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COMMUNITY CONSULTATION OUTCOMES REPORT

Trial use of CCTV in the Whitfords West Park underpass

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OVERVIEW

The community were invited to provide feedback from 8 December 2022 to 30 December 2022 on the trial use of CCTV in the underpass connecting Whitfords West Park and Whitfords City Shopping Centre. A total of 135 responses were received during the 23-day consultation period.

Over 40% of respondents were aware of the CCTV trial in the Whitfords West Park underpass. Half of respondents had used the underpass during the last year before the CCTV trial commenced. When they used the underpass before the trial, two-thirds noted that they did not feel safe.

Just over one-third of respondents had used the underpass during the CCTV trial period. Two-thirds of those who used the underpass during the trial indicated that they felt safe when doing so. When provided with the opportunity to make comment on the trial, most respondents specified their support for the CCTV and their desire for it to remain in the Whitfords West Park underpass.

STAKEHOLDERS

A total of 242 stakeholders were directly engaged by the City of Joondalup. Stakeholders identified included:

CONSULTATION MATERIALS

Residents and landowners of properties within 200 metres of Whitfords West Park, were sent information packs through the post on 8 December 2022. Information packs contained a cover letter and a Frequently Asked Questions document which directed these stakeholders to complete an Online Comment Form located on the City's website.

Resident / ratepayer groups and Whitford City Shopping Centre were sent emails on 8 December 2022 which advised them of the consultation and directed them to provide written feedback via post or email. Resident / ratepayer groups were also encouraged to promote the consultation and the Online Comment Form to their members and networks.

RESPONSE RATE

The City collected a total of 135 valid responses throughout the 23-day advertised consultation period. Responses that were considered valid include all those which contained contact details enabling identification and were submitted within the advertised timeframe. Of the 226 residents / landowners within 200 metres of Whitfords West Park, 26 submitted feedback. None of the resident / ratepayer groups provided feedback. A submission was received from Whitford City Shopping Centre and is included as Appendix 13. The final response rate was 11.7%. This data is shown in the table below.

Responses received by ward:




OUTCOMES

Were you aware that CCTV was installed in the Whitfords West Park underpass on a trial basis?




QUESTION: "Before the CCTV trial, which commenced on 31 October 2022, did you use this underpass any time during the last year?"

Before the CCTV trial, which commenced on 31 October 2022, did you use this underpass any time during the last year?




QUESTION: "Overall, how safe did you feel using the underpass before the CCTV was installed?"



Have you used this underpass since the CCTV was installed?




QUESTION: "How safe did you feel using the underpass during the time that the temporary CCTV was installed?"

Some issues raised by respondents included the following:

- Comments about anti-social behaviour that has occurred in the underpass (in general)
- Support for CCTV in other underpasses or all underpasses
- Feedback that residents noticed less anti-social behaviour / fewer people loitering when the CCTV was installed.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the purpose of the community consultation?

The City of Joondalup is seeking community feedback on the trial use of CCTV in the underpass connecting Whitfords West Park and Whitfords City Shopping Centre.

Where is the underpass located?

The underpass is located between Whitfords West Park, Kallaroo, and Whitfords City Shopping Centre, Hillarys. The entrance from Whitfords West Park is at the southern end of the park, passing under Whitfords Avenue towards Whitfords City Shopping Centre. The map overleaf provides an approximate location.

Why was CCTV installed at this underpass on a trial basis?

The underpass was identified as a location to trial the installation of CCTV because it connects to a major activity centre. There have also been a number of concerns and requests raised by community members and Elected Members in relation to this underpass.

The temporary CCTV systems will provide the City with the opportunity to test various locations to ensure that any expenditure is optimised. The City conducted the trial of CCTV use to determine if installing CCTV acted to reduce graffiti damage, loitering and littering.

When was the trail CCTV installed in this underpass?

The temporary CCTV was installed in the underpass from **Monday 31 October 2022 – Friday 9 December 2022**.

Who is being contacted to provide feedback?

Consultation is open to all members of the community. The City is directly consulting with the following community stakeholders:

- Residents and landowners within 200 metres of Whitfords West Park (north of Whitfords Avenue)
- Local resident/ratepayer groups

In addition, all information is available on the City's website. Anyone interested in the proposal can submit feedback via an Online Comment Form. Responses are limited to one per person.

