Issues	 The issues being presented by clients include counselling needs for various areas of their lives, lack of appointment time as there are not enough female doctors to which can Has been established that young people are afraid of doctors/counsellors of breaching confidentiality. There is a lack of women who feel secure in their body image and who find it difficult to discuss and become open about such things as sexuality and their health. Young people (in particular girls) are afraid to seek doctors in regards to sexual health as they lack in confidence.
Unmet Demands / Gaps in Service provision	 A lack in counselling services offered to women. The counselling is offered to those who suffer with anxiety, relationships, abuse, sexuality, stress and family. There are limited counsellors in the facility, meaning a lot of clients are put on a waiting list that can be up to 3 months long. The service provides medical advice to women, but there can be weeks of waiting for an appointment due to the lack of female doctors.

Centre-care Youth support service is funded by DCP (non government) and offers counselling, working with families, recreation programs, community programs to young people aged 12-18 Youth Diversion System is funded by the corrective service and offers counselling, working with families, corrective services, recreation programs and community programs to young people aged 10-18 The service is referral based, there is no wait list, a minimum of 1 hour/ week of fortnight of counselling

Issues	 Young people are presenting to becoming more and more unhealthy as they are doing less physical activities and are eating more fast food to which is easily available to them. The City of Wanneroo used to put on BBQ's for the young people in the community as an outreach and to promote healthy lifestyles; but now there is a lack of funding to keep up this outreach event. Main focus currently is to target young people and promote active lifestyles and try and make more activities in the community available to them. 	
Unmet Demands/ Gaps in Service provision	 Some of the gaps in the service provision are that the City of Wanneroo does not have the funding or the space available to them in order to accommodate young people with no living arrangements. The city of Wanneroo believe that there is not a lot offered to young people in the community and therefore has resulted in young people lazing around and not being more active. In order to break this trend, the City of Wanneroo would like to partake in more community outreach and also to get the community more involved. Transportation for young people is also a gap in service provision regarding transportation for young people. Although it is available to them, it is limited. The City of Joondalup would like to work on getting other transportation available to young people,

Issues	 Majority of cases that come through this service deal with conflict in the home amongst families. A lot of young people that come t this service are very angry, violent and aggressive. There is a higher percentage of females coming through this service. It is an early intervention program that runs for up to 3 months. A lot of the issues being presented are due to parenting skills, where they are not very informant of boundaries and rules, and where parents are working full time and are not around their children. The service can organise transport for young people.
Unmet Demands/ Gaps in Service provision	 This service does not offer accommodation, nor can it assist a young person in organising housing, the service is only allowed to give details of accommodative places. The service is only available to a young person for up to 3 months, but if it had the funding and staff they would like to extend the time period from minimum 3 months to a maximum of 6 months. This would allow building better rapport with the young people and helping them adjust to the changes that might occur.

Issues	 Issues of the clients include homelessness (an increasing issue for unemployed and low income earners in Perth due to the steep rise in housing costs related to the mining boom), the cost of accessing medical care, alcohol and illicit drug use and mental health disorders. There are also legal issues, many clients have been incarcerated or have records for criminal offences and cultural and social issues related to language barriers, marginalised populations and difficulties engaging with the health care system. Street Doctor is a mobile, easily accessible, confidential, non-judgmental and non-discriminatory bulk-billing primary health care service.

	 The service employs a multidisciplinary team of GPs, Registered Nurses and Outreach Workers, with the aim of improving health outcomes and reduces hospitalization for disadvantaged people of all ages and from all areas.
Unmet Demands/ Gaps in Service provision	 Donation will assist Street Doctor to continue to provide medical assistance and support for Perth's homeless and marginalized populations. Our greatest need is to purchase and fit out a new Van to carry out this vital work.
