

NAIDOC Week

In celebration of NAIDOC week, the City will run a month-long program of events from 1 – 31 July 2022 including tours, workshops, theatre performances, an exhibition and more.

NAIDOC Week is an annual national celebration of the history, culture, and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. Each July, to coincide with the national celebrations and in recognition of their significance, the City of Joondalup presents a program of activities highlighting Australian Indigenous cultures. Since 2010 the City's program of events has been expanded to cover a one-month period.


The 2022 NAIDOC theme, set by the national NAIDOC committee is: Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up!





Kambarang Concert

Richard Walley's 6 Seasons Concert with the Junkadelic Collective

Join the City in celebration of the end of Kambarang as we turn to Birak season. Dr Richard Walley and the Junkadelic Orchestra will present a collection of original songs for the six Noongar seasons - Makuru, Djilba, Kambarang, Birak, Bunuru and Djeran. The songs use different musical genres to tell the six seasons story - including blues, choral, jazz, reggae, funk, rock and hip-hop.

The multicultural 16-piece band features Richard Walley on Didgeridoo and some of Perth's best new vocalists including Tani Walker, Natasha Eldridge, Boox Kid, Adrial Opum and MC Flewnt – backed by the Junkadelic Brass Band.

Valentine's Concert

The Valentine's Concert is the City of Joondalup's premier music event held annually on the picturesque grounds of the Joondalup Resort, with the ninth hole of the Lakes Course transformed into an outdoor concert venue for the night.

In previous years the event has been attended by 7,500 people who have enjoyed performances from Perth Symphony Orchestra, Western Australian Symphony Orchestra, Human Nature, The Whitlams, David Campbell, Dan Sultan, Kate Cebrano, Michael Falzon and many more.

Joondalup Festival

The Joondalup Festival was first established in 1998 with the objectives of bringing the community together, increasing the level of activity and community participation within the City Centre, and generating awareness of cultural activities within Joondalup. Still the region's largest cultural event, the Festival is the finale to the summer events program.

After a three-year break during COVID-19, the Joondalup Festival returned in 2022 with an exciting new format. The revitalised program is now held over a three-week period across various locations throughout the City.

The Festival aims to enrich the culture of the Joondalup community by creating a range of artistic opportunities for audiences and artists within the City and to deliver an iconic event in metropolitan Perth attracting attendance from far and wide.

In 2023 the Festival seeks to return to featuring local, national and international artists presenting work for the community, by the community and with the community.



Art Collection

The City of Joondalup's art collection comprises of over 280 artworks, with a primary focus on the work of Western Australian contemporary artists.

The City of Joondalup collection is valued over \$1,050,000 and features a wide range of art forms, including painting, sculpture, drawings, ceramics, print, textiles, video and glass works.

Amongst the highlights are artworks by Indigenous artists Sandra Hill, Julie Dowling, Shane Pickett and Tim Leura Tiapaltiarri, and by a significant number of senior Western Australian practitioners including William Boissevain O.B.E., Elizabeth Ford, Brian McKay, Eveline Kotai and Hans Arkeveld, Local artists represented include Suzanne Logue, Shelley Cowper and Trevor Bly.

The City of Joondalup holds an annual contemporary art prize for professional Western Australian artists. Artworks acquired here form the cornerstone of the collection and represent an impressive syndicate of West Australian artists over the past 24 years. Trevor Richards, Jon Tarry, Brenden Van Hek, Susanna Castleden, Teelah George, Susan Roux and Paul Kaptein are some of the Invitation Art Prize winners. In 2023 the collection celebrates 25 years and will host a retrospective showcase of all the winners.



Capturing the City's social, urban, cultural and environmental attributes are artworks acquired through the City's Visual Art Commission Program, running since 2012. Major commissions have been awarded to many WA artists, including Christopher Pease, Tony Windberg, Lindsay Harris and Nien Schwarz as well as Helen Pynor from NSW and United States artist. Brandon Ballengee.

The City of Joondalup's Art Collection has substantial value and carries an enviable reputation. Over the years it has grown in sophistication and vision, becoming an important cultural asset for the people of Joondalup. It can be viewed in public spaces in the City's Libraries and community facilities, Civic Chamber and Administration Building or by visiting

Community Art Exhibition

The Community Art Exhibition is an annual exhibition open to all community members held at Lakeside Joondalup Shopping Centre celebrating the City's artistic community.

Each year the Community Art Exhibition celebrates over 160 local artists and their artworks, incorporating a wide range of traditional and contemporary media, spanning painting, drawing, sculpture, ceramics, glass work, textiles, photography, printmaking, and mixed media.

