
Distribution of tennis courts in the City

Condition of tennis courts in the City

This information has been collated from both the City's facility audit, from observation using GIS technology, and from anecdotal evidence.





Proposed Tennis Court Facility Hierarchy

This Tennis Court Facility Hierarchy has been developed to determine the minimum review level for restorative works for the different types of tennis court facilities in the City. The facilities have been defined as either 'Regional', 'District', or 'Local' with associated minimum review levels of 8 years, 10 years and 12 years.
