# NEW SHARK MITIGATION MEASURES ALONG COASTLINE

Shark Warning System Towers have been installed at four locations along the City's coastline, including Sorrento Beach – formerly home to a beach enclosure.

The City of Joondalup has worked closely with the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) on alternative shark mitigation measures along its coastline since the removal of the enclosure in November last year.

Each tower use lights, sirens, and audio broadcasts to warn beach users of shark activity in the area, acting on information sent to it from network receivers which are activated automatically if a tagged shark is detected in the area.

City of Joondalup Rangers can manually activate each tower from a mobile device, following a shark sighting. Each solar-power receiver features the latest technology and connects to a digital phone network. Towers are located at beaches adjacent to the four receivers.

The Sorrento network receiver was moved 5.63km south, and inshore, from its previous location. Two other receivers were also relocated: Ocean Reef, 700 metres south of its previous location and Mullaloo (North) 200 metres north. The location of the receiver at Mullaloo (South) has not changed.

From October to April, the towers are activated daily from 5.00am – 7.00pm. For the rest of the year, they operate between 6.00am – 6.00pm.

The City's collaboration with DPIRD and support from the State Government has resulted in a great outcome for local beachgoers.

# Did you know?

The City of Joondalup has 65 Beach Emergency Numbers (BEN) signs along its coastline to help improve emergency response times. Surf Life Saving WA receives partial funding for patrolled beach lifeguard services at Mullaloo and Sorrento from **Tuesday 1 November 2022 – Sunday 30 April 2023**. Coastal aerial patrols are now in operation and will run until **Sunday 30 April 2023**.

# Joondalup Council Elects New Deputy Mayor

The Joondalup Council has elected Cr John Logan as the City's new Deputy Mayor.

Cr Logan replaces Cr Christine Hamilton-Prime, who stepped aside after 12 months in the role.

The election of a Deputy Mayor by the Council is formally for a two-year term, but Cr Hamilton-Prime chose to serve one year only, in keeping with the Council's longstanding practice and to give another elected member the opportunity to fulfil the role.

The Deputy Mayor, Cr Logan, will also serve one year in the role until the next Council elections in October 2023. The South East Ward Councillor was first elected to the Joondalup Council in October 2015.

## Welcome to the final edition of City News for 2022.

We are just one week into summer and our City has already hosted some of the hottest events in Perth.

And there is plenty more to come this summer season - a just reward for our community who displayed great resilience and patience over the past three summers.

Following the phenomenal success of the 2022 Invitation Art Prize, which garnered plenty of national and local headlines, thousands of people attended the Little Feet Festival.

As City News was going to print, a big crowd was expected to attend the opening Music in the Park concert of the season at Penistone Park. Greenwood. At the same venue, just 24 hours later, Dr Richard Walley's Six Seasons and the Junkadelic Orchestra were preparing to deliver their genredefying Kambarang concert - a fitting way to mark the end of the Noongar season of abundance and welcome the start of Birak.

In February we will celebrate an important part of Joondalup's indigenous story.

The Council will partner with Perth Festival – Australia's longest-running multi-arts festival - to bring a significant Indigenous cultural event to Joondalup.

And Lake Joondalup will take centre stage on the opening weekend.

This commissioned work will tell the story of Dioondal, the spirit woman said to have created the Milky Way above, and whose name lives in Joondalup. This world premiere will bring together cutting-edge technology and ancient storytelling connected to the Lake that gives our City its name.

Perth Festival has produced major events such as 'The Giants' in Perth CBD, 'Highway to Hell' along Canning highway and 'Boorna Waanginy: The Trees Speak' at Kings Park.

About 10,000 to 15,000 people per night are expected to attend this free event from Friday 10 February -Sunday 12 February.

Helping to facilitate access to Aboriginal voices, stories and heritage for the benefit of all of our community within the City of Joondalup is an important part of

what we do.

Preparations for one of our most beloved events, the Joondalup Festival, is well underway.

About 50,000 people attended the region's biggest cultural event earlier this year despite public health and social measures being in place at the time! What a remarkable result. Expect those attendance figures to only rise in 2023.

For the second time the festival will be held over three weeks and at various locations throughout the City. The festival program will consist of free, subsidised, and ticketed events.

Speaking of big events, I hope you didn't miss the Joondalup Festival of Motoring which took over our City's streets in late October.

We held a car event in our City Centre shortly after becoming a City in our own right in 1998. More than two decades on, our Council wanted to re-establish Joondalup's historic links to motorsport. We certainly achieved that goal.

Where else would you rather spend summer and the Christmas and New Year period than in Joondalup?

Enjoy the sun. Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

# WHAT'S GOING ON IN YOUR NEIGHBOURHOOD

### **STATUS: Ongoing**

In September, the City demolished the timber bridge over Moolanda Boulevard due to concerns about its structural integrity. Planning is now underway on the design of a replacement bridge. A new bridge is expected by late-2023.

### **STATUS: Project Complete**

Work included:

- Installation of a new playspace
- Extensions/alterations to the path network
- Irrigation upgrades
- Picnic facilities (table/shelter)
- Bench seating
- A new drinking fountain, mulched garden beds and new turf areas.





Ocean Reef Park, Ocean Reef

### October 2022 – February 2023

Irrigation component: Upgrades include:

- Four separate hydrozones with different levels of irrigation and one ecozone (native planting)
- New trees
- A new playspace and installation of partial fencing
- Replacement of the double cricket net and cricket wicket
- A new barbecue, picnic shelter and picnic setting, drinking fountain, concrete footpath network, seats and bollards.

Work included:

- New nature play items
- Extensions/alterations to the path network
- Irrigation upgrades
- Bench seating, mulched garden beds and new turf areas.

# November 2022 – November 2023

Building component:

Work includes demolition of the toilet and changeroom facility and construction of a new facility (on the existing building footprint).

This will include new toilets and changerooms, a universal access toilet, umpires' changeroom, increased storage and an improved kiosk facility.

This good news story featured on Channel 7 News, PerthNow (print and online) and on 6PR Radio's Rumour File. It also generated considerable engagement (likes, loves and shares) on social media.

The City beat other marketing and PR agencies and private businesses from across Australia to win this prestigious award.

This innovative initiative has also been named a finalist in the AIM WA Pinnacle Awards in the Marketforce Group Marketing Excellence Award category to be announced soon.

## **LEAFY CITY PROGRAM**

Creating neighbourhoods that are cooler, more comfortable, and greener for everyone.

The City of Joondalup developed the Leafy City Program to provide increased leafy canopy cover in residential streets in order to mitigate the environmental impact of climate change and urban growth and to create cooler, inviting green urban spaces.

Since the program commenced in May 2017 it has seen the planting of more than 4,500 trees across 12 different suburbs. The next round of tree planting will commence in May through to August 2023 with the planting of almost 2,000 trees throughout the streets of Edgewater, Duncraig and Mullaloo, further increasing the urban tree canopy and reducing the heat island effect.
