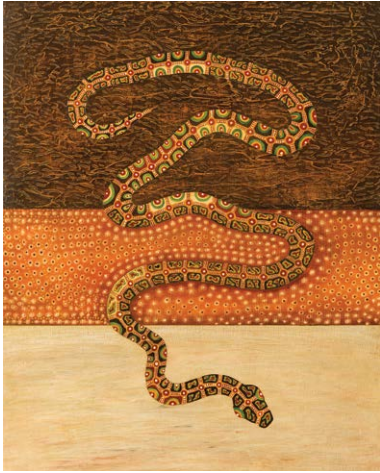

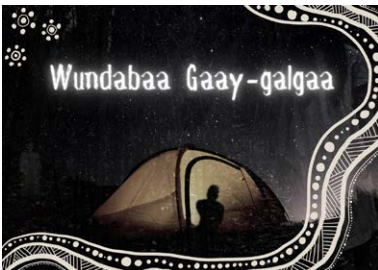
**Sunday Serenades –
