Every avid reader experiences a phase of reading doldrums, a time when your favourite authors are either between books or, even worse, have passed away, leaving you struggling to find an engaging book.

When browsing your library shelves feels like a daunting task and making it past the first 50 pages of a book becomes a Herculean effort, it's high time for a revitalising change. Libby has compiled six strategies to assist you in discovering your next compelling read.

1. Re-read an old favourite – You know you love that story, those characters, the feels you get from reading it. Revisit an old friend.

2. Swap to a different format – If you mostly read, try listening. A good narrator will engage you in ways regular reading just can't.

3. Keep it short – Try a novella or short story to entertain in well under 250 pages.

4. Try a new genre – If you normally read from one genre, go for something outside your usual theme.

5. Stick with a favourite genre, but from a different country – Try an English translation or a book published in Singapore, India, South Africa or New Zealand.

6. Chat with the author – Get a new insight into your reading by joining Libby Book Club with a monthly Zoom conversation.







