






Discovery Session – Cape to Cape Walk Tuesday 20 June, 6.00pm, Woodvale Library

Mooro Country

According to archaeological evidence, Noongar people have lived in the area around Yellagonga Regional Park for at least 40,000 years prior to European colonisation. This area is called Mooro and the Regional park is named after an important Noongar elder of the early colonial period – Yellagonga.



What's in a name?

Nomenclature – the devising or choosing of names is a fascinating topic, however have you ever wondered what our suburb names mean and where they come from? Some are named after locations such as Edgewater and others after local identities.

Beldon: Beldon is named after A.W. Beldon, whose name appears in a list of early landowners and surveyors of Wanneroo.

Burns Beach: Burns Beach is named after shepherd Tommy Burns who was employed by the Clarkson brothers and grazed sheep in the area.

Connolly: Named in honour of John Connolly who held land in the area in 1838. Connolly was a private in the 63rd Regiment who arrived in the colony in 1829.

Craigie: Craigie is one of four suburbs created from an area known previously as Whitford. It is likely that developers Taylor Woodrow named it after either Craigie Lake, as Lake Joondalup was known by European Settlers, or Craigie Farm, which the Spiers family had established on the south-eastern shore of Lake Joondalup in the early 1900s.

Currambine: Currambine is an Aboriginal name from New South Wales that means *heaps of rocks*.

Duncraig: This suburb name was approved in 1969. The name was first used in the area as a promotional name, and it is of Scottish origin.

Edgewater: Edgewater derives its name from its location on the western shores of Lake Joondalup.

Greenwood: Greenwood may have been named after the Greenwood Archery Club which was established during the 1940s to entertain the local youth in the area. Another source states that Greenwood derived its name from the promotional estate name Greenwood Forest used by the Gold Land Development Corporation who began development of the area in 1969.

Heathridge: The name Heathridge was chosen because of the heath-type vegetation growing on the sand ridges in the area.

Hillarys: Hillarys is named after Bertram John Hillary, a Gallipoli war veteran who set up the first beach shack on a lonely stretch of beach in 1930.

Iluka: Iluka is an Aboriginal word from an eastern states dialect and is said to mean *near the sea*.

Joondalup: Joondalup is an Aboriginal word first recorded in 1837, and possibly means *place of glistening*.

Kallaroo: Kallaroo is an Aboriginal word meaning road to the water.

Kingsley: Named after the village of Kingsley which is near Winchester in Hampshire, England. The name was chosen for the historical association with the first owner of land in the area, William Kernot Shenton.

Kinross: Kinross is a subdivision of Burns Beach and is named after Kinross, Scotland. It recognises the Scottish ancestry of Tommie Burns (Burns Beach) a shepherd who ran sheep in the area.

Marmion: Marmion is named after Patrick Marmion of the schooner *Pelsart*, who operated a whaling station in the area in 1849.

Mullaloo: Mullaloo was originally called Moolalloo until the spelling was changed to Mullaloo. One record of the Aboriginal name records it as meaning *place of the rat kangaroo*.

Ocean Reef: Ocean Reef gets its name from a line of reefs offshore from Mullaloo.

Padbury: Padbury is named after Walter Padbury who was a pastoralist, merchant, philanthropist, and Western Australia's first millionaire. Mr Padbury was the first landholder in the area.

Sorrento: It's assumed that the name 'Sorrento' was taken from the Italian seaside town of Sorrento which is located south of Naples opposite the Isle of Capri.

Warwick: Warwick derives its name from the main road in the area. It's thought to be named after an early settler by the name of Jack Warrick. The spelling was changed to Warwick to be in keeping with English and Scottish names that are a feature of the suburb.

Woodvale: Woodvale derives its name from the area being rolling undulating country with many stands of good timber.
