

# Specified Equipment

## Summary of Regulation 14 of *Environmental Protection (Noise) Regulations 1997*

This information sheet provides a summary of the conditions which apply to “specified equipment”, as set out in the *Environmental Protection (Noise) Regulations 1997*.

### Definition

‘Specified equipment’ is any equipment which requires the constant presence of an operator for normal use. It includes many common household items, such as lawn mowers, power tools, basketballs and musical instruments.

Noise from specified equipment typically exceeds the assigned noise levels set out in the regulations. The assigned levels do not apply providing:

1. The specified equipment is used:
  - between 7.00am and 7.00pm, Monday to Saturday; or
  - between 9.00am and 7.00pm on a Sunday or Public Holiday.
2. The specified equipment is not used for more than:
  - two hours per day; or
  - one hour per day if it is a musical instrument.
3. The specified equipment must be used in a reasonable manner and the noise emitted must not unreasonably interfere with the health, welfare, convenience, comfort or amenity of an occupier of premises receiving the noise. Determining whether or not a noise is unreasonable is at the discretion of the Environmental Health Officer.