A range of prizes are offered each year in the following categories:

- Most Outstanding Artwork \$4,000
- Highly Commended \$1,500
- Celebrating Joondalup \$1,500
- Student Award \$750
- Arts in focus **\$500** with solo exhibition
- Inside Out Billboard Commission \$3,000

Invitation Art Prize

The Invitation Art Prize is an annual acquisitive art prize open to professional Western Australian artists.

It is acknowledged by the visual arts industry as one of the major contemporary visual art prizes for professional artists in the state.

The annual City of Joondalup Invitation Art Prize takes place in October at the Westfield Whitford City Shopping Centre and exhibits the work of up to 30 invited professional Western Australian artists, providing the Joondalup community with access to thought provoking contemporary artworks. During the exhibition the City provides a public education program to inform and develop understanding of visual arts practices, including artist floor talks, masterclasses, forums and workshops. The art prize has been running since 1998 and celebrates 25 years in July 2023.

Public Art

The defining principle of public art is that the work has been designed by an artist for enhancement of a public realm. Public art can be of any art form, from traditional media such as sculpture to contemporary works, or functional objects and multimedia installations. It may be a permanent or temporary artwork or ephemeral art and has a broad scope with many possibilities for the form, function and materials.

The City's current Public Art Collection comprises of 36 works including mosaics, murals, sculptures, street bollards, architectural details and street furniture. Much of the works are in and around the Joondalup City Centre. To guide the delivery of public art projects that contribute to creating a sense of place, promote the expression of local identity, and reflect on the shared values of the community, the City adopted a Public Art Policy on all refurbishments of City-owned properties or new developments where the overall project costs are over \$1,000,000.

Inside-Out Billboard

Upcoming cycle

The Inside-Out Billboard project provides the community with an opportunity to view contemporary artworks by Western Australian artists commissioned by the City of Joondalup.


These artists are selected from the Community Art Exhibition and Invitation Art Prize to have their work displayed in large format in the public realm. Each artwork is installed on the facade of the Joondalup Library for six months and then later reinstalled at the Joondalup Courthouse.

In October 2022 a new work by Britt Mikkelsen will be installed on the Joondalup Library billboard, following her selection from the Invitation Art Prize in 2021.

Arts in Focus

Arts in Focus is a community cultural development initiative that aims to provide information, advice and advocacy for local artists and cultural groups, and build their capacity to create and participate in cultural activities within the City. The program aims to provide development and networking opportunities for interested individuals and organisations.

Mural Arts

The City's Mural Arts Program aims to introduce a range of mural styles that reflect the diversity of the community's aspirations and tastes.

It builds on and promotes the character and identity of the Joondalup region by running two annual programs:

Artist-driven mural programs, whereby an artist is commissioned to install a mural in reference to the location and the surrounding community. This is through a curated shortlisting process.

Community-driven murals involve engaging the community through programs such as the City's Schools Connections Program in the design and installation of the mural.

The most recent commission was *Rhythm on the Lake*, completed by Jack Brommell in Central Park, Joondalup. This work depicts local flora and fauna, promoting environmental awareness and celebrating the diverse wildlife of the region.

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

Arts Development Scheme funding

The City of Joondalup Arts Development Scheme is a fund designed to develop new audiences in the Joondalup area. The aim of the Scheme is to bring professional performing arts companies to the City of Joondalup for performances and workshops.

The Scheme represents an opportunity for professional performing arts organisations in Western Australia to develop an audience base in the northern metropolitan area of Perth.

The Scheme objectives are:

- To encourage professional arts organisations to stage performances and workshops in the Joondalup region;
- To increase the number and diversity of quality performing arts projects in the Joondalup region;
- To provide opportunities for students and community groups to interact with professional performers;
- To stage performances and participatory workshops that result in an increase in community skills and knowledge;
- To gain recognition of the City's support of cultural activities; and
- To enhance the quality of life of the community.

Community Funding

The Community Funding Program provides financial support to incorporated community groups to conduct projects, programs, events or activities that benefit the City of Joondalup community.

The program provides two levels of funding, with large grants (greater than \$10,000) offered annually and small grants (\$10,000 and lower) offered bi-annually.

The next funding round will open on **Monday 1 August 2022**.

Funding rounds are generally held in February and August each year.

Eligibility criteria

All applications for the Community Funding Program must meet the following criteria:

- The project, program, event or activity that funding is being sought for must benefit or service the City of Joondalup community.
- The project, program, event or activity must align with one or more of the Community Funding Program Priorities.
- The project, program, event or activity has NOT received financial support through another funding program from the City within the same financial year.
- The applicant must be incorporated under the Associations Incorporations Act 2015 (or other Australian State Government Incorporations Act).



Funding priorities

Applicants must address at least one of the four funding priorities:

- Strengthen Community Participation.
- Encourage Connected Communities.
- Promote Healthy and Active Lifestyles.
- Build Resilient and Sustainable Communities
