DECLARATIONS OF FINANCIAL INTEREST

ELECTION OF DEPUTY MAYOR

The role of the Deputy Mayor is to perform the functions of the Mayor when authorised to do so, that is when the office of Mayor is vacant or the Mayor is not available or is unwilling to perform the functions of the Mayor.

The office of Deputy Mayor is to be filled as the first matter dealt with at the first meeting of the Council after an ordinary election. Upon election of the Deputy Mayor, there is a requirement for the incumbent to make a further declaration for that office.

How the Deputy Mayor is elected:

- 1 The Council is to elect a Councillor (other than the Mayor) to fill the office;
- The election is to be conducted by the Mayor, or if he is not present, by the CEO;
- Nominations for the office are to be given to the person conducting the election in writing;
- 4 Nominations close at the meeting at a time announced by the person conducting the election, which is to be a sufficient time after the announcement by that person that nominations are about to close to allow for any nominations made to be dealt with;
- If a Councillor is nominated by another Councillor, the person conducting the election is not to accept the nomination unless the nominee has advised the person conducting the election, orally or in writing, that they are willing to be nominated for the office:
- The Council members are to vote on the matter by secret ballot as if they were electors voting at an election;
- Subject to Clause 9(1) of Schedule 2.3 of the Local Government Act 1995, the votes cast under subclause (6) are to be counted, and the successful candidate determined, in accordance with Schedule 4.1 of the Local Government Act 1995, as if those votes were votes cast at an election.

The Mayor called for nominations for the position of Deputy Mayor.

Cr Amphlett nominated Cr Fishwick. Cr Fishwick accepted the nomination.

Cr John nominated Cr Hart. Cr Hart accepted the nomination.

There being no further nominations, a secret ballot was conducted.

In accordance with the Local Government Act 1995, the Mayor and Chief Executive Officer carried out the required procedures for the election of the Deputy Mayor.

Following the counting of votes by the Mayor and the Chief Executive Officer, and witnessed by the Director, Governance and Strategy, the Mayor declared Cr Fishwick duly elected to the position of Deputy Mayor for a term to expire in October 2009.

Councillor Fishwick then made a Declaration of Elected Member for the position of Deputy Mayor before Mayor Troy Pickard.