How do I provide feedback?

If you are interested in providing feedback, please complete the Online Comment Form available via the Community Consultation section of the City's website at **joondalup.wa.gov.au/community-consultation** Alternatively hard-copy Comment Forms are available on request.

All feedback must be submitted through one of these forms.

When is the community consultation period open?

Do you have any comments about the trial use of CCTV in the Whitfords West Park underpass? (N = 113)

Unsure why CCTV is being installed?

If I knew they were there I would have used the underpass. My [---] year old was pushed off their bike by teenagers using the underpass to hang out. I also had to stop riding to Whitfords due to the anti-social behaviour. If cameras are there, I would use the underpass.

Any security / safety equipment initiatives are worthy. It will only affect those who are involved in unlawful and / or anti-social behaviour.

Any devices installed to protect the community are a good thing. The location of the camera could have been installed on a pole where idiots can graffiti the camera or try to break it. No problem if it helps stop bad behaviour.

CCTV should be mandatory in all underpasses.

A fantastic initiative, given the housing opportunity area nearby, and this underpass being a critical route to both key transport routes and a major activity centre. The inclusion of CCTV promotes active transport for everyone and complements lighting upgrades recently completed.

It should definitely proceed.

If this a trial, where is it proposed to extend the use of CCTV in the future? Who monitors these CCTV feeds and how do they respond if an act of concern is seen? Has the current trial been of any benefit to the community at all? If so, how? Does this trial in anyway use or involve facial recognition software? Do recordings of the CCTV feed exist? If so, who has access to them and for how long are they retained?

Yes, great idea. Please get CCTV in the Whitfords East Park underpass too.

Improved feeling of safety due to fewer people loitering in and around the tunnel. Please keep it there.

While I applaud the decision to install CCTV cameras in needed areas, I feel the need for a camera in the underpass at Connolly Drive near Currambine Boulevard. This would have been appropriate as an effort to identify the unlicenced trail bike riders using the underpass as an easy way to escape detection when they are on their way to Caledonia Avenue racetrack. They force pedestrians to negotiate crossing a 4–lane road.

I approve the use of CCTV in all underpasses in our City. The safety of our citizens is of importance to us all.

Should be made permanent.

I think it's a great idea as it will encourage people to use the underpass. Currently none of the underpasses feel safe and they are often dirty and smelly.

Agree it is a good idea and should be a permanent installation.

There are better places for the CCTV to be used. For example, in areas where there is activity from people at night, near clubs and pubs or near restaurant precincts like Hillarys Marina.

I have no issue with using CCTV cameras to curb unsocial activity and to provide a safer environment for the general public.

More CCTV coverage in areas like an underpass seems like a positive step for community security.

I think that it will certainly improve the way that users feel about the underpass. I will use the underpass instead of risking crossing the road.

I think it is a great idea. I would love to have underpasses like this (I do use others in the area) as safe as possible, and, if a camera helps, then these should be installed in all underpasses. Keep it there. The more cameras the better.

I support the installation of a CCTV in the Whitfords West Park underpass for my safety and for authorities to determine who is making the underpass so smelly and grubby with rubbish, food, upturned trolleys and cigarette butts. Puddles of dirty water collect after rain sometimes making the underpass impassable. There is a poor view through to what is happening on the Whitfords West Park (WWP) side. A large mirror set up on the righthand side of the underpass on the WWP side could assist the walker to check it is safe to continue through.

No matter how well-lit they are, all underpasses are prone to littering, graffiti, loitering, homeless people sleeping / camping and criminal activity. CCTV cameras are a must for underpasses. Also, there should be regular Ranger checks and rubbish bins placed at the entrances. Underpasses are supposed to keep people safe from traffic but, unfortunately, they attract undesirable behaviour who can present a danger or risk to the general population who transit through them. Can this underpass be gated and locked both ends when cinemas and shops are closed?

Might help stop some of the anti-social behaviour.

CCTV is absolutely necessary in this underpass (and all underpasses) for safety reasons.

A good initiative by the City but I feel that it would be better to use a 360-degree camera. Very good idea if it can be monitored and controlled to stop vandalism to the cameras and the underpass. Padbury also needs one at MacDonald Park.

A great idea. Community safety is paramount. There have been periods of intensive shoplifting by organised gangs at the shopping centre. Also, for the safety of students using the nearby bus stop on Marmion Avenue who need to be protected and now have the support.

