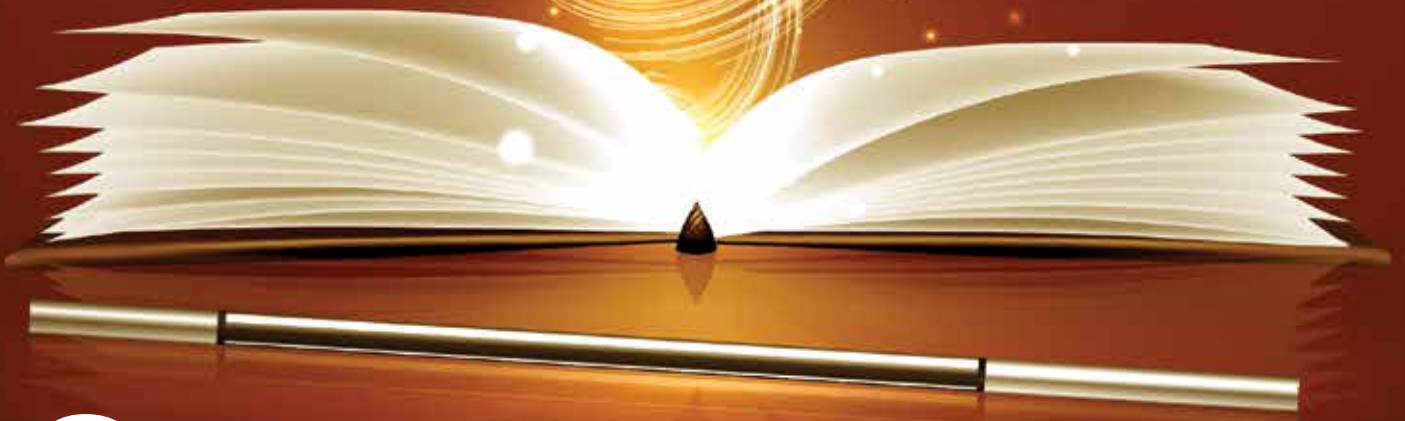

City of Joondalup Libraries welcomes you to join our free annual Children's Book Week celebrations.

This year, the theme is

Reading is Magic

A wide range of local authors, illustrators and storytellers are joining us in 2024. All schools in the City of Joondalup are invited to participate in activities designed to link quality literature to a pathway of learning, discovery, innovation, and creativity.

Children's Book Week allows your students to engage in:

- Meet the author talks
- Meet the illustrator talks
- Storytelling performances

All sessions are free. Bookings are essential and open on **Wednesday 17 April 2024**.

Bookings can only be made on the City's website joondalup.wa.gov.au

Please read the following **How to Book a Session** information carefully and consider all school commitments and transport requirements before making your booking request.

How to Book a Session:

1. Browse through the program and select the presenters and sessions that interest you.
2. Keep in mind your own constraints such as class sizes, ages, location, bus availability, sports carnivals and other school commitments or excursions during those dates, and only select those sessions you have a firm intention of attending.
3. Please use one Online Booking Request Form per class. You may indicate up to three preferences. Please prioritise one to three which sessions you prefer, with one being most preferable.
4. All Online Booking Requests must be submitted by **Monday 27 May 2024**.
5. Every effort will be made to allocate each school's higher preferences but please keep in mind that some presenters will be very popular and not every class will be able to be accommodated.
6. An initial round of offers will be made to schools by **Monday 10 June 2024** to allow schools enough time to plan for attendance.
7. It is a courtesy to authors/illustrators for classes to be familiar with their books – it also makes their sessions even more interesting for the students. If you need help please ask your school librarian, or our Library and Community Programs Officer on **9400 4759**.
8. If a school must cancel for any reason, notice of at least three working days prior to the event must be provided.

She was raised in a large Noongar family, growing up on Wilman Boodja listening to stories and learning culture and language from her Kabarli (Nana). Isobel holds a Master in Aboriginal Languages and a degree in teaching, including Noongar language.

She is enthusiastic about sharing her cultural knowledge with students and teachers. Through interactive games, students will learn Noongar words for animals and plants that are featured in Isobel's book *Nedingar*. This is a fun, engaging presentation getting students moving and participating in activities.

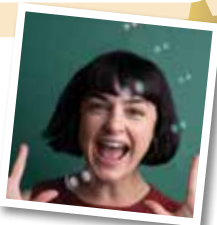
