It submitted an organisation chart for the shelter showing two managers, supported by a fully trained team comprising a veterinary team of 10.73 FTE, behavioural team of four FTE, and Shelter / Adoptions / Retail team of 18.9 FTE. The head veterinarian and veterinary nurse supervisor have suitable qualifications. A training matrix was noted which included a list of animal attendance tasks. The holding facility is open to the public six days a week (excluding public holidays). Impounded animals can be reclaimed seven days a week with the kennel block accessible to the City's rangers 24/7. It will provide handling training for City Rangers. It can hold dogs for seven days and cats for three days as per the legislative requirements and has 80 dog kennels of appropriate pen size. A kennel block of 20 kennels is reserved for incoming animals. It has the capacity for 66 cats with each condo providing a separate space for toileting. In the situation of a biosecurity procedure requiring a quarantine of the facility, the company will find alternative housing. It nominated four persons (including email and mobile number) in the event of emergencies.	The Royal Society for The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Western Australia (Incorporated) (RSPCA WA) demonstrated good experience as it has been providing dog impoundment services to the City since 2001. It provides shelter, care and rehabilitation to a variety of animals totalling 1500-1800 incoming animals each year. A list of its current contracts, periods and dates was not specifically addressed. References were provided.	RSPCA WA demonstrated a thorough understanding of the required tasks providing procedures for the handling, care and treatment of animals, and the processes it will undertake when communicating with the City's Rangers. A step by step explanation was submitted for how dogs and cats will be cared for on arrival and the supporting paperwork that will be completed which complies with the City's requirements. Specific information was included for how RSPCA WA will handle dangerous / feral animals, undertake sedation, perform micro chipping, and euthanise / rehome. The protocols for managing zoonotic diseases and control mechanisms were noted. It confirmed ability to retain animals according to legislative requirements.	The company is located in Malaga. Hanrob North Perth Pty Ltd  All requirements have not been met.	Partially	Hanrob North Perth Pty Ltd has been operating commercial boarding and pet transport services since 1981. It has recently been acquired by West Coast Pet Care which is located 45 minutes north of Perth and has subsequently grown in size with the introduction of a separate cattery in 2003 and a newer dog boarding facility in 2006. It submitted a site map depicting the layout of the facility, and an organisation chart showing 13 positions which conflicts with statements made elsewhere in the submission, whereby it has an established team of 15 FTE's. Whilst it stated that its senior staff have more than 60 years collective experience, individual qualifications and industry experience were not evidenced for all personnel. The company offers pet transfer options, grooming, doggie day care and a dog training program with options of train and board, personal lessons and classes. It currently operates dog daycare centres with sites managing 30-60 dogs per day. It has allocated kennel space to accommodate 20 dogs and cage space for 10 cats. The Petcare manager lives on site for emergency contact with after hour calls managed through live chat, phone or online. The ability to provide additional resources or alternative holding facilities was not addressed.	The company currently manages the Federal Government Detector Dog Transport and Dog Training program which operates seven days a week. It also has a dog training and rehabilitation program operational in New South Wales and Queensland (for Greyhounds). A detailed scope of works conducted for the contracts held was not sighted, with only generic statements provided in table format, to indicate the contract type, client and contract period. Evidence to support rehabilitation of animals in Western Australia was not included. References were provided.	The company demonstrated a basic understanding of the required tasks. It submitted information to support its proactive and reactive disease control measures when dealing with infectious and contagious conditions transferred between animals and the monitoring systems it has in place for tracking animal custody, care, control and transport. A high level summary was provided, in table format, to describe the service that will be provided. Information to support how it will accommodate dangerous / feral animals, manage animals with special needs, and comply with minimum retention periods as required by law was lacking. The company's ability to undertake reclaiming, rehoming or destruction was not clarified with arrangements for public and City Ranger access not specifically stated. It does not have an onsite veterinarian and will use the services of an external Vet located at Lakeside Vet Centre.	It has nine facilities in Sydney, Brisbane, Canberra, Darwin, Perth and Melbourne.