We need everything possible to ensure and enhance our safety. Our police are under-resourced, understaffed and underpaid, so we cannot afford to rely on them at this point in time. So this camera has to stay. In addition, James Cook Park should be added to the list for CCTV monitoring as this is now a haven for delinquent youngsters, drug addicts and hostile vagrants. I am anxious every time I have to walk through this park, day or night, as the park has attracted sinister patronage that seems to carry on unabated. Not forgetting the mindless, rampant vandalism. At very least cameras should be installed around the children's playground and the ablution block.

Reliance on a single CCTV camera to ensure one's personal safety and security would be naïve as our criminals are not all deterred by surveillance devices in operation. A good testament to this on our public transport. Whilst CCTV is an excellent addition, we need this to be backed up by our WA Police and the judiciary. Lenient sentencing (the current trend) given for vile crimes such as assault, rape and murder devalues the victim. Families often have to care for victim's rehabilitation at their own expense, adding insult and trauma. Prevention is better than cure. We need to have a system that is effective, as it is, the fact that we rely on incentives rather than deterrents to prevent crime is a joke and it has to stop. Our reoffending rate is unacceptably high for one reason, there is no real deterrent and, even if perpetrators finally end up incarcerated, as soon as they are released, they revert, because our gaols have become nothing more than a holiday resort.

For me, additional CCTV is always welcome.

Absolutely sensational idea. Recommend adopting CCTV at local parks as well. We have too many youths tagging and being a part of anti-social behaviour in the City of Joondalup. Parenting has become a non-event due to disfunction and fiscal pressures. Thank you for your time.

I think any CCTV is beneficial. Prevention is better than reaction.

Definitely required.

I believe it can only be a good thing having CCTV located in underpasses in general. These areas would be a natural attraction to some of our community to hang out in, given the nature of location and that it is hidden from passing traffic.

CCTV is needed in all the underpasses to stop anti-social behaviour.

I think all underpasses should have CCTV installed permanently.

There is definitely less anti-social behaviour in the park itself. My [- - -]'s friend had a knife held to their throat in the underpass (in the presence of my [- - -] and couple of others) [- - -] years ago, since then I never use the underpass. Plus is always smelled like [- - -]. Walking past it though there is visibly less graffiti, smell and rubbish.

I think it will be a major asset for people who need to use the underpass and should be continued after the trial.

There have been many reports of homeless people sleeping under there during rough weather and, whilst the public might not feel safe, those who are desperate enough to want to rest there, also need protection from violence and robbery. A win-win until chronic homelessness can be made rare, brief, and non-recurring. Also, petty theft from homes and gardens is on the rise because the perpetrators feel the risk of being caught is low. CCTV can help identify them and have the community start to feel safe again.

Unfortunately, CCTV has become necessary to police bad behaviour. I have no problems with being recorded as I go about my business.

Reasonable idea.

Typical Joondalup Council. Install the CCTV and then ask for comments.

Very good idea as a lot of anti-social behaviour happens in and around that underpass.

Provides a little reassurance, as a [- - -], it makes me feel a little more comfortable.

Not really, as I do not use the underpass. I cross the road using traffic lights when going to the shopping centre. However, I believe it is a good idea and I support the installation of permanent CCTV.

I think the CCTV installation should be permanent. Thank you.

Security is an issue and the CCTV is necessary. Please can it be made permanent. Is it possible to also brighten the area with street art?

I am sure that CCTV cameras will deter anti-social behaviour and make the underpass safer. Hopefully, as well as recording events, the cameras are constantly monitored thereby ensuring that the police can swoop if necessary.

I think it is a great idea.

Not having a camera there would stop me using it [- - -] due to the drug aspect. Best news ever when it was installed. I can't imagine why CCTV cameras are not in every underpass.

I am [- - -] and use the underpass daily as do other [- - -] residents. Having the CCTV camera made me and my friends feel much safer. I have noticed it was much cleaner plus there was no stench of urine. I hope they keep the CCTV camera.

I think it a good idea to discourage loitering and drug use. I have not used the underpass for quite a few years, initially due to feeling uncomfortable walking past youths wearing hoodies who were sitting in there and more recently due to mobility issues. This has been going on for years so CCTV is a great deterrent. The underpass is for all of the local community to use and we should feel safe to do so.

