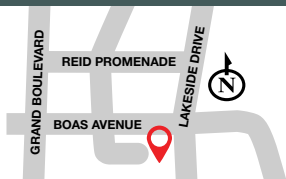



When Joondalup Library opened its doors in 1997, it was a long awaited event. 10,000 people passed through the doors within the first day and 4,432 items were loaned, stripping many of the shelves of their brand new stock. By the second day, staff had joined up 1,000 new members.

Today, the Joondalup Library community has borrowed over 12 million items and more than seven million people have passed through its doors.

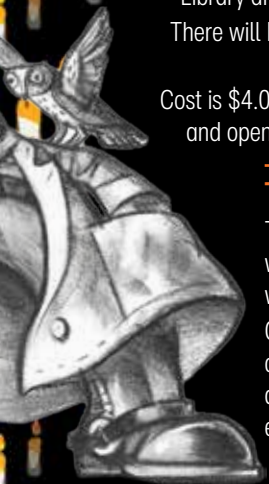

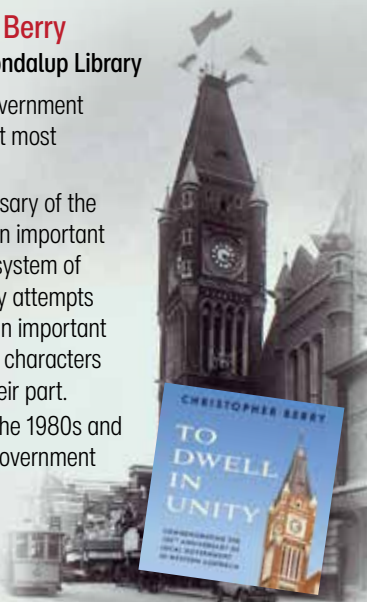
As one of Australia's three spheres of government (Federal, State, Local), Local Government most closely affects the daily lives of citizens.

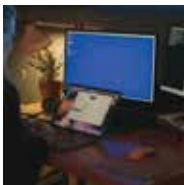

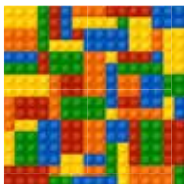
