In addition, the City will continue to work collaboratively with the school to promote road safety initiatives/programs to provide a balanced approach to road safety around the school.</p> <p>RECOMMENDATION</p> <p>That Council NOTES that:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1 the existing parking restrictions at Halidon Primary School, Kingsley have been enhanced with the inclusion of yellow 'No Stopping' markings within the existing parking restrictions and around the 10 metre prolongation of intersecting roads; 2 City will continue to work collaboratively with the Halidon Primary School, Kingsley to promote road safety initiatives and programs to provide a balanced approach to road safety around the school.