I am most pleased to discover that a CCTV trial has been used in the Whitfords West Park underpass. I am sure that this will deter those responsible for graffiti damage, loitering and littering. Presumably the cameras, as well as recording, are continuously monitored so that the police can deal with any anti-social behaviour immediately if necessary.

I support the use of CCTV cameras in known trouble spots. This reduces the workload of rangers / police and improves overall security for residents as well. Please retain the CCTV.

Was not game enough to use the underpass, but having the camera there definitely makes an improvement. Every time I have been past, there is no one lurking anymore.

I am a [- - -] *and have been crossing the road as many people do here as it seems safer than the underpass prior to the camera. My* [- - -] *rides a bike and the camera helps with anti-social behaviour in there. I feel it is a necessity to have a camera in there for people's safety.*

I fully support having the CCTV in the underpass for the people of our community that use it. Please expand this initiative to other areas of Kallaroo, wherever it is required. Security and safety are essential for all of us who call this place home.

Positive addition to the underpass.

I think it's a valuable deterrent for anti-social behaviour and it may address and possibly capture perpetrators. I believe the camera addresses graffiti, litter, drug use, trolley dumping, assault and anti-social behaviour.

I walk past it or through it every day and, since it's installation, there I've noticed zero loitering and teenage gangs' bongs fare going on. Please let us keep them.

I see that the graffiti has stopped. It was a regular feature. I use a mobility scooter, and the path leading into the underpass going towards the shopping centre is very rough.

It was much needed to ensure that the area was monitored. That will deter incidents in the area. Thank you for installing the cameras. I have been using the underpass on a weekly basis with my [- - -] children (now [- - -] and [- - -] years old) for the last 4 years. In that time, I have felt uncomfortable using the underpass. There were regularly people smoking drugs in there, and characters that made me feel unsafe with my children. Sometimes I felt I had to cross the road on top of the underpass, with my children, which is also unsafe, but it felt safer than the tunnel. Now with the cameras, I've noticed fewer of the above problems happening. I also feel safe just with the simple fact there are cameras in there and I have not needed to cross the road with the kids. I really appreciate the cameras being placed there and hope they can stay.

Urine smell in the tunnel is gone. Dudes sleeping in the tunnel is less. Trolleys are gone. Please keep permanently for safety.

I am more confident using it now. Please keep it there permanently for our safety. Less urine, less rubbish, less graffiti and fewer people sitting around in there. Many thanks.

We have many homeless people trying to set up in our suburb the more deterrents we have the better. The local youth are also acting out more and more graffiti, and vandalism is occurring. The cameras are just one small step in solving a bigger problem.

I'd like it to stay.

Yes, the CCTV has had the intended reaction and has made the underpass a usable space for residents that is much safer than previously.

What has come from it? Was anyone found doing illegal things? If so, was the footage used to convict them?

It is a good idea. The last time I used the underpass there were trolleys, rocks and rubbish in and around the entrances. Anything that assists in keeping the area clean and to identify any troublemakers is welcome.

It was definitely a deterrent to groups hanging around. I felt safer using the underpass early in the morning walking to the gym.

I use this regularly with [- - -] *children. The CCTV made a huge difference to how safe we felt. Please bring it back.*

Great idea. Hopefully it will stop graffiti and vandalism plus make people feel safer using it. Keep it please.

Unsure if I have been through in the last 6 weeks, due to feeling unsafe previously and there is no path access from the park across to the tunnel. We have tended to give it a miss. Would like to use it more, as it is safer than crossing the road. However, I do remember the last time we did use it, it was clear from rubbish and did not smell like weed. At the time, I didn't realise CCTV was up and thought it had just been cleaned for a change. I'm guessing it must have been in the last 6 weeks. Please keep the camera.

Highly supportive of permanent CCTV installation.

It has made no difference to me. I used the underpass many times prior to the installation with no worries or issues at all.

The CCTV would make me feel safer and I would like it to remain.

It's about time.

Hopefully it becomes a permanent fixture as it seems to have deterred ongoing graffiti, school kids congregating (kids from [- - -] are the main culprit) intimidating passers-by and hopefully it has deterred homeless people that tend to camp out there from drug taking and drinking.

CCTV is a good modern approach to crime prevention.

Anything that makes the streets safer for our children is worth the money.

