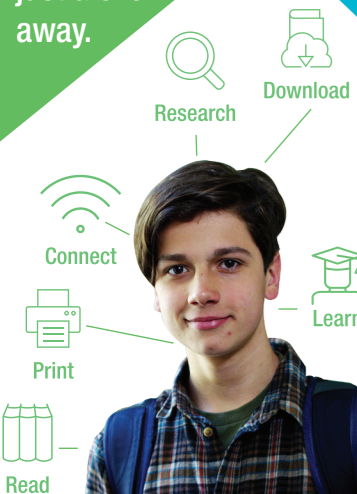

Our digital resources include Australian and international databases, an encyclopaedia and language-learning tools, plus links to top quality free resources on the Internet.



Visit joondalup.wa.gov.au, search for the Library Catalogue and select All Online Resources to make stress over research and assignments a thing of the past.



This online encyclopaedia delivers instant results to all your questions in 3 levels of reading ability: kids, teens and adults. After choosing a level, you can explore features such as articles, an atlas and time-lines as well as magazines, videos, and links to other websites.

ProQuest – Research Library

This database provides one-stop access to more than 4,000 periodicals from one of the broadest, most inclusive general reference databases ProQuest has to offer. Search from a highly-respected, diversified mix of scholarly journals, trade publications and magazines covering over 150 academic disciplines.

Try searching the Internet using the article title – often university web sites or online journals have articles available free of charge even if Proquest or Informit don't provide the full text of an article you want.
