## Competent Witnesses

Persons who may witness statutory declarations in Western Australia:

- 1 The Chief Executive Officer or Deputy Chief Executive Officer of a Local Government.
- 2 A member of the Council of a Local Government.
- 3 An Electoral Registrar appointed under the Electoral Act 1907.
- 4 A person appointed to take charge of a Post Office in the State
- 5 An Officer of the State or Commonwealth Public Service.
- 6 A teacher within the meaning of the Education Act 1928.
- 7 A Police Officer.
- 8 A person appointed to take charge of the head of any branch office in the State of a Bank carrying on business under the Banking Act 1959 of the Commonwealth or under a written law of the State.
- 9 A person appointed to take charge of the head of any branch office in the State of a Society within the meaning of the Building Societies Act 1976 or a Credit Union within the meaning of the Credit Unions Act 1979.
- 10 A secretary of an organisation of employees or employers registered under the Industrial Relations Act 1979 or of an organisation registered under the Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904 of the Commonwealth.
- 11 A practitioner within the meaning of the Legal Practitioners Act 1893.
- 12 A medical practitioner registered under the Medical Act 1894.
- 13 A pharmaceutical chemist within the meaning of the Pharmacy Act 1964.
- 14 A member of the academic staff of an institution providing courses at post-secondary education level.
- 15 A holder of a licence under the Real Estate and Business Agents Act 1978 or the Settlement Agents Act 1981.
- 16 An insurance broker registered under the Insurance (Agents and Brokers) Act 1984 of the Commonwealth.
- 17 A person registered as an auditor or a liquidator under the Corporations Act 1989.
- 18 A Justice of the Peace:
  - (a) for the State, or
  - (b) appointed for any part of the Commonwealth that is outside the State.
- 19 A Commissioner for Declarations:
  - (a) appointed under the Declarations and Attestations Act 1913 as amended, or
  - (b) appointed under the provisions of the Statutory Declarations Act 1959 of the Commonwealth.
- 20 An electoral registrar, postmaster, classified officer in the State or Commonwealth Public Service, classified State schoolteacher or member of the police force.
- 21 A member of either House of Parliament or the State or of the Commonwealth.