Our house is [---]. We have witnessed and heard the undesirable activities and noise on a daily basis. These activities have reduced immensely in the underpass since the installation of the camera. Your consideration to keep the camera as a permanent fixture would be appreciated. Thank you.

Does it work? Well the evidence is clear. Since the camera we have had less graffiti, fewer teenagers hanging out and less damage to the park. Does it work? Yes.

My [- - -] year old [- - -] uses the underpass daily and has commented that it makes [- - -] feel safer as have a few other [- - -]. My [- - -] and I have noticed a huge improvement in kids not hanging around the underpass, hence not hearing their aggressive and noisy behaviour. I hope the camera will stay. Thank you [- - -] for what you do for the community.

Please keep it. Before, I would not use the underpass unless I'm with our dog or if I go walking with my [- - -]. But in the last couple of months I feel safer to use it if I was by myself. I still won't use it after sunset, especially on weekends. Thank you. Please keep it.

There are often homeless people and teens smoking and hanging out in underpass, which is intimidating to walk past. I feel safer knowing that, if a crime is committed, they know it will be filmed and hopefully they won't hang out there. It is a busy road and lots of older residents will benefit from feeling safer to use the underpass. All residents. I feel the cameras will deter antisocial behaviour and lottering.

This deterrent is long overdue and should be made permanent without question. I have used the traffic lights rather than use the underpass. The anti-social behaviour occurring there is unacceptable, especially for the elderly.

Although I haven't used the underpass, I do use Whitfords West Park, and, with the CCTV installed, there was significantly less vandalism and groups of youths hanging around.

I think the idea is good in that it may deter behaviour, but I am also concerned with the potential vandalism of the CCTV which then would incur extra cost to ratepayers.

I think it is a brilliant idea. I just hope the camera can see people coming into the pass and going out of the pass and it is used on all underpasses. I have used the underpass between Winton Road to Joondalup Shops as well as from Whitfords Avenue to [- - -] and have felt very unsafe and have seen some interesting characters at times sitting in the underpass not for the right intentions, so I think this is great for safety.

I don't ever use any underpass in the daytime and so far, have always felt safe. I am guessing the CCTV is for anti-social behaviour which occurs at night. Hopefully it will also deter people who tag the area.

I think it should make people feel safer.

I believe CCTV and all other security measures are always a good idea even if they are not applicable to me.

I feel that if this trial is successful then it could be installed in other high-risk areas.

A minor concern about how much big brother continues to monitor us. Though, if the underpass has been a problem spot for vandalism and anti-social behaviour, it makes sense to have the CCTV installed.

Now that I know there is CCTV, I am more likely to use the underpass.

Should be more cameras around.

Comment: I normally cross the road. I note rust marks and red lines on the photo. Crossing exit on south side is too steep and high to be used.

I think it is a great idea.

Think it's great. With the increase in theft and car break-ins in our area lately and with the people involved being on foot, we had CCTV footage to show this, but they were too far away to get a clear photo. These cameras could help identify these people and make our community safer. I think it's much needed and will encourage local people to use the underpass more.

I like that there is a camera. Using the underpass always makes me feel a little uneasy. Although it is short, the location makes it exposed to anti-social behaviour. I would not use it after dark unless the lighting is very good and the camera stays.

I think it is an excellent idea. I have not used any underpass as I feel they are unsafe. It is not an invasion of privacy, it is much needed security.

I think it's a great idea, anything or device used to stop these thugs gets my thumbs up.

I am aware of the issues that were happening before the trial, and that the local Councillor's suggestion that CCTV be installed was rejected. Underpass safety in all suburbs is a concern and I have felt unsafe using the underpasses in Woodvale. I believe that it should be installed everywhere where there are issues. I therefore support the permanent installation of CCTV in the Whitfords West Park underpass.

This trial has my complete agreement and I am looking forward to it being permanent.

Good idea to trial the system and, with proper signage, it should deter any unsavoury or criminal conduct in there. It has been a black spot in the evenings for quite a while.

My comments are not really related to this particular underpass. I feel that we need more CCTV in other areas, like the parks around Woodvale and car park areas, to try to identify thefts and damage in the area. As a resident, I am worried about the increase in violence and thefts in the area. I, myself, have security cameras around my home, but feel more is needed to help reduce or track down offenders.
