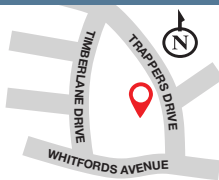
A massive thank you to everyone who continues to support our events and programs. Many of our events sell out quickly, so if you see something you like, we recommend you book in now!

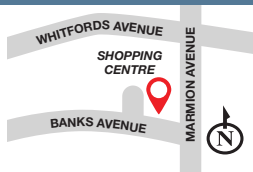

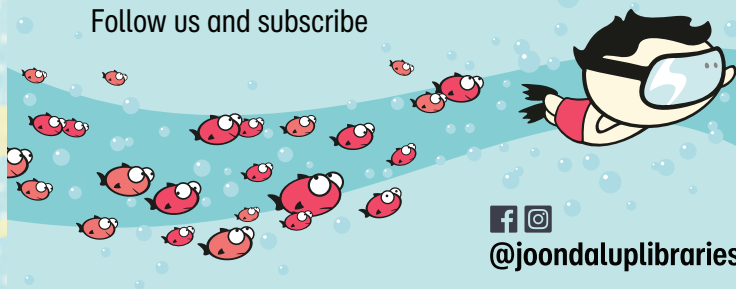

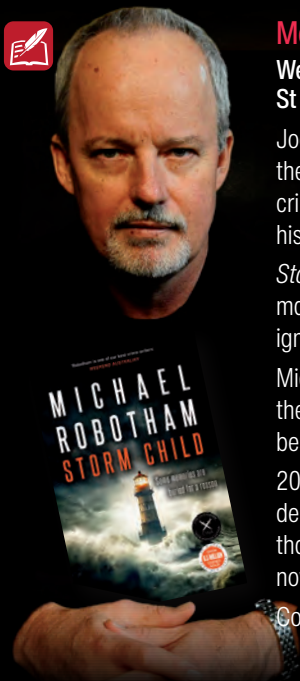
Joondalup Libraries are delighted to host the bestselling and award-winning master of crime, Michael Robotham, as he talks about his latest book *Storm Child*.
