

3 Plant a small to large tree to cool your garden and provide some canopy cover and shade.

6 Provide water for wildlife.

4 Dense and prickly shrubs for small birds to shelter in.

2 Balance your garden with a variety of plant heights and layers.

10 Have rocks and log/s for lizards to lounge on.

7 Apply a thick mulch and leave a few exposed patches of sand for native bees to nest in.

11 Incorporate a pond or dampland for frogs, bee and/or butterfly hotel, and/or a nest box for birds and/or mammals.

5 Cluster plants by water requirement and to provide mass flowering incentives to attract wildlife.

8 Plant grasses and groundcovers to attract insects.

12 Keep cats indoors or in a pen or run to protect wildlife.

1 Rich in biodiversity – include a range of species of various forms, heights and habits.

9 Feature plants with yellow, white and blue flowers
