A full report was provided to Elected Members under confidential cover as part of the agenda for the Special Meeting of Council to be held on Tuesday 1 September 2009.

Call for Support of one-third of members of the Council – for Option 1 only

The Local Government Act 1995, under regulations prescribed to deal with Section 5.25(e), lays down the following procedure for dealing with revoking or changing decisions made at Council or Committee meetings:

If a decision has been made at a Council meeting, then any motion to revoke or change the decision must be supported by at least one-third of the number of officers (whether vacant or not) of members of the Council.

If supported by one-third of the members, then any decision to revoke a resolution of the Council is required to be passed by an Absolute Majority.

Prior to giving consideration to the following recommendation, Elected Members are required to give the support of one-third of its members, and such support is to be recorded in the Minutes of this meeting.

Call for Support of one-third of members of the Council

The Mayor called for support from one-third of the members of Council. Support for the revocation was given by five Elected Members present.

MOVED Mayor Pickard SECONDED Cr Amphlett that Council, BY AN ABSOLUTE MAJORITY:

- 1. REVOKES Part 1 of its resolution of 18 August 2009 relating to the Item 'Response to Joint Standing Committee on Delegated Legislation – Cats Local Law', as follows:
 - "1 ENDORSES option 3, namely that the City suggests a "compromise position" to the Joint Standing Committee on Delegated Legislation to allow the Committee's recommendations for amending the City's Cats Local Law 2008 to be modified. The City's compromise position is to include:
 - The suggestion that clause 7, (the requirement for the compulsory sterilisation of cats), be amended to include a phase-in approach that applies to cats under 6 months of age;
 - Opposition to the Committee's recommendation to amend clause 18: requiring that registration tags only be worn if a cat is not microchipped or wearing a collar containing identification details;
 - The suggestion that the City works with the Committee to create a definition for "cat nuisances" and amends clause 21(1)(b) to reflect the changes requested by the Committee;"
- 2. AGREES to support the Joint Standing Committee on Delegated Legislation's recommendations for amendments to the City's Cats Local Law 2008, as follows:
 - Clause 7 is amended to remove the requirement for the compulsory sterilisation of cats;
 - Clause 18 is amended to require that registration tags only be worn if a cat is not microchipped or wearing a collar containing identification details;
 - Clause 20(1)(b) is amended to create a definition of "cat nuisance" to reflect the changes requested by the Committee.
- 3. URGES the State Government to give priority to the development of state-wide cat control legislation that addresses community concerns related to public health, nuisance, animal welfare, sterilisation and environmental issues;
- 4. REQUESTS the WA Local Government Association reiterates its policy position that the State Government should introduce state-wide cat control legislation, noting the State Government's position that cat control is a local problem and therefore the responsibility of local governments;

5. REQUESTS the CEO to provide a report to the Council on the implications of amendments to the City of Joondalup's Cats Local Law 2008 as detailed in Part 2 above.

The Motion was Put and Carried. There being 4 votes in favour and 3 votes against, the Motion was NOT CARRIED BY AN ABSOLUTE MAJORITY
