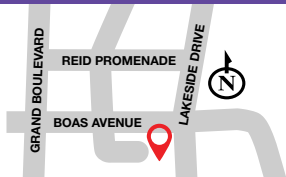

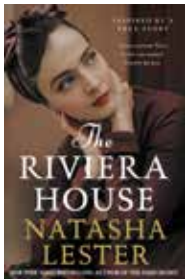
*Live to learn and learn to live is her motto, because, the brain is one of the most vital parts of our body – and medical research shows that the old saying is very true – “use it or lose it!”*

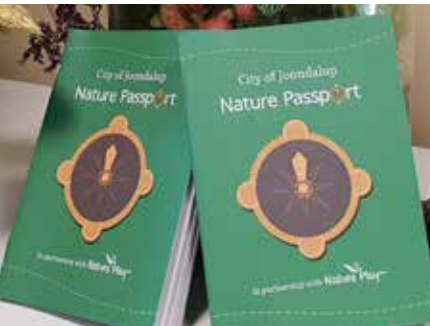

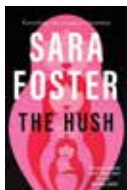
