5.2 Veldt Grass Control Freeway Reserve

Cherie Wood said that the Freeway Reserve was a source of veldt grass seed that was affecting the City's bushland reserves. K Armstrong said he would bring this issue to the attention of Main Roads.
