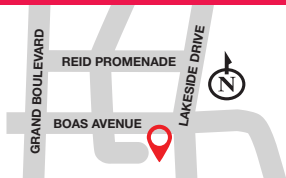
Welcome to Summer - carols in the park, fun in the sun, time at the beach, picnics by the lake, reading under a tree or just chilling out during the holidays.

Audiobooks are proven to improve children's pronunciation, vocabulary and speaking fluency. Even kids who struggle to read show increased comprehension of over 75% from audiobooks.

All eBooks and audiobooks are free to checkout and not subject to any fees or fines.
