The Western Australian Public Libraries Online Book Club is embarking on a new reading journey through to **Friday 7 October**, and we would love to have you join us. We will be reading:

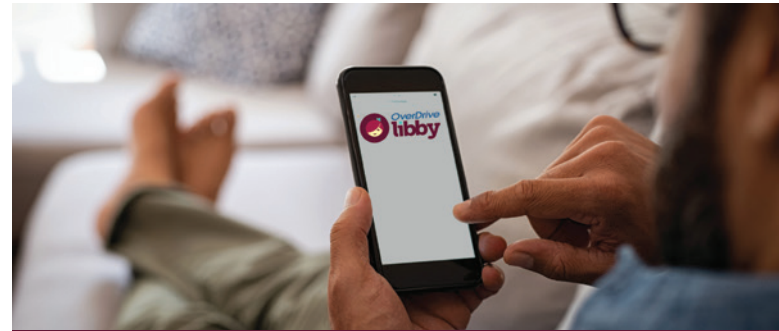

Generally, we do not like favouritism however, sometimes one style has three different purposes and audiences. Which one do you like most?

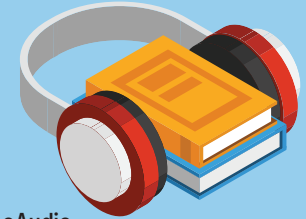


Print

- It is a comfortable, traditional and nostalgic experience where you can browse, flick between the pages, share and pass along to friends
- Possibility of impressing strangers with your reading material when they look at the cover
- Okay, own up...How often have you stopped, opened a book and smelt the pages?
- Books are the perfect home decorating accessory
- You can get the author to sign your own personal copy, or a copy for a friend.
- Free from the library however you do need to have contact with a person or the after-hours chute to return them

eBook

- Very convenient when downloaded onto a mobile device and you can access new reading material almost immediately
- More room in the suitcase when travelling as you can have 100s of books on your device
- Nobody can judge your reading material, even if you have only just discovered the Harry Potter books
- They don't have to watch their weight – they only weigh as much as your device
- Stationery store on steroids with its own inbuilt dictionary, bookmark and highlighter
- Free from the library and they magically return themselves



eAudio

- Enjoy the drive with a story of your choice instead of the radio blaring
- Hear the authors voice reading their story or actors who really bring the story alive
- You can pause the audio at any time, and of course restart when it is convenient
- Never be late finishing a book for book club – listen to it on your commute
